Total 177 ballots tabulated and the machine counter was 179. Two ballots are not accounted for and Shelley will contact the GAB as to what they should do. There was a DRE ballot that appeared as though it jammed. Shelley noted that there was a jam.

Bennett Miller from Prosser campaign – objects to final tally of this municipality as when ballots were cut they may have been lost or missing.

The Town of Angelo was set aside until Shelley could contact the GAB.

Ballots were put into ballot bag and 7363880 will be the new seal on the ballot bag for the Town of Angelo.

Shelley explained that Military Ballots that were late arriving were not accepted as this was not a federal race. The military ballots had to be back by election-day. Bennett Miller, representing candidate Prosser, stated that it will be their position to count all ballots regardless of when they were received.

Notes on Poll Book: There was one discrepancy on the Poll Book. There were 190 voters on the poll book and 188 voters. There was a Williams couple that came into vote and another Williams couple was marked in the poll book. The poll book had the number 36 and 37 issued to two different couples with the last name Williams. Shelley spoke with the clerk and she stated that one of the Williams couples did not vote and the poll book workers did not cross out the Williams couple that did not vote.

There was 1 absentee ballot requested and 1 absentee ballot returned. The absentee ballot application was reviewed. Shelley noted that the absentee ballot is not to be discarded if there is not an application, and the canvassers are checking to be sure the absentee process is followed by the clerks. The absentee envelope was viewed and contained signatures.

The tamper evident seals are initialed on the inspector's statement and it was verified by the board. The ballot bag was viewed and the seals are 7363979 and 7363980. Both seals are intact. Seal 7363980 was removed and the ballots removed from the bag.

Shelley explained that the DRE ballots could be read and tallied by the board and then the roll could be cut apart randomly to preserve the identity of the voter. The board agreed to try it that way for this municipality.

The absentee ballot was separated from the paper ballots, there was one absentee ballot. The paper ballots were then tallied by candidate.
