RESPONSE OF RESPONDENT CHERIE BARNIER

Respondent Cherie Barnier, in her capacity as Town Clerk of the Town of Easton, Adams County, by and through the Town of Easton Town Attorney Nicholas Flanagan, hereby submits the following response to the Complaint filed by Jodi Schappe with the Wisconsin Elections Commission.

INTRODUCTION

Wis. Stat. § 9.10 sets forth a procedure by which electors can petition for the recall of municipal elected officials. On June 20, 2024, a Recall Petition against Town of Easton Supervisor I Jodi Schappe was filed with my office by Petitioner Jason W. Hammond c/o Town of Easton Recall Committee. When a recall petition is filed, Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2) sets forth certain rules for the filing officer in carrying out their official duties in determining the validity of petition format and signatures, and Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4) sets forth the process that the official may use to challenge the petition's sufficiency. As I have consistently done throughout the

process, my office conducted a fair, careful and thorough review and processing of the documents received, in accordance with applicable statutory requirements and supplemented with guidance from the Wisconsin Elections Commission. This included a review and determination of Complainant's challenge to the sufficiency of the recall petition, which- using the aforementioned statutory requirements and Elections Commission guidance, found no basis provided by the challenger/complainant sufficient to disqualify any signatures.

PERTINENT BACKGROUND FACTS

On June 20, 2024, a Recall Petition against Town of Easton Supervisor I Jodi Schappe was filed with my office by Petitioner Jason W. Hammond c/o Town of Easton Recall Committee. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code EL Ch. 2, Officeholders are allowed to file recall petition sufficiency challenges with the appropriate filing officer. On June 30, 2024, a challenge was delivered and filed by Challenger Jodi Schappe with my office, as Town of Easton Clerk, and the appropriate filing officer. The document was made in the form of a written, sworn complaint and timely filed pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code EL Ch. 2. The Petitioner delivered a rebuttal within 5 days after the challenge was filed. The Challenger delivered a reply within 2 days after the rebuttal was filed.

Upon receiving the reply, my office performed a timely review of the challenge, rebuttal and reply, and made a determination of sufficiency pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a). On July 16, 2024, my office provided Challenger and Petitioner with a Response and Determination to the Formal Challenge of Sufficiency of Recall Petition, "Exhibit 1". On the same date, after performing a careful review of the petition as the filing officer, I provided a Certificate of Insufficiency, stating my findings in a certificate attached to the petition, and stating the specific

items creating the insufficiency “Exhibit 2”. The Petitioner delivered an amendment to the petition on July 17, 2024, being within 5 days following the attachment of the original Certificate of Insufficiency, accompanied by affidavits and other proof correcting certain insufficiencies pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a). After receipt of the amended petition offered for filing with my office, I again carefully examined the face of the petition to determine its sufficiency. Upon determining the petition was sufficient, I immediately attached an Amended Certificate of Sufficiency, “Exhibit 3”, filed the petition and provided it to the Town of Easton Board of Supervisors, informing them of the statutory requirement to promptly call a recall election. The aforementioned attachment, filing, and informing of the governing body occurred on July 17, 2024, being within the 2 days after the amended petition is offered for filing, and in conformance with Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a).

STANDARD OF REVIEW

Under Wis. Stat. § 5.06(1), after a certificate of sufficiency/insufficiency has been issued by the filing officer, any elector of the jurisdiction dissatisfied with the determination (including the incumbent officeholder) may file a written sworn complaint with the Wisconsin Elections Commission. Under Wis. Stat. §§ 5.05(1)(e) and 5.06(6), the Commission is provided with the inherent, general, and specific authority to consider the submissions of the parties to a complaint and to issue findings. The Commission’s role in resolving verified complaints filed under Wis. Stat. § 5.06, which challenge the decisions or actions of local election officials, is to determine whether local officials acted contrary to applicable election laws or abused their discretion in administering applicable election laws.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 5.06(1), complaints “...shall set forth such facts as are within the knowledge of the Complainant to show probable cause to believe that a violation of law or abuse of discretion has occurred or will occur.” Probable cause is defined in Wis. Admin. Code § EL 20.02(4) to mean “the facts and reasonable inferences that together are sufficient to justify a reasonable, prudent person, acting with caution, to believe that the matter asserted is probably true.”

ARGUMENT

The Commission should dismiss the Complaint filed by Jodi Schappe because, as filing officer, and Town of Easton Clerk, I followed all applicable election laws related to recalling a local elected official provided in Wis. Stat. § 9.10 and Wis. Admin. Code EL Ch. 2, throughout the process- from review of the campaign registration statement and statement of intent to circulate a recall petition, timely reviewing the petition and challenge to the recall petition, and through the issuance of certificate of sufficiency. Complainant Schappe’s complaint is notably lacking in any supporting evidence to back her assertion, and her arguments in an effort to prevent the Town of Easton Clerk as filing officer, from reviewing the petition to ensure consistency and accuracy with the requirements of Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code EL §§ 2.05 and 2.09 with regard to the treatment and sufficiency of petitions goes against Wisconsin Election Commission guidance for processing and reviewing recall petitions. Further, Complainant Schappe’s assertions are internally inconsistent with her allegation of abuse of discretion. In fact, Complainant attempts to argue that the filing officer should have exercised *more* discretion in making a determination on the presumed validity of the information on the petition. Schappe’s argument would attempt to remove the electors lawful

right to petition for the recall of municipal elected officials and place undue discretion with the filing officer. As a matter of law, Schappe fails to meet any standard to show probable cause that the Town Clerk abused discretion in performing the statutory duties as filing officer according to election laws.

I. Review of Petition by Filing Officer: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a)

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a), within 31 days after the petition is offered for filing, the filing officer is required to determine the sufficiency of the petition. A careful review of the petition includes a determination of petition format requirements pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2), and individual signature requirements, which are reviewed according to the criteria of Wis. Stat. §§ 9.10, 8.40 and Wis. Admin. Code EL § 2.09, which incorporates by reference the requirements of Wis. Admin. Code EL § 2.05. Citing further guidance from the Wisconsin Elections Commission document “Recall of Local Elected Officials” – August 2020 Page 5, “The filing officer is not required to consult extrinsic resources in reviewing the petitions, but may do so if time permits.” In this case, upon receiving the petition, my review as filing officer consisted of verifying the petition format and information requirements under Wis. Stat. §§ 8.40, 9.10 were met, and reviewing individual signature requirements to ensure each signature was a qualified elector, addresses listed by each signature is within the appropriate district, and the date of signature was within the appropriate circulation period. Finally, my review included a verification that the circulator had properly completed the Certification of Circulator in accordance with the requirements of Wis. Stat. §§ 8.40(2), 9.10(2)(a). In verifying signers’ status as a qualified elector and address listed, I did so by use of extrinsic sources such as checking if that person was a registered voter through WisVote, and verifying address both

through WisVote and through Adams County Land Records. Such a verification ensured that my office carried out the statutory requirement and plain meaning of a “careful examination” to determine petition sufficiency as required in Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a).

The process to ensure sufficiency of the petition was followed according to the statutory requirements of my office in accordance with election laws. Complainant Schappe’s complaint is notably lacking in any supporting evidence to back her assertion that it wasn’t, and her arguments in an effort to prevent the Town of Easton Clerk as filing officer, from reviewing the petition to ensure consistency and accuracy with the requirements of Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code EL §§ 2.05 and 2.09 with regard to the treatment and sufficiency of petitions goes against Wisconsin Election Commission guidance for processing and reviewing recall petitions. The Complainant’s statement about her “communications with signatories” leading to her “understanding that the petitions contain invalid signatures” is without even a shred of supporting evidence- even a single affidavit from one of the 125 signatures found by my office to be valid. Without sufficient evidence, the Complainant’s bare assertion of some sort of communication with signers which should therefore support invalidating signatures is not sufficient to sustain the Complainant’s burden of proof to show that any violation of law or abuse of discretion has or will occur.

II. Response and Determination to Challenged Reason for Recall: Wis. Admin. Code EL Ch. 2.05(4)

Pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code El Ch. 2.05(4), the information on a recall petition is entitled to a presumption of validity. During a sufficiency review of a recall petition, the filing officer has no authority to determine the truth or falsity of any of the reasons for the recall set forth in the petition. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2) sets forth certain rules for determining whether

signatures may be counted as valid. Those rules, in addition to those promulgated by the commission under Wis. Stat. § 8.07, enumerated in Wis. Admin. Code El Ch. 2.05(4)(17) guides the determination of validity of signatures. In a Challenge of the Sufficiency of the Recall Petition, the burden is on the challenger to establish, by clear and convincing evidence, any insufficiency in the recall petition, and any challenge to the validity of signatures on a recall petition must demonstrate by affidavits or other supporting evidence a failure to comply with statutory requirements. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code Ch. EL 2. If the challenger meets this burden, the burden then shifts to the petitioner to establish that the Recall Petition or any challenged signatures are sufficient. As Exhibit 1 shows, the only evidence supplied by the Challenger as it related to her challenge under Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2)(b) was the Statement of Intent to Circulate Recall Petition. There was no affidavit or any other supporting evidence provided by Challenger demonstrating any individual signing the Recall Petition did so under a misrepresentation. Without sufficient evidence, the Challenger's bare assertion of any signers' misrepresentation is not sufficient to sustain the challenger's burden of proof. Therefore, it was determined that the Challenger had not provided sufficient proof of misrepresentation and no signature would be disqualified under the pertinent Challenged items.

Now, Complainant attempts to argue that the filing officer should have exercised *more* discretion in making a determination on the presumed validity of the information on the petition. Schappe's argument would attempt to remove the electors lawful right to petition for the recall of municipal elected officials and place undue discretion with the filing officer. As a matter of law, Schappe fails to meet any standard to show probable cause that the Town Clerk

abused discretion in performing statutory duties as filing officer according to election laws when reviewing the recall petition to determine sufficiency.

III. Standards to Form of Challenge, Rebuttals and Replies: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a)

The statutory provisions for recalling local elected officials are provided in Wis. Stat. § 9.10 and Wis. Admin. Code EL Ch. 2. Under Wis. Admin. Code EL 2.11, the standards established in EL 2.07 for determining challenges to the sufficiency of nomination papers apply equally to determining challenges to the sufficiency of petitions required to comply with Wis. Stat. § 8.40, which includes recall petitions. Further, EL 2.11(2) states that any challenge to the sufficiency of a petition required to comply with Wis. Stat. § 8.40 shall be made by a verified complaint filed with the appropriate filing officer, and the form and legal sufficiency shall comply with the requirements of Wis. Admin. EL Ch. 20. Wis. Stat EL Ch. 20 requires a sworn written complaint. The standards regarding what a sworn complaint includes is found in EL Ch. 20, and requires a notary. Therefore, there was no abuse of discretion from the office of Town Clerk in requiring that any challenge made be in the form of a written, sworn complaint and filed with the filing officer who received the recall petition.

Complainant attempts to assert that there was an abuse of discretion in not requiring the rebuttal or reply to be similarly sworn and notarized. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) states “[i]f a challenge is filed, the petitioner may file a written rebuttal to the challenge with the clerk or board of election commissioners within 5 days after the challenge is filed. If a rebuttal is filed, the officer against whom the petition is filed may file a reply to any new matter raised in the rebuttal within 2 days after the rebuttal is filed.” Therefore, the only requirement for rebuttals and replies under Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) is in their timely filing in writing. Complainant was

never required by my office to file a reply as a notarized document. It was her choice to do so. Notably, Complainant fails to provide any fact to support her incorrect assertion that there was any requirement otherwise. It should also be noted that- as Exhibit 1 demonstrates- the Challenger similarly failed to provide any evidence sufficient to sustain the challenger's burden of proof to support any of her claims, regardless of the rebuttal or reply (*some of the unsupported claims which are also used in the Complaint here before the Wisconsin Elections Commission*).

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, Respondent Cherie Barnier respectfully requests that the Commission dismiss the Complaint on its merits, with prejudice.



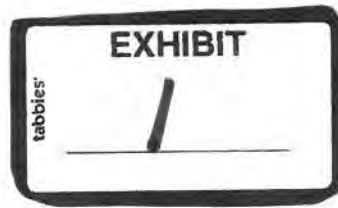

Response and Determination:

To Formal Challenge of Sufficiency of Recall Petition For Jodi Schappe, Town of Easton Supervisor 1

On June 20, 2024, a Recall Petition against Town of Easton Supervisor 1 Jodi Schappe was filed with my office by Petitioner Jason W. Hammond c/o Town of Easton Recall Committee. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code EL Ch. 2, Officeholders are allowed to file recall petition sufficiency challenges with the appropriate filing officer. On June 30, 2024, the challenge, "Exhibit A", was delivered and filed by Challenger Jodi Schappe with my office, as Town of Easton Clerk, and the appropriate filing officer. The document was made in the form of a written, sworn complaint and timely filed pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code EL Ch. 2. The challenge was delivered to the Petitioner the same day as received. The Petitioner delivered a rebuttal, "Exhibit B", within the 5 days after the challenge was filed. The Challenger delivered a reply, "Exhibit C", within the 2 days after the rebuttal was filed.

As filing officer, I have examined any evidence offered by the Parties when reviewing the challenge to sufficiency of the Recall Petition.

The information on a recall petition is presumed to be valid unless proven otherwise. Wis. Admin. Code EL Ch. 2.05(4). The burden is on the challenger to establish, by clear and convincing evidence, any insufficiency in the recall petition, and any challenge to the validity of signatures on a recall petition must demonstrate by affidavits or other supporting evidence a failure to comply with statutory requirements. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code Ch. EL 2. If the challenger meets this burden, the burden then shifts to the petitioner to establish that the Recall Petition or any challenged signatures are sufficient.

Below is the filing officer's determination of each item in the challenge.

Complaint Items 1 and 2.

Challenger requests that the Recall Petition be found insufficient due to an alleged failure to include all necessary information in the Statement of Reason for Recall. Specifically, Challenger points to the wording of "beyond the scope and authority of the elected position" in the Statement of Reason for Recall as being untrue. Challenger further requests all signatures on the Petition not be counted, stating the purpose for the recall was misrepresented by the circulator due to alleged vague and ambiguous terminology provided in the Statement of Reason for Recall, and requesting striking signatures under Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2)(m). As supporting evidence to Challenger's request, Challenger provided a copy of the Statement of Intent to Circulate Recall Petition.

Determination of Items 1 and 2: Pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code El Ch. 2.05(4), the information on a recall petition is entitled to a presumption of validity. During a sufficiency review of a recall petition, the filing officer has no authority to determine the truth or falsity of any of the reasons for the recall set forth in the petition. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2) sets forth certain rules for determining whether signatures may be counted as valid. Those rules, in addition to those promulgated by the commission under Wis. Stat. § 8.07, enumerated in Wis. Admin. Code El Ch. 2.05(4)(17) guides the determination of validity of signatures. The only evidence supplied by the Challenger is the Statement of Intent to Circulate Recall Petition. There is no affidavit or supporting evidence provided by Challenger demonstrating any individual signing the Recall Petition did so under a misrepresentation. Without sufficient evidence, the Challenger's bare assertion of any signers' misrepresentation is not sufficient to sustain the challenger's burden of proof. Therefore, the Challenger has not provided sufficient proof of misrepresentation and no signature will be disqualified under Complaint items 1 or 2.

Complaint Items 3, 4, and 5.

Challenger requests that the Recall Petition be found insufficient due to an alleged misrepresentation by the circulator. As supporting evidence to Challenger's request, Challenger provided a copy of an undated social media post by Jason Hammond to the Adams County, Wisconsin: Announcements, events and information Facebook page (the "Post"). Challenger references various statements made in paragraphs 2, 3, and 4 of the Post that Challenger contends are not in accordance with the circulated reason stated on the Recall Petition. Further, Challenger states that the Post is vague in its reference to specific actions and responsibilities.

Determination of Items 3, 4, and 5: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2) sets forth certain rules for determining whether signatures may be counted as valid. Those rules, in addition to those promulgated by the commission under Wis. Stat. § 8.07, enumerated in Wis. Admin. Code El Ch. 2.05(4)(17) guides the determination of validity of signatures. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2)(b) sets forth the requirement of the Recall Petition containing the statement of reason for recall. Each Recall Petition page does contain a Statement of Reason for Recall clearly printed above the signatures gathered. The evidence supplied by the Challenger under Complaint items 3, 4, and 5 is not relative to the statement on the recall petition, rather an undated social media post. Further, there is no affidavit or supporting evidence provided by Challenger demonstrating any individual signing the Recall Petition did so under a misrepresentation. Without sufficient evidence, the Challenger's bare assertion of the signers' misrepresentation is not sufficient to sustain the challenger's burden of proof. Therefore, the challenger has not provided sufficient proof of misrepresentation and no signature will be disqualified under Complaint items 3, 4 or 5.

Complaint Item 6.

Challenger requests that the Recall Petition be found insufficient due to a violation of Wis. Stat. § 9.10(1)(b) requiring a petition to recall an officer be signed by electors equal to at least 25 percent of the vote cast for the office of governor at the last election within the same district or territory as that of the officeholder being recalled. As supporting evidence to Challenger's request, Challenger provides a letter of notification that the Town Clerk of Easton emailed to Petitioner, with a typographical error in territorial reference. Challenger states that this letter references an incorrect district or territory as the officeholder being recalled.


Determination of Item 6: Under Wis. Stat. § 9.10(1), a Recall Petition must contain the signatures of qualified electors equal to at least 25% of the vote cast for the office of Governor at the last General Election held within the same district or jurisdiction as that of the officeholder. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(1)(d) sets forth the requirement that a filing officer determine and inform any interested person upon request, the number of signatures required to recall an officeholder of that district or jurisdiction. Although the Town of Easton Clerk's office never received a request from any interested person to verify the number of signatures required to recall Supervisor Schappe, the Clerk's office chose to include this information in an acknowledgment letter to the Town of Easton Recall Committee, as the Petitioner, upon receipt of the Statement of Intent to Recall. Upon learning of the typographical error, my office did subsequently verbally correct the typographical reference with the Petitioner, and confirmed that the number of signatures referenced in the letter was indeed correct for the Town of Easton, Adams County Wisconsin. In Challenger's reply to Petitioner's rebuttal to Item 6, Challenger states "imagining" that all information provided to the recipient(s) be without error to eliminate any and all confusion. The error was promptly verbally corrected to Petitioner, avoiding any confusion. A review of the Recall Petition for sufficiency will be in accordance with the format and information requirements under Wis. Stats. §§ 8.40, 9.10, and the number of signatures meeting the threshold under Wis. Stat. § 9.10(1) must be met. No signatures will be disqualified under Complaint item 6.

Complaint Item 7.

Challenger requests that the Recall Petition be found insufficient due to a violation of Wis. Stat. § 942.01(1) and (2) relating to alleged defamation. As supporting evidence to Challenger's request, Challenger provided a copy of a Post by Jason Hammond to the Adams County, Wisconsin: Announcements, events and information Facebook page. Challenger refers to the Post as a source of exposure to contempt, ridicule and degradation to Challenger while performing the duties as Town of Easton Supervisor, and further, as a source of impugned representation in the Town of Easton, learned from individuals in Adams County, some of whom were not from the [Town of] Easton community.

Determination of Item 7: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2) sets forth certain rules for determining whether signatures may be counted as valid. Those rules, in addition to those promulgated by the commission under Wis. Stat. § 8.07, enumerated in Wis. Admin. Code El Ch. 2.05(4)(17) guides the determination of validity of signatures. Allegations of defamation against a public official, whether founded upon libel or slander are more appropriately a civil matter, which Challenger is free to pursue, if they choose to do so. Alleged defamation is not grounds for invalidating a signature under Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2). Challenger has not provided any evidence sufficient to sustain the challenger's burden of proof so as to support their claim. No signatures will be disqualified.

For the aforementioned reasons, as filing officer for the Township of Easton, Adams County, Wisconsin, I find the Challenger failed to provide sufficient evidence to disqualify any signatures.

Recall Petition Challenge

The Recall Petition Challenge of Jodi Schappe, Complainant, 14th Ct. Adams, WI 53910, Town of Easton, Adams County, WI.,

against Jason W. Hammond, Respondent, 1484 Evergreen Ct. Adams, WI 53910, Town of Easton, Adams County, WI.

This Recall Petition Challenge will be duly submitted to the filing officer, Town of Easton Clerk, Cherie Barrier, 1163 County Rd A, Adams, WI 53910.

This recall petition challenge is under Wisconsin State Statute Chapter 9.10, Recall.

I, Jodi Schappe, allege that I have received the subject petition in its entirety and by way of this submitted challenge, I am questioning its validity per Wisconsin State Statute 9.10 (4)(a). Below are the reasons that I am citing for insufficiencies.

1) Ref Wis State Statute 9.10 (2)(r)(5) – *“Failure of the circulator to include all necessary information.”*

As per Mr. Hammond’s reason, or reasons, stated in his Intent to Circulate Recall Petition, he indicated, *“Calling for actions beyond the scope and authority of the elected position.”* (Please see attached, Exhibit 1)

At no time have I, Jodi Schappe, acted singly for the Town of Easton.

I, Jodi Schappe, am a member of a board of three in the Town of Easton.

In the Town of Easton, it takes a majority vote from a board of three **to do anything** in the Easton municipality.

I, Jodi Schappe, have never acted on my own without the other Town of Easton board members working in concert at a public meeting.

Talking, listening, discussing, and calling for and/or making motions ARE the responsibilities and duties of a town supervisor.

2) Ref. Wis State Statute 9.10 (2)(b) – *“A recall petition for a city, village, town, town sanitary district, or school district office shall contain a statement of a reason for the recall which is related to the official responsibilities of the official for whom removal is sought.”*

AND

Ref. Wis State Statute 9.10 (2)(m) – *“No signature may be stricken on the basis that the elector was not aware of the purpose of the petition, unless the purpose was misrepresented by the circulator.”*

The “...statement of a reason for the recall...” presented on the recall petition fails to define or disclose any reason.

In both statements, *“Calling for actions beyond the scope and authority of the elected position.”* And *“Actions detrimental to the well-being of the Town of Easton.”*, the reason for the use of the word “actions” is clearly left undefined.

As such, those persons circulating the recall petition are unhindered in their ability to misrepresent—intentionally or unintentionally—the purpose of the recall petition to potential signers in violation of Wis Stats 9.10 (2)(m).

If the petitioner had stated the actual reason for using the term “actions” rather than using a vague and ambiguous term, it would have at least afforded me the opportunity to respond to a specific complaint, but the word “actions” may be construed as literally anything and, as such, fails to fulfill the requirements of the above-referenced statute. *(Please see attached, Exhibit 1)*

3) Ref. Wis State Statute 9.10 (2)(m) – *“No signature may be stricken on the basis that the elector was not aware of the purpose of the petition, unless the purpose was misrepresented by the circulator.”*

The second paragraph of Mr. Hammond's public Facebook postings on his personal Facebook page and the Adams County, Wisconsin: Announcements, events, and information Facebook page, states that,

“If you wish to help save our community from unwanted spending, illegal actions and a lack of understanding the needs of the residents of the Town of Easton.”

This statement is not in accordance with the circulated reason stated on the recall petition. Nowhere is it stated what **specific** actions that I, Jodi Schappe, have been alleged to have done, much less **illegal** actions. This statement is a misrepresentation to the public. *(Please see attached, Exhibit 2)*

4) Ref. Wis State Statute 9.10 (2)(m) – *“No signature may be stricken on the basis that the elector was not aware of the purpose of the petition, unless the purpose was misrepresented by the circulator.”*

In the third paragraph of Mr. Hammond's public Facebook postings, Mr. Hammond, the circulator of the recall petition, solicited recall signatures while claiming that *“I will not share your information with anyone.”*

This information provided by the circulator is patently false.

As a former board member and chairman, it is disingenuous of Mr. Hammond to state an overt falsehood. This information is absolutely public knowledge and therefore misrepresented to the public by Mr. Hammond. *(Please see attached, Exhibit 2)*

5) Ref. Wis State Statute 9.10 (2)(m) – *“No signature may be stricken on the basis that the elector was not aware of the purpose of the petition, unless the purpose was misrepresented by the circulator.”*

The final paragraph of Mr. Hammond's public Facebook postings, states that,

“I am a former board member and chairman for the Town of Easton. My family has been in Easton for over 6 generation. I can no longer stand by and watch as our community is made to suffer for the actions I have witnessed.” *(Please see attached, Exhibit 2).*

There is no mention, **anywhere**, in the public Facebook postings or on the Recall Petition that I, Jodi Schappe, have performed **the responsibilities of a town supervisor** inadequately, much less performed such duties to cause suffering. This statement is a misrepresentation to the public.

6) Ref. Wis State Statute 9.10 (1)(b) – *“Except as provided in par. (c), a petition for recall of an officer shall be signed by electors equal to at least 25 percent of the vote cast for the office of governor at the last election within the same district or territory as that of the officeholder being recalled.”*

The letter of notification that the Clerk of Easton emailed to me states *“Town of Grant”*, which is not the same district or territory as that of the officeholder being recalled, myself, Jodi Schappe, specifically Town of Easton, Adams County, WI. *(Please see attached, Exhibit 3)*

7) Ref. WI State Statute 942.01(1) and (2) – *“Crimes Against Reputation, Privacy and Civil Liberties, Defamation” specifically:*

(1) Whoever with intent to defame communicates any defamatory matter to a 3rd person without the consent of the person defamed is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.

(2) Defamatory matter is anything which exposes the other to hatred, contempt, ridicule, degradation or disgrace in society or injury in the other's business or occupation.

In the second paragraph of Mr. Hammond's public Facebook postings, he states,

“If you wish to help save our community from unwanted spending, illegal actions and a lack of understanding the needs of the residents of the Town of Easton.”

This statement is defamatory and injurious to me, Jodi Schappe. *(Please see attached, Exhibit 2)*

I have been exposed to contempt, ridicule, and degradation while performing the duties of my Town of Easton Supervisor 1 role during meetings and also in general society due to these public Facebook communications made by Mr. Hammond.

I would also like it to be noted that I was alerted to these defamatory comments/accusations, published on Mr. Hammond's public Facebook postings, impugning my representation in the town of Easton, from individuals in Adams County, some of whom were not even from the Easton community.

In summary, all of the above insufficiencies, (1) – (7), consist of my submitted challenge to the recall petition.

Additionally, it must be emphasized that the petitioner has failed to identify the "...statement of a reason for the recall..." by utilizing vague, ambiguous, and questionable language that lacks the specificity required of such allegations, incidents, or relevant topics, and are therefore subject to flagrant misrepresentation, which violates WI State Statute.

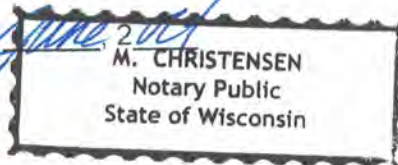



The following rebuttals will cover the seven (7) challenges put forth by Jodi
Schappe in regards to the petition for recall submitted to the town of Easton.

Ref. Wis. Statute 9.10 (2) (g)

The burden of proof for any challenge rests with the individual bringing the challenge.

Challenge 1.

In reference to challenge 1,

The Recall Petition form is filled out properly and completely, including the
Statement of Reason for Recall, which is identical to the one stated in the
Statement of Intent to Circulate Recall Petition: "Calling for actions beyond the
scope and authority of the elected position. Actions detrimental to the well-being
of the Town of Easton." Ms. Schappe may disagree
with the stated reasons for recall, but all necessary information was included on
the Petition.

Challenge 2.

In reference to challenge 2,

Ms. Schappe argues the word "action" in the Recall
Petition is vague and ambiguous and should be defined, and that its use could
misrepresent either intentionally or unintentionally for the signers of the petition.
However, Wis. Stat. 9.10 does not require the degree of specificity in the

Statement of Reason for Recall that Ms. Schappe is seeking. The Reason for Recall is legitimate and there is no requirement to state specific incidents. The fact that the Recall Petition form provides only two lines to state the Reason supports that the level of specificity that Ms. Schappe wants is not required.

Signers of the Recall Petition were able to read the Reason of Recall at the time they signed, and I answered any questions they may have had.

Ms. Schappe's statement "it would have at least afforded me the opportunity to respond to a specific complaint" is irrelevant as the Petition is for the electors in the Town of Easton and not a platform for Ms. Schappe to explain anything. There is no documentation that anyone who has signed the Petition has come forward claiming they were misled or that the Petition was misrepresented in any way.

Challenge 3.

In reference to challenge 3,

The referenced Facebook post is not a legal document and is irrelevant to the petition for recall. The Facebook post was up for a limited period of time, and none of the signers of the Petition asked about the Facebook post at the time of signature or prior to signature. All signatures were collected in person by the circulators.

A Facebook post is also not a document that is required to be in accordance with any statement on a recall petition, and further it did not accompany the Recall Petition, or serve as support for the Recall Petition or Statement of Intent to Circulate Recall Petition.

Challenge 4)

In reference to challenge 4,

The referenced Facebook post is not a legal document and is irrelevant to the Recall Petition. The Facebook post was up for a limited period of time, and none of the signers of the Petition asked about the Facebook post at the time of signature or prior to signature. All signatures were collected in person by the circulators.

Ms. Schappe suggests that this Facebook post somehow was a claim to electors that the signatures on the Recall Petition would be kept confidential. The Recall Petition of its face states that it is being submitted to Cherie Barnier, Clerk of the Town of Easton. The signers of the Recall Petition were all well aware that this was not a confidential process.

Challenge 5)

In reference to challenge 5,

The referenced Facebook post is not a legal document and is irrelevant to the Recall Petition. The Facebook post was up for a limited period of time, and none of the signers of the Petition asked about the Facebook post at the time of signature or prior to signature. All signatures were collected in person by the circulators.

A Facebook post is irrelevant to the petition for recall as all signatures are collected in person by the circulators.

A paragraph in a post on Facebook that expresses the opinion of a private citizen is not relevant to the recall petition.

Challenge 6)

In reference to challenge 6,

The letter of notification that was sent to Ms. Schappe and Myself Jason Hammond

The letter did have a drafting error that stated Town of Grant instead of the Town of Easton. All numbers set forth by the Clerk of the Town of Easton in the letter are correct including dates a times for filing. Further, this was not circulated to the public and has no bearing on the recall petition and is a simple error that has not been shown to have an affected on any portion of the recall petition procedures. Finally, the Recall Petition was signed by the proper number of electors within the Town of Easton. Ms. Schappe does not and cannot challenge that fact.

Challenge 7,

In reference to challenge 7,

The referenced Facebook post is not a legal document and is irrelevant to the Recall Petition. It was the opinion of a private citizen. I deny any and all allegations of defamation.

The Written 2-Day Reply to Mr. Hammond's 5-Day Rebuttal to my Recall Petition Challenge of Jodi Schappe, Complainant, 2755 14th Ct, Adams, WI 53910, Town of Easton, Adams County, WI.,

against Jason W. Hammond, Respondent, 1484 Evergreen Ct, Adams, WI 53910, Town of Easton, Adams County, WI.

This written reply will be duly submitted to the filing officer, Town of Easton Clerk, Cherie Barnier, 1163 County Rd A, Adams, WI 53910.

This Written 2-day Reply to Mr. Hammond's 5-Day Rebuttal to my Recall Petition Challenge is under Wisconsin State Statute Chapter 9.10(4)(a), "...if a rebuttal is filed, the officer against whom the petition is filed may file a reply to any new matter raised in the rebuttal within 2 days after the rebuttal is filed..."

I, Jodi Schappe, allege that I have received the rebuttal from Mr. Hammond regarding the insufficiencies stated in my original submitted challenge to his recall petition and I have new information to impart for consideration. I continue to question the validity of the Recall Petition per Wisconsin State Statute 9.10 (4)(a) and now further that referenced by Mr. Hammond, WI State Statute 9.10 (2)(g). Below are the reasons that I am citing for insufficiencies.

New information has come to light with regards to Mr. Hammond's Recall Petition and his rebuttal to my submitted recall petition challenge providing further basis to my previously indicated insufficiencies. All of my original stated insufficiencies still exist, and an additional one, and I, Jodi Schappe, reaffirm are inadequately contested by Mr. Hammond.

Reply to Mr. Hammond's Rebuttal Challenge 1 -- Mr. Hammond stated in the 'Statement of Intent to Circulate Recall Petition; *"Calling for actions beyond the scope and authority of the elected position. Actions detrimental to the well-being of the Town of Easton."* (Please see attached, Exhibit 1, Exhibit 4 and Exhibit 5).

To further verify that my understanding of Robert's Rule of Order and Parliamentary Procedure for the conduction of town business in the Town of Easton, Adams County Wisconsin is correct, I made two inquiries, one to the Wisconsin Towns Association (Exhibit 4) and one to the Town of Easton Clerk, Clerk Barnier, and Town Counsel, Nicholas Fianagan (Exhibit 5).

It was stated by the town clerk, Clerk Barnier, and not disproved by the Easton Town Counsel, that the clerk has not discovered any by-laws and that there are no existing ordinances pertaining to Parliamentary Procedure.

Therefore, if one would combine the response from the Town of Easton Clerk, (Exhibit 5) along with what was provided from the legal staff from the Wisconsin Towns Association (Exhibit 4), it is clearly indicated that I have absolutely performed my duties as a Town of Easton Supervisor within the scope and authority of my elected position. And furthermore, as I have never acted alone in making town determinations, it would be impossible for called actions to be detrimental to the well-being of the Town of Easton.

Moreover, the vagaries and tremendous latitude found in both statements, "*Calling for actions beyond the scope and authority of the elected position.*" and "*Actions detrimental to the well-being of the Town of Easton.*", the reason for the plural usage of the word "actions" is clearly left to either poor text editing or a great multiplier effect for undefined and undocumented hearsay which may easily be construed as negative or worse as acts of bullying and harassment.

Reply to Mr. Hammond's Rebuttal Challenge 2 – Mr. Hammond stated in Challenge 2 "*The fact that the Recall Petition form provides only two lines to state the Reason supports that the level of specificity that Ms. Schappe wants is not required.*" (Please see attached, Exhibit 1 and Exhibit 6)

Mr. Hammond's interpretation as to why there are only two lines provided on the Recall Petition form and that the lack of adequate room to state the Reason supports his level of specificity, or lack thereof, that is required is not stated anywhere in the instructions on form EL 170, specifically, "*Reasons for Recall - Recall petitions for elected officials representing city, village, town, and school district offices must state reasons for the recall which relate to the official duties of the official to be recalled...*".

Mr. Hammond does not have the qualifications to interpret nor assume what the creators of this form, specifically the Wisconsin Elections Commission, were indicating when it came to the reasons for the recall which relate to the official duties of the official to be recalled, nor the number of lines provided. I will also point to the "*Statement of Intent to Circulate a Recall Petition*" where there are ten lines for the petitioner to more than adequately state, with specificity, their reasons for recall. Recall petitions without any grounding in professional rationale and clear evidence of transparent misdeed, misguidance, malfeasance or misconduct is truly a waste of taxpayers money and trust in their political process.

Reply to Mr. Hammond's Rebuttal Challenge 3 – Mr. Hammond stated that his public Facebook posting "*is not a legal document and is irrelevant to the petition for recall.*" Further stating, "*The Facebook post was up for a limited period of time, and none of the signers of the Petition asked about the Facebook post at the time of the signature or prior to signature.*" (Please see attached, Exhibit 2)

Mr. Hammond made false statements about me, Jodi Schappe. The public Facebook posting was "published" (please refer to Exhibit 2 where there are thumbs-up and a record of comments made), clearly indicating that this was shared with at least one other person, and actually more, as depicted. This public Facebook posting was certainly relevant to the recall petition, otherwise why would it be mentioned in the body of the public Facebook posting where signatures are being actively sought? It would be unfounded and false of Mr. Hammond to assume that "none of the signers of the Petition asked about the Facebook post at the the time of the signature or prior to signature.", when that information would not be routinely requested at the time of signature. And furthermore, it was negligent of Mr. Hammond to publicly accuse me of "illegal actions".

Although Mr. Hammond's public Facebook posting was not attached to the recall petition, it is obvious with its timing of publication that there was clear intent to garner support, with the derogatory statements posted, for recall petition signature purposes.

Reply to Mr. Hammond's Rebuttal Challenge 4 –

The implication of Mr. Hammond's public Facebook posting, stating that "*I will not share your information with anyone.*", creates the illusion of anonymity to the public that their signature on the recall petition will not be made public. I am not arguing that the petition will be submitted to the clerk of the Town of Easton. I am stating that, unless someone is reading the petition, carefully and conscientiously, the signer, having been exposed to the public Facebook posting of Mr. Hammond's could certainly believe their signature would remain confidential and sign it with no fear of consequence. *(Please see attached, Exhibit 2)*

Reply to Mr. Hammond's Rebuttal Challenge 5 –

Mr. Hammond states "A paragraph in a post on Facebook that expresses the opinion of a private citizen is not relevant to the recall petition."

It is my firm conviction that Mr. Hammond willfully and recklessly disregarded that his public Facebook posting was wrongfully accusing me, Jodi Schappe, and my role as the Town of Easton Supervisor. As Mr. Hammond indicated, his public Facebook posting "was up for a limited period of time" which begs to question, if so innocuous, why remove it at all? Answer: Because it was meant to arouse strong, hostile feelings in the community against me, Jodi Schappe and my decisions while acting on town business. These decisions were made with the other board members, not singly, as implied. *(Please see attached, Exhibit 2)*

Reply to Mr. Hammond's Rebuttal Challenge 6 –

The letter of notification is indeed a written record of communication from the Town of Easton clerk and is therefore a document that could be requested by the public. In the case of a costly recall petition to the tax payers of Easton, I would have to imagine that all information provided to the recipient(s) should be without error to eliminate any and all confusion.

To repeat, Ref. Wis State Statute 9.10 (1)(b) – "*Except as provided in par. (c), a petition for recall of an officer shall be signed by electors equal to at least 25 percent of the vote cast for the office of governor at the last election within the same district or territory as that of the officeholder being recalled.*"

The letter of notification that the Clerk of Easton emailed to me states "*Town of Grant*", which is not the same district or territory as that of the officeholder being recalled, myself, Jodi Schappe, specifically Town of Easton, Adams County, WI. *(Please see attached, Exhibit 3)*

Reply to Mr. Hammond's Rebuttal to Challenge 7 –

Mr. Hammond states, "I deny any and all allegations of defamation." It would appear that Mr. Hammond disregards the power of public accusations and that he wishes to deny any and all allegations that he has made against me. I am a firm believer in the First Amendment to the

Constitution but when someone pairs disparaging and unsubstantiated accusations, naming myself, Jodi Schappe, and then in the same documented public Facebook posting requests recall petition signatures, I would submit that his denial is disingenuous and that his comments were exceedingly hurtful and have carried serious repercussions for myself, my family and friends, and those in and around my community which may be long-lasting, including defamation of my character, my reputation and possible impact to my financial well-being. Additional Insufficiency reply 8 – Ref. Wis State Statute 9.10(4)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code EL 2 and Wis. Admin. Code EL 20



In accordance with Wis. Stat. 9.10(1)(d) please be advised that, as there were 469 votes cast in the 2022 Governor Election, a sufficient petition will need 118 qualified signatures.

Please be further advised that, pursuant to Wis. Stat. 9.10(2)(d), the period of circulation begins April 29, 2024, and a completed recall petition must be filed with my office no later than 5:00 p.m. 60 days after April 29, 2024. Therefore, the deadline to file the completed petition is 5:00 p.m. on Friday, June 28, 2024.

WHEREAS, the Town of Easton Clerk and Town of Easton Attorney have examined the petition and found that there are 18 valid signatures.



Any correctable insufficiencies, as prescribed by Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2)(r) may be corrected by Petitioner pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) within 5 days of the issuance date prescribed herein.
