
The testing is also a great opportunity for poll workers and members of the public to interact with the voting equipment and learn how it works. Increased knowledge and comfort with the voting equipment can help poll workers better explain the equipment to voters and troubleshoot potential issues. And it can also help voters confirm that their ballot will be counted exactly how they marked it.
