\*These dates are statutory. The G.A.B. is aware of the conflict between the deadline for certification of candidates and the deadline for absentee ballots to be made available. The G.A.B. will strive to certify candidates as early as possible in order to meet statutory requirements.

\*\* The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the office of the municipal clerk is July 4, 2011. Since most, if not all offices are closed on this day, absentee voting in the clerk's office will begin on July 5, 2011.
