Comes now David VanderLeest, by special visitations, individually, hereby explicitly reserving his First Amendment Constitutional Rights in Good Faith, to amend this and all subsequent pleadings, should future events and/or discoveries prove necessary.

I would like the court to take judicial notice, I am appearing Propria Persona. "Pleadings in this case are being filed by a Plaintiff in Propria Persona, wherein pleadings are to be considered without regard to technicalities. Propria, pleadings are not to be held to the same high standards of perfection as practicing lawyers." See Haines v. Kerner 92 Sct 594

- 1. I am not a public person, I am not an attorney, I was not a candidate in the Sixth District City Council race, I am not representing anyone besides myself in these proceedings. I have simply determined Green Bay has not conducted fair elections in the Sixth District. I present my case at arms-length with clean hands. I have asked the Wisconsin Election Commission to launch an investigation, to determine the extent of the election fraud that occurred in the race for Green Bay City Council District Six. I requested an investigation under the authority of WI Statutes 5.05 to determine ALL the players (John Doe, Jane Doe) in this election fraud scheme, and their roles in this coordinated effort. I also filed a 5.06 compliance review: appeal.
- 2. Due to the high number of errors made by election officials, the total lack of ballot security, the disregard for election laws by election officials, the lack of chain of custody, and image evidence of ballot stuffing, no valid election results should have been "ascertained."
- 3. Wisconsin Statutes 5.01 (1) Construction of chs. 5 to 12. Except as otherwise provided, chs. 5 to 12 shall be construed to give effect to the will of the electors, if that can be ascertained from the proceedings, notwithstanding informality or failure to fully comply with some of their provisions. I argue that an average and reasonable person would not have ascertained `the same election results.
- 3. In my initial complaint, I reserved my First Amendment Constitutional Rights in Good Faith, to amend this and all subsequent pleadings, should future events and/or discoveries prove necessary. Since filing my initial complaint, I have learned two important things relating to the election for City Council of Green Bay District Six, and the complaints I filed.
- 4. First, I learned because of a FOIA request to the Brown County Clerk, Patrick Moynihan, that City Clerk Celestine Jeffreys lost two "Qualifying Sticks" from the Spring Election Cycle 2024. See Exhibit 11.
- 5. Second, I learned through a FOIA request to the Brown County Clerk, Patrick Moynihan, where I obtained all the in person electronic ballot images, which shows that the ballot was stuffed at ward 21. It is a **mathematical impossibility** for the **first 45 ballots** to be for one candidate at a polling place that only **had 185 total votes at the location**, in a race with a total of 695 total votes, **won by less than one quarter of one percent** (15 votes). The ballot was stuffed for Joey Pressley at the Green Bay Labor Temple polling location. See EX (Ward 21 Ballot Images)
- 6. The Defense's response falsely states I tried to wholesale disenfranchise absentee voters. After personally examining the absentee ballots and enveloped at the recount, I had personal knowledge that almost all absentee ballot envelopes were stamped with Celestine Jeffrey's initials (CJ) using a stamp. This stamp was used by others who work in the clerk's office instead of writing their own initials. This eliminates a major check and balance, which the Wisconsin statutes require to secure the ballot, two valid set of initials. For this reason, I asked for these ballots to be disqualified. When the assistant clerks and election employees used someone else's stamp instead of their own initials, they committed election fraud.

- 7. Wisconsin Statute 7.50 (2) Ascertainment of intent. All ballots cast at an election which bear the initials of 2 inspectors shall be counted for the person or referendum question for whom or for which they were intended, so far as the electors' intent can be ascertained from the ballots notwithstanding informality or failure to fully comply with other provisions of chs. 5 to 12. To determine intent:
- 8. It is my assumption the defense will argue in a similar fashion as in their Response; that Wisconsin Statutes 7.50 (2) does not state that the two initials must not be specifically from the person who initialized it, only that two initials are present. These types of manipulation of statutory intent should not be considered by the WEC.
- 9. I have further learned Florence Aerts who is a long standing poll worker at poll number 23 is on the indefinitely confined list. How can one be on the indefinitely confined list and still work 13 plus hours as a chief election day inspector. This demonstrates to me that the wolves are guarding the hen house, those that are tasked with upholding election laws, must hold themselves accountable to these same laws. This demonstrates that the City Clerk, the BOC, and the election workers in Green Bay will bend laws when it suits them, when it is easier. Further she is a democrat and fraudulently lists herself as unaffiliated. Many poll observers are listed as unaffiliated, yet they are known democrats.
- 10. By allowing Democrats to declare themselves unaffiliated when election officials have first-hand knowledge, they are affiliated with a party is fraud. Intentionally overlooking party affiliation has created an election where polling locations were not properly staffed to allow equal security. By the Clerk not having a Republican poll worker at ward 21 allows for the ballot stuffing to occur, this elaborate scheme of assigning unaffiliated election workers to polls when the clerk knows otherwise is the gate way to this election fraud.
- 11. The defense contends that the main part of my complaint only revolves around the security numbers from the ballot bags not having corresponding numbers on the Inspectors Statement. The Defense contends that this is not enough to disqualify and nullify the vote. The defendant stated, "While seals with recorded serial numbers are a helpful tool, the mere fact that the numbers are not recorded on the Inspectors' Statement is not evidence of tampering or fraud."
- 12. Seals and recorded serial numbers should not be overlooked as trivial, due to the overwhelming proof of fraud, ballot stuffing, and wholesale chain of custody mistakes that occurred with absentee ballots. Do you think if you were part of a ballot stuffing scheme, that you would vote that you did anything wrong with ballot security?
- 13. For the defense to ask that all this simply be overlooked and the case be dismissed, and I should be fined \$500 is an unintelligible request meant to disenfranchise private citizens and election observers who bring real and tangible complaints, backed up by evidence, like the case before you today. I do not think this is a joke, I am in no way litigious. I am not looking to waste anyone's time, I simply think the evidence before you should compel the Commission to take action.

- 14. It should be noted that the City of Green Bay, the Clerk, and the BOC are represented for free by one of the Wisconsin's premier left wing law firms, Law Forward's website describes itself as "a pro-voter, pro-democracy nonprofit that was created because Wisconsin needed a legal organization that could strategically develop the law in the progressive tradition.....Law Forward was launched in 2020 as a response to the right-wing legal movement." What I find interesting, is that all of this stemmed from a non-partisan local race. I find it interesting that an election fraud case with a multitude of proof is being handled pro bono by a partisan entity. As an elector and citizen in Green Bay, I can not understand why election security, observation, and review have become so politically polarized under Clerk Jeffreys.
- 15. The defense claims my complaint is an untimely attempt at an appeal of the outcome of a recount and is baseless. My complaints are made under the authority of WI Statutes 5.05, and 5.06. 5.05(1e) allows the Commission to Issue an order under statute 5.06 after reviewing my complaint, and compliance review, appeal.

16. 5.06 Compliance review; appeal.

- (1) Whenever any elector of a jurisdiction or district served by an election official believes that a decision or action of the official or the failure of the official to act with respect to any matter concerning nominations, qualifications of candidates, voting qualifications, including residence, ward division and numbering, recall, ballot preparation, election administration or conduct of elections is contrary to law, or the official has abused the discretion vested in him or her by law with respect to any such matter, the elector may file a written sworn complaint with the commission requesting that the official be required to conform his or her conduct to the law, be restrained from taking any action inconsistent with the law or be required to correct any action or decision inconsistent with the law or any abuse of the discretion vested in him or her by law. The complaint shall set forth such facts as are within the knowledge of the complainant to show probable cause to believe that a violation of law or abuse of discretion has occurred or will occur. The complaint may be accompanied by relevant supporting documents. The commission may conduct a hearing on the matter in the manner prescribed for treatment of contested cases under ch. 27 if it believes such action to be appropriate.
- 17. If 5.05 (1e) allows the commission to issue and order under 5.06, it is only reasonable that this case can rise out of a recount as allowed for in WI statute 5.06. The defense's argument that the case should be dismissed because of lack of jurisdiction because of WI statute 9.01(6) is moot. Only Steven Campbell could appeal to the Circuit Court, Only the Candidate is afforded that right. My jurisdiction is proper for investigation and review before the WEC, and the complaint is ripe.

Conclusion

For the following reasons I ask the commission to fully investigate all these matter under my WI St 5.05 complaint, and issue a corrective order under WI St 5.06, and refer all findings to the District Attorney, and grant all my previous requests.


- 1. The ballot was stuffed at Ward 21.
- 2. Tamper proof evidence seal numbers were missing on the Inspector Statements at 3 poll locations.
- 3. Qualifying Zip drivers were lost under Clerk Jeffreys chain of custody.
- 4. Election workers and chief inspectors fraudulently misrepresented their party affiliation.
- 5. Election employees do not personally follow election laws relating to their own indefinitely confined statutes, how can they be trusted to run a fair election.
- 6. Absentee ballots were all stamped in error and do not have the true initials of the correct election employee allowing for zero chain of custody.

Thank you for your time and I beg you all to do the right thing for the citizens of Green Bay. Please investigate this matter fully with all your resources, which are much more vast than my own.
