IV. October 19th

- a. Last day for electors to register by mail or by SRD for the General Election
- b. Must be postmarked by October 19th

V. October 20th

- a. Electors must register in the Clerk's office
- b. Registrations are automatically entered in the supplemental or post supplemental poll book
- c. Printing of Certificate of Registration (EL-133)
 - i. Commission recommends that EL-133 be printed from the .pdf export
- d. Printing of the ineligible (Felon) list for clerk's office registrations
- e. First day that poll books may be printed
 - i. Commission recommends waiting till October 27th before printing poll books to ensure all open registrations are entered
 - ii. Types of poll books
 1. Open registrations poll book
 2. Supplemental poll book
 3. Post supplemental poll book
 4. EDR poll book
 - i. Entering EDR's into the correct poll book.
 - iii. Renaming Ballot Styles
 - iii. Printing options for the poll book
 1. Printing a single poll book
 2. Bundling poll books
 3. Scheduling poll books

VI. Data Quality

- a. Email communication to clerks concerning data quality
 - i. To be sent out this week
 - ii. Addressed to those municipalities with 10 combined Registration List Alerts
 1. Felons
 2. Duplicate records
 3. Deceased
 - iii. Addressed to those municipalities with 5 or more addressing issues
 1. Voters with no district combo

2. Geocode exceptions
3. Addresses with no district combo
4. Geocode warnings

VII. Provisional Ballots

- a. Provisional ballots are issued to voters who fail to produce any one of the following:
 1. A Driver License or state ID number if they have one and are registering on Election Day
 2. Unable to provide an acceptable form of photo ID
 3. Are one of the few remaining voters who have yet to provide an acceptable form of proof of residence.
- b. Procedure for entering a provisional ballot in WisVote

VIII. Presidential Only Ballots

- a. Eligibility requirements and forms for a Presidential Only ballot
 1. Former Wisconsin Resident
 - i. Cannot meet the eligibility requirements for the new state of residence
 - ii. Complete the EL-140 form
 2. New Wisconsin Resident
 - i. Cannot meet the 10 day residency requirement
 - ii. Must provide POR and POI
 - iii. May not register to vote
 - iv. Complete EL-141 and EL-139 forms
 - v. Elector may also vote at the polling place or
