- The poll books showed a discrepancy of two voters: the county's set of poll books totaled 673 voters, while the municipality's set of poll books showed 675 voters. The Ward 6 poll books for the county were missing two voters who appeared, with their voter number, in the municipality's Ward 6 poll book .
- The city's ballots for Wards 7 and 8, located in Rock County, had been sealed in one ballot bag along with the Green County ballots on election night. After the tamper evident seal was verified and removed, the Board sorted out the 12 ballots for Wards 7 and 8, resealed them in a new ballot bag, using seal serial number Z331162, and signed the ballot bag. The Rock County ballot bag will be delivered to the Rock County Clerk by the Brodhead City Clerk for her recount of the 12 Brodhead Rock County votes, along with tabulation equipment for their recount.

- 39 absentee ballots equaled the number of absentee ballots returned, however, one envelope from Ward 4 was not signed by the voter. An absentee ballot from Ward 4 will be removed from the absentee ballot stack later after ballots are counted.
- 677 ballots were counted, with 675 voters recorded.
- 1 absentee ballot from Ward 4 was not signed by the municipal clerk or the deputy clerk. That ballot, along with the unsigned absentee envelope noted above, were removed from the stack by the Board and not counted due to the two errors noted. See Exhibits 1a and 1b, attached. The removal reduced Kloppenburg by 1 vote in Ward 4. The total number of ballots were reduced by 1 from a total of 677 to 676 ballots. No objections were made.
- 2 regular, election day ballots were not signed by poll workers. Due to the overcount of ballots compared to voters, one of these ballots was removed by the Board and not counted as a drawdown, see Exhibit 2. The ballot was from Ward 4, and the removal reduced Kloppenburg by 1 vote. The total number of ballots were reduced by an additional ballot from a total of 676 to 675 ballots, equal to the number of voters. No objections were made.

- It was noted that voter number 261 in Ward 10 was not listed on the county's copy of the poll book.
- The attached "Recount Checklist" was followed, and notations appear on this page under "Notes." If no notes specific to an item on the check list appear, then there were no irregularities for that item.
- 2864 ballots were hand counted, then after tabulated by the optical scan equipment, the ballots totaled 2867, with 2868 voters recorded.
- 1 absentee ballot envelope had been rejected due to no voter signature, and the Board affirmed that decision.
- 3 ballots were damaged and remade, in with the regular ballots in the ballot bags.
- 3 ballots were noted that did not have initials of poll workers or the clerk. They were in the bag, mixed in along with the rest of the ballots, and the total ballot/voter numbers match up, so the Board allowed the ballots.

- One ballot was rejected by the optical scan unit as having no vote for any of the candidates. Upon closer inspection of the ballot, the Board determined that the voter’s mark for Prosser was made as an “X” on Prosser’s name instead of a mark in the oval, and that it was the voter’s intent to cast a vote for Prosser. The mark was made in the proper oval by the Board and then counted by the machine. No objections were made.
- No ballots were marked “rejected,” “defective,” or “objected to.”
- There were no provisional or late arriving military ballots.
- Results from election were changed, with one additional vote for Prosser.
