Identify any exhibits by description and number.)	<p>The BOC verified the seal on the ballot bag (D262793) and cut the seal in order to access the ballots. The seal number was not entered on the Inspector's Statement. The Town of Kaukauna, Wards 1 & 2, used Insight ballots and touchscreen voting. The tabulators randomly chose three pages from the poll books to compare, and the pages compared without any discrepancies. The tabulators examined the Insight machine and put the cartridge in. When reconciling the poll book, the last voter number listed is 402; however, the tabulators counted 407 voters. Duplicate voter numbers 233, 240, 302, 389, 390, and 394 were listed. Voter number 241 was missing, which reconciled 407 voters. Jessica Vanevenhoven was on the supplemental list and not marked as an absentee voter in either book. Peter VanWychen was only marked in the Town copy as an absentee voter. When tabulating the touchscreen ballots, all the ballots were marked as pre-lat ballots. The touchscreen ballots were counted two times. The final total showed one less vote for Prosser; however, one of the two tabulators was confident that they forgot to mark a hashmark for Prosser, and the Kloppenburg representative saw this happen. Both candidate representatives agreed to not recount the ballots again, but instead add one vote back to Prosser; the BOC agreed with this decision. The BOC took a 30-minute dinner break at 5:10 p.m. The tabulators put the cartridge into the voting machine, but could not find the test ballots. The tabulators attempted to use the sample ballots that were given to the County Clerk's office, however, the ballots did not work because the ballots had to be reprinted prior to the election, and the County Clerk's Office did not receive the new (official) ballots. The BOC contacted Mike Haas, GAB, for his opinion and he stated that test ballots were needed, and if they could not be located, new test ballots would be made by the printer. The BOC agreed to put this municipality on hold and move to the next municipality. The tabulators cleared the machine. The BOC resealed the ballot bag with security seal number 0349439. On Tuesday, May 3, 2011, the Town of Kaukauna dropped off the remaining information that was found at the Town Hall. On Wednesday, May 4, 2011, the BOC went through the information and discovered that the test ballots were not included; however, extra black ballots were included. County Clerk Lori O'Bright and Nancy Christensen made a test pack from the extra ballots. This was witnessed by both candidate representatives. The ballots were fed into the Insight machine on Thursday, May 4, 2011, and reconciled without any discrepancies. The BOC sealed up the ballot box with a security seal 0349453.</p>

The BOC reconvened on Tuesday, May 3, 2011, at 8:00 a.m. The BOC verified the seal on the ballot boxes (058317 and 058318) and cut the seals in order to access the ballots. The City of Appleton, Ward 1, used M100 ballots and Automark Voting; however, the Automark machine did not have any voters. The tabulators randomly chose three pages from the poll books to compare, and the pages compared without any discrepancies. The tabulators examined the M100 machine and put the cartridge in. The tabulators processed 5 test ballots, and the results verified without any discrepancies. When tabulating the poll book, voter #124, Valerie Seitz, was listed in the poll book and on the supplemental list in the County's copy; she only had a number listed next to her name in the City's copy on the supplemental. Voter #439, Christopher Foldeak, was listed in the poll book and supplemental list in the City's copy; he only had a number listed next to his name in the County's copy on the supplemental. Voter #266, Clarence King, Page 53, did not have a voter number next to his name in the County's copy of the poll book. The poll books reconcile and the ballots reconcile. The BOC resealed the ballot box with security seal number RC015.

The City of Appleton, Ward 3, used M100 ballots and Automark Voting; however, the Automark machine did not have any voters. The tabulators randomly chose three pages from the poll books to compare, and the pages compared without any discrepancies. The tabulators examined the M100 machine and put the cartridge in. The tabulators processed 5 test ballots, and the results verified without any discrepancies. The BOC was presented with a remade ballot, #1, which was approved. When reconciling the poll books, the tabulators found that in the County's copy, the total voters was 764, and the tabulators counted 764; however, on the City's copy, the total voters of 764 was crossed off and changed to 765, and the tabulators counted 765. The County's book did not have Absentee Voter Susan Rabideau, Page 109, marked as voter number A392; the tabulators corrected the poll book. The tabulators also found that in the County's copy, voter #528, Page 9, Emily Blair, was listed on the supplemental and not in the poll book; the tabulators added #528 to Ms. Blair's name in the poll book. The tabulators also found that in the City's copy, Page 22, voter #371, Diantha Corbett was listed as an absentee voter, but then the wording was changed to "voted at polls." The tabulators also found that in both books, there were four voters on the supplemental list that were not marked as absentee voters; this change was made. The BOC resealed the ballot box with security seal number RC017. When putting all the information away, more ballots were discovered, and therefore, the BOC opened ballot box with security seal RC017, added the extra ballots and resealed it with security seal number RC019.</p>

The tabulators randomly chose three pages from the poll books to compare, and the pages compared without any discrepancies. The tabulators examined the M100 machine and put the cartridge in. The tabulators processed 5 test ballots, and the results verified without any discrepancies. The tabulators counted 485 voters in the poll book; however, 484 voters were listed as voting on Page 1. Ward 7's poll book lists 653 voters; however, 652 voters were counted, which explains the difference. When feeding the ballots through the M100 machine, there was a Ward 7 ballot found in the Ward 6 stack. When feeding the ballots through, there was one ballot that had originally filled in the oval for Prosser, erased it, and filled in the oval for Kloppenburg. The candidate representatives and BOC all agreed to feed this ballot through the machine; the machine accepted the ballot. The BOC took a 30-minute lunch break. The numbers reconcile with the original canvass. The BOC resealed the ballot box with security seal number RC018.

The tabulators randomly chose three pages from the poll books to compare, and the pages compared without any discrepancies. The tabulators examined the M100 machine and put the cartridge in. The tabulators processed 5 test ballots, and the results verified without any discrepancies. When feeding the ballots through the M100 machine, there was a Ward 7 ballot found in the Ward 6 stack. A ward 7 voter was given a ward 6 ballot. The tabulators counted 652 voters in the poll book; however, 653 voters were listed as voting on Page 1. Ward 6's poll book lists 484 voters; however, 485 voters were counted, which explains the difference. When reconciling the ballots, the machine counted 572 ballots and 81 ballots were hand counted, which equals 653. When entering all the voter numbers from the County's copy of the poll book into an excel spreadsheet, four duplicate numbers were found and two numbers were missing, with 651 total numbers entered. After again comparing the County's and City's copy of the poll books, voter #269 was missing from both poll books, which the BOC accepted as a voter in the book not given credit for their vote, and therefore, the ballots are over by 1. The BOC resealed the ballot box with security seal number RC018.

The City of Appleton, Ward 11, used M100 ballots and Automark Voting, however; the Automark machine did not have any voters. The tabulators randomly chose three pages from the poll books to compare, and the pages compared without any discrepancies. The tabulators examined the M100 machine and put the cartridge in. When the cartridge was put in, the machine registered as having 484 votes on it, which were votes from Calumet County. The Calumet County Clerk submitted a certified letter stating that there were 484 votes counted on this disc on May 2, 2011. Three absentee envelopes were not signed by the voter (Exhibits 14 and 15), and only one signature was witnessed. One of the envelopes had two numbers on it (Exhibit 13), and therefore, the BOC decided to draw down four ballots. One of the absentee ballots were blank (Exhibit 12); the BOC drew down three ballots and took 1 vote away from Prosser (Exhibit 11) and 2 votes away from Kloppenburg (Exhibits 9 and 10). The BOC resealed the ballot bag with seal number 0349425. The BOC recessed for dinner at 4:45 p.m. The BOC reconvened on Saturday, April 30, 2011, at 8:00 a.m. After the BOC adjourned on Friday, April 29, 2011, County Clerk Lori O'Bright sent an e-mail to Mike Haas, GAB, explaining the draw down procedure that the BOC used with the absentee ballots. O'Bright called Mike Haas, GAB, in order for Mr. Haas to explain the draw down procedure to the BOC. In his explanation, Mr. Haas stated that when drawing down absentee ballots, blank ballots should not be taken out first. Mr. Haas recommended that the BOC re-draw down absentee ballots, including all the absentee ballots (even those that were previously drawn down) and add another exhibit number to each ballot. The BOC was in the middle of reconciling the City of Kaukauna, and therefore, agreed to re-draw down ballots after the City of Kaukauna was reconciled. The BOC cut seal number 0349425 in order to access the ballots again for the drawn down. The BOC drew down four ballots and one vote was taken away from Prosser (formerly Exhibit 11 and now Exhibit 21); two votes were taken away from Kloppenburg (formerly Exhibit. 9 and now Exhibits 20 and 23); one blank ballot (formerly Exhibit 12 and now Exhibit 22) was pulled also. The BOC resealed the ballot bag with seal number 0349420. The BOC adjourned for the evening at 4:45 p.m.</p>

Good Morning,

It is now 9 a.m. The Outagamie County Board of Canvassers are officially opening the Outagamie County statewide recount of the Office of Wisconsin Supreme Court Justice for the April 5, 2011 Spring Election.

Introductions:

The procedures and rules directed for this recount are specified in Wisconsin Statutes and the Supreme Court Recount Plan (latest amendment received 4/26/2011).

County Clerk O'Bright administered an official Oath of Office to the Board of Canvassers and any tabulators who had not previously signed an Oath of Office.

Background

On Monday, April 25, 2011, the Government Accountability Board (GAB) conducted a teleconference. Attending from Outagamie County were Outagamie County's Board of Canvass, Deputy Clerk Sara Hickey, and Corporation Counsel Joe Guidote.

According to the GAB, there have been two statewide recounts in Wisconsin history. One was conducted in 1989 of a constitution amendment. In 1858, a statewide was held for a

Litigation of the process: Tabulating memory packs, stipulation agreed that Optech Eagle ballots will be hand counted. The method during election utilized in tabulating the ballots will be utilized in the recount with the exception of the Optech Eagle ballots, which will be hand counted.

Timing of recount: Recount order was issued April 25 and requires the Board of Canvassers be convened by 9 a.m. and must be completed 13 days from the recount. Because the completion falls on a Sunday, the recount must be completed by Monday, May 9, 2011.

Transparency of this process: This meeting was posted by the 24 hour requirement for posting. Any time changes will be posted as required.

Rules for Observers (posted on doors):

- **Areas** – To the west of the sign – general observers. To the east of the sign, BOC, Corporation Counsel, tabulators, candidates, designated representatives, candidate assistants
- **Observers:** Preference to the candidates, their designated representatives, or candidate assistants
- **Orderly conduct** – The Board of Canvassers may:
 - o Issues warning for conduct that threatens the process
 - o Remove observer who do not comply with the warning
 - o Limit the number of observers
- Sign in when entering the room and sign out. Please print your name on the sheet.
- Name tags are required for Board of Canvassers, candidates representatives, assistants, and media
- Silence or put on vibrate your cell phones.
- Not allowed in the room are: PURSES, BRIEFCASES, COATS, PENCILS OR PENCILS WITH BLACK OR BLUE INK
- Board of Canvassers and tabulators are the only people authorized to touch ballots and elections materials in ANY way
- Drinks are allowed but shall NOT be on tables or in vicinity of any election or recount materials. Food items are allowed, but must not be noisy, properly disposed, and not go beyond boundary line marked on the recount room line.

Recount process:

The Board of Canvassers have designated that one reporting unit at a time will be processed to keep the process orderly.

We will begin with Outagamie County's township and proceed as listed on the Board.

Designated representative for each candidate: Need to know & assistants. Designated reps. should be the only individuals to raise objections or concerns.

Simultaneous review will occur as follows (10 steps):

Table to the North: Tabulators will be reviewing two sets of poll lists (specific procedure by Statewide plan)

Board of Canvass will review absentee ballots, rejected, objected, defective ballots & ballots challenged by the candidate representative

Middle Table: Hand counting of ballots will be done on all Optech Eagle ballots (13,600 ballots)

Once the recount is complete, information regarding changes from the County's official count will be noted via an email to the GAB and posted on Outagamie County's website.
