My daughter, Kaitlyn Kastenson, applied online for absentee ballots for the current election year (2024). She was a student living away from home, and submitted her campus address. Upon returning home for the summer, she contacted the Village Clerk's office to have her absentee ballot for the August election sent to our home address. Upon returning to school in the fall, she had a new living arrangement, but did not change her address with the clerk. The clerk mailed her absentee ballot to her previous campus address, and the ballot was returned to the clerk as undeliverable as my daughter had moved. The clerk's office then put a sticker that read "FORWARD" over her campus address, blacked out the bar code on the envelope and wrote in our home address on the envelope, then forwarded the ballot to our home address. She is not currently residing at the home address as she is still in school and at a new address. I contacted the Wisconsin Election Commission (WEC) to find out if the laws have changed regarding forwarding election materials in Wisconsin. The answer I received back from WEC was that "it is illegal to forward election materials in Wisconsin." She happened to be home for the weekend when the ballot arrived last Friday. She opened the envelope before I got home. I told her that it is illegal to forward an absentee ballot, and that she should not vote that ballot. She has not voted in this election yet.

6.86(1)(ar)Except as authorized in s. 6.875 (6), the municipal clerk shall not issue an absentee ballot unless the clerk receives a written application therefor from a qualified elector of the municipality. The clerk shall retain each absentee ballot application until destruction is authorized under s. 7.23 (1). Except as authorized in s. 6.79 (6) and (7), if a qualified elector applies for an absentee ballot in person at the clerk's office, the clerk shall not issue the elector an absentee ballot unless the elector presents proof of identification. The clerk shall verify that the name on the proof of identification presented by the elector conforms to the name on the elector's application and shall verify that any photograph appearing on that document reasonably resembles the elector. The clerk shall then enter his or her initials on the certificate envelope indicating that the absentee elector presented proof of identification to the clerk.
