Free ID & Identification Card Petition Process (IDPP)








Getting a free ID for voting is easy

- 1) Visit your local DMV office. We'll help. To find a DMV, call us 800-254-0668.
- 2) Bring the following, if available:
 - Proof of name and date of birth (such as a Birth Certificate)
 - Proof of identity (Social Security Card, Medicaid/Medicare card, etc.)
 - Wisconsin residency (Utility Bill, Government Mail, Lease, etc.)
 - Proof of U.S. citizenship (U.S. Birth Certificate or Citizenship paperwork)
 - Social Security Number
- 3) If you don't have all or any of these... you can still get an ID for voting. Just bring what you have to the DMV, fill out two forms, and you will get a photo ID document in the mail that you can use in time for voting.

Ballot Types for the November Election

- ▶ **Official Ballot**
 - Regular Voters
 - Temporarily Overseas Voters
 - Military Voters
- ▶ **Federal Ballot**
 - Permanently Overseas Voters
- ▶ **Presidential-Only Ballot**
 - Former Wisconsin Residents
 - New Wisconsin Residents

Ballots

- ▶ Spoiling/Remaking
- ▶ Provisional
- ▶ Absentee Ballot Tracking



Contingency Planning

- ▶ Systems Security
- ▶ Voting Equipment Security
- ▶ Election Night Reporting
- ▶ Emergency Situations



Election Day Issues

- ▶ Photography
- ▶ Electioneering

Election Night Returns

- ▶ Municipal clerks are required to make the returns from the polling places in their municipality public on Election Night.
- ▶ Municipal clerks are also required to forward the returns from each ward or reporting unit to the county clerk within two hours of tabulation.
- ▶ County clerks are required to post these returns to their website within two hours of receipt.

Remember!

- ▶ **5 p.m. October 19:** Open voter registration closes, voters left with two options to register in clerk's office or at the polling place on Election Day.
- ▶ **5 p.m. November 4:** Clerks must be available until 5 p.m. the Friday before the election for the in-person registration deadline.
- ▶ No voter registration the Saturday, Sunday or Monday before the election.
- ▶ No absentee voting the Monday before the election.

Remember! 

- ▶ All ballots must be at the polling place by 8 p.m. Election Day.
- ▶ Presidential registered write-in candidates. Supply each polling place with a list of registered write-in candidates. List is available to voters when asked, but not posted.
- ▶ No straight party ticket selection.
