SUBJECT: Ballot Access for Assembly District 24 Special Election

Summary

Due to a resignation of the incumbent Representative to the Assembly, Governor Tony Evers issued Executive Order 198 to call a special election to fill the seat of Assembly District 24. The special election for this office will be held on July 18, 2023. Per Wis. Stat. § 8.50(3)(b), no special primary is required as no more than one candidate has filed nomination papers for each recognized political party.

The filing period for the special election began on May 5, 2023, and the deadline for filing nominating paperwork was May 23, 2023. Two candidates have filed all the required paperwork for the seat. The Commission received one challenge. After reviewing all nomination papers and challenge filings, staff recommend approving both candidates for ballot access.

Nomination Paper Review Process and Ballot Access Document Filing

Staff conduct an initial nomination paper review using the requirements set forth in Wis. Stats. §§ 8.15 and 8.30 and Wis. Admin. Code Ch. EL 2 to determine if a candidate has filed a sufficient number of signatures to qualify for ballot access. During the facial review process, staff did not identify any irregularities in the nomination papers for either candidate. Both candidates also timely filed declarations of candidacy, campaign registration statements, and statements of economic interest required for ballot access.

The table below lists the candidates that filed nomination paperwork, their party, and the number of signatures determined to be facially valid by staff after initial review:

Challenges to Ballot Status

The deadline for challenges to ballot access was Friday, May 26, 2023. The Commission received one challenge, Morgan Hess v. Paul Melotik (EL 23-44), which challenged 294 of the 369 signatures on nomination papers submitted for Paul Melotik. The staff worksheet used to examine each challenged page and line follows this memo in this packet. Most of the challenges related to missing letters and words on the nomination paper templates used by the circulators. The missing letters and words are apparent on the face of the nomination papers, however, staff determined that, with one exception, the nomination papers were substantially compliant, and that the missing letters and words did not eliminate anything that was essential to a statutory requirement.

Overall, staff recommend accepting a challenge to one full page containing 8 signatures, page 12, that lacks the required indication that the nomination paper pertained to a special election as required by Wis. Stat. § 8.15(5)(a). Staff also recommend accepting challenges to 9 individual lines due to the addresses provided being outside the 24th assembly district. Because staff believe the burden was met by the challenger for these 17 signatures, staff reviewed the response for any arguments potentially rebutting those challenges. Regarding page 12, the response admits that the nomination paper does not show whether it relates to a general or special election and argues only that the error is a "technical noncompliance" that should not result in the invalidation of any otherwise valid signatures. Staff do not believe that this argument rebuts the challenge. The response did not attempt to rebut challenges against addresses challenged as defective.

A few closer calls are worth discussing briefly. Staff initially agreed that the date of the election was entirely missing from page 16, which would invalidate 10 signatures. However, after reviewing the original nomination paper, staff believe that the date, though very faint, can be clearly read. The certification of the circulator on page 9, which contains 10 signatures, is missing several full words and makes the statement confusing at first glance. However, staff believe that the remaining words preserve each essential point within the certification. Of the closer line by line challenges, Commission staff believe that line 1 on page 8 was signed by Donald Gibbs, and that the address on line 7 of page 43 is 1203 Keup Rd. Grafton, which was verified on Google maps street view.

After reviewing the challenge and all relevant sections of the response, staff recommend accepting the challenges to 17 signatures as discussed on this page and specified on the staff worksheet included in this packet. The table below lists the candidates and the number of signatures recommended by staff for approval by the Commission following the review of the challenge.

Recommended Motion 1: The Commission sustains 17 challenges within Morgan Hess v. Paul Melotik (EL 23-44) and rejects the remaining 277 challenges in accordance with the staff recommendations contained in this memo and the attached staff worksheet. The Commission finds that Paul Melotik submitted 352 valid signatures on his nomination papers.

Recommended Motion 2: The Commission accepts the staff recommendations contained in this memo and approves ballot access for Paul Melotik and Bob Tatterson for the July 18, 2023, Special Election in Assembly District 24

Recommended Motion 3: The Commission denies ballot access for Spencer Zimmerman for the July 18, 2023, Special Election in Assembly District 24 as the candidate did not file all necessary ballot access documents by the filing deadline.



VERIFIED COMPLAINT

- 1. This Verified Complaint is brought against Paul Melotik pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 5.06, Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.07, and other Wisconsin laws governing elections and election campaigns.
- 2. Melotik seeks to be a candidate for Representative to the Assembly District 24 in next month's special election.
- 3. To qualify for ballot access in an election for the Wisconsin Assembly, a purported candidate must submit no less than 200 and no more than 400 valid nominating signatures in support of his candidacy. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(6)(d). To be valid, such signatures must be collected on nominating petitions that meet the requirements set forth in relevant portions of the Wisconsin Statutes. Wis. Stat. §§ 8.15(4)-(6).

- 4. Pursuant to public notice issued by the Wisconsin Elections Commission ("WEC"), valid nominating signatures to place a candidate on the ballot for the special election to fill the present vacancy in Wisconsin Assembly District 24 had to be submitted to WEC no later than Tuesday, May 23, 2023.
- 5. On Tuesday, May 23, 2023, WEC found that Melotik submitted 369 signatures in support of his candidacy for Representative to the Assembly District 24 in the July 18, 2023 special election. However, only 75 of the signatures Melotik collected are valid signatures.
- 6. In one example of many—a page circulated by Melotik himself—the header is obscured, interfering with the street address, zip code, party affiliation, title of office, and name of jurisdiction:



- 7. That same page is one of many where the signatory certification is missing entire words, such that the elector had no way of knowing what they are attesting to by signing the paper.
- 8. In some instances, someone hand-wrote on the defective forms, seemingly in an after-the-fact attempt to cure the defective paperwork:



9. Nine identical forms circulated by Tom Grabow, in addition to containing obscured signatory certifications, include a defective circulator certification, where pieces of the certification are cutoff entirely on the left margin, such that the circulator had no way of knowing what they were attesting to by signing the certification:



- 10. In addition to the broad swaths of invalid pages, there are also thirty-four (34) individual signatures that are invalid for one of several reasons.
- 11. Accordingly, Melotik has not gathered the required 200 valid signatures and should be excluded from the ballot. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(6)(d).

BACKGROUND

- 12. Complainant Morgan Hess is a qualified elector and resident of the State of Wisconsin. Hess serves as the Executive Director of the Assembly Democratic Campaign Committee, with offices located at 7 North Pinckney Street, Suite 200, Madison, Wisconsin, 53703. Hess resides at 1945 Winnebago St., Apt. 303, Madison, Wisconsin, 53704.
- 13. Respondent Paul Melotik is a resident of Wisconsin, who, upon information and belief, resides at 1408 Pioneer Road, Grafton, Wisconsin, 53024.
- 14. Respondent Melotik holds himself out as a candidate for Representative to the Assembly District 24 in the July 18, 2023 special election.



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- 15. To secure a place on the ballot as a candidate, Melotik filed, or caused to be filed, nomination papers with WEC on May 23, 2023. Wis. Stat. § 8.50(3).
- 16. Wis. Stat. § 8.50, which governs special elections, provides: "Except as otherwise provided in this section, the provisions for the partisan primary under s. 8.15 are applicable to all partisan primaries held under this section[.]" Wis. Stat. § 8.50(3)(b).
- 17. Consequently, as a candidate for Representative to the Assembly – District 24, Melotik was required to timely submit to WEC nomination papers containing at least 200 valid signatures of electors. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(6)(d).
- 18. WEC determined that Melotik submitted a total of three hundred sixty-nine (369) signatures to the WEC on 44 separate, numbered nomination papers. The full set of nomination papers submitted by Melotik is attached to this Verified Complaint as Exhibit A.
- 19. Under Wisconsin law, nomination papers must contain certain information for the signatures on those papers to be valid and counted toward the minimum number of required signatures. Wis. Stat. §§ 8.15(4)-(6).
- 20. This Verified Complaint is timely filed with WEC on May 26, 2023, which is within three calendar days after the filing deadline for the challenged nomination papers. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(1); Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.07(2)(a).
- 21. WEC has jurisdiction over this Verified Complaint, as provided in Wis. Stat. § 5.06 and Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.07.

THE THREE RELEVANT CATEGORIES OF DEFECTS IN MELOTIK'S NOMINATION PAPERS

22. Two-hundred-eighty-seven (287) of the signatures submitted by Respondent Melotik appear on deficient nomination papers, leaving only eighty-two (82) signatures appearing

on valid nomination papers. Only those signatures on valid nomination papers may be counted toward the statutory requirement. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(1)

- 23. Specifically, this Complaint challenges pages 1-6, 8-13, 15-17, 19-25, 28-31, 34-41, and 44 (the "Challenged Papers"). A breakdown of the Challenged Papers, and the basis of the defects, appears in Chart A below. In addition, thirty-four (34) individual signatures are invalid, of which seven (7) are *not* contained on pages that fall within the Challenged Papers.
- 24. The Challenged Papers contain three types of defects, including defects to the: (1) Header; (2) Signatory / Elector Certification, and (3) Circulator Certification.

The Header Requirement.

- "Each candidate shall include his or her mailing address on the candidate's 25. nomination papers." Wis. Stat. § 8.15(5)(b).
- 26. WEC warns candidates in clear, express terms that "[c]orrectly filling out the top three lines of the nomination paper form is one of the most important things a candidate can do." Wis. Elections Comm'n, Candidate Ballot Access Procedures: Nomination Papers (Apr. 2020).¹ "If any of the boxes in the header are filled out incorrectly, electors might not be provided with all candidate and election information as required by law. A header that is incorrectly filled out also presents the possibility of challenges being issued to the validity of those nomination papers, resulting in the disqualification of all signatures on those pages." *Id.*

The Signatory / Elector Certification Requirement.

27. Wisconsin law mandates that "[e]ach nomination paper shall have substantially the following words printed at the top" and sets forth the following:

I, the undersigned, request that the name of (insert candidate's last name plus first name, nickname or initial, and middle name, former legal surname, nickname or middle initial or initials if desired, but no other abbreviations or titles) residing at (insert candidate's street address) be placed on the ballot at the (general or special) election to be held on (date of election) as a candidate representing the (name of party) so that voters will have the opportunity to vote for (him or her) for the office of (name of office). I am eligible to vote in (name of jurisdiction or district in which candidate seeks office). I have not signed the nomination paper of any other candidate for the same office at this election.

Wis. Stat. § 8.15(5)(a).

28. If a person does not clearly see that they can sign nomination candidates for only one candidate, they may be deprived of the opportunity to sign in support of the candidate of their choosing. See Wis. Stat. § 8.04 ("If any person signs nomination papers for 2 candidates for the same office in the same election at different times, the earlier signature is valid and the later signature is invalid.").

The Circulator Certification Requirement.

- 29. The mandated certification by the circulator "shall appear at the bottom of each nomination paper[.]" Wis. Stat. § 8.15(4)(a). This certification requires the circulator to acknowledge that they are subject to Wis. Stat. § 12.13(3)(a), which, in turn, acknowledges the importance of pristing nomination papers, making it illegal to "defect or destroy a [...] nomination paper[.]" Id. (emphasis added). Violating Wis. Stat. § 12.13(3)(a) is a Class I felony, punishable by "a fine not to exceed \$10,000 or imprisonment not to exceed 3 years and 6 months, or both." Wis. Stat. §§ 12.60(1)(a), 939.50(3)(i).
- 30. "No signature on a nomination paper shall be counted unless the elector who circulated the nomination paper completes and signs the certificate of circulator and does so after, not before, the paper is circulated." Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(14).

THE DEFECTS IN MELOTIK'S NOMINATION PAPERS

31. Those categories are discussed in greater detail below, but the following chart identifies which nomination papers contain which defects:

- 32. Once the 287 signatures on defective nomination papers are excluded from Melotik's submission, only 82 signatures remain.
- 33. In addition, thirty-four (34) of Melotik's individual signatures are invalid, of which seven (7) are *not* contained on the Challenged Papers. The bases for challenging each of those 34 individual signatures are reflected in Charts B and C at the end of this Complaint.
 - 34. All told, Melotik submitted only seventy-five (75) valid signatures.

ARGUMENT

I. The Challenged Papers Are Defective, Rendering Each Signature on those Pages Invalid.

- 35. As a candidate for public office, Melotik "has the responsibility to assure that his ... nomination papers are prepared, circulated, signed, and filed in compliance with statutory and other legal requirements." Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(1); *see also* Wis. Stat. § 8.07.
- 36. Our statutes mandate that Melotik may not appear on the ballot if he failed to secure 200 valid signatures:

Only those candidates for whom nomination papers containing the necessary signatures acquired within the allotted time and filed before the deadline may have their names appear on the official partisan primary ballot.

Wis. Stat. 8.15(1); see also Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(6) ("Nomination papers shall contain at least the minimum required number of signatures from the circuit, county, district or jurisdiction which the candidate seeks to represent.").

- 37. This Commission has previously held that "a regulation regarding the conduct of nomination paper circulators [...] must be construed as mandatory and 'must be strictly enforced in order to insure the orderly exercise' of the nomination process and ballot access decisions." Exhibit K (Decision and Order in *Lipscomb v. Sullivan*) at 5 (*quoting Ahlgrimm v. State Elections Bd.*, 82 Wis.2d 585, 596, 263 N.W.2d 152 (1978)).²
- 38. As our Supreme Court has recognized, it may be an "unfortunate and regrettable" result to exclude a candidate from the ballot, but "nevertheless, the burden was on the petitioner to properly file." *Ahlgrimm*, 82 Wis. 2d at 597. "Ultimately, it is the candidate's responsibility to ensure that the nomination papers they file have the minimum number of required signatures."

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² On this point, Wisconsin law is in accord with the general rule, whereby "[i]t is a prerequisite to the right of a candidate to have his or her name printed on the official ballot that the governing legal requirements be complied with." 29 C.J.S. Elections § 279.

Exhibit K (Decision and Order in *Lipscomb v. Sullivan*) at 7. "A candidate who does not vet their nomination papers prior to filing assumes the risks and mistakes resulting from circulators who are unaware of or do not comply with the regulations governing the circulation of nomination papers." *Id.*

- 39. This result is also compelled by the WEC's Administrative Code, which provides that "[e]ach of the nomination papers shall be numbered" but that "the absence of a page number will not invalidate the signatures on that page." Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(2). It follows that other defects in the requirements—including the Header, Signatory / Elector Certification, or Circulator Certification—do "invalidate the signatures on that page." Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(2); see also Steinlein v. Halstead, 52 Wis. 289, 8 N.W. 881, 883 (1881) ("Nor must the maxim expressio unius exclusio alterius be ignored or underrated in the interpretation and construction of this statute. There are many of the requirements of this statute whose performance is essential to the validity of the assignment, and made so in express terms; but this, as we have seen, is not one of them.").
- 40. Even if substantial compliance were all that is required, certificates or headers omitting words or portions of words do not amount to substantial compliance. "Substantial compliance requires the petitions be circulated in a manner that protects against fraud and that assures the signers knew the contents of the petitions." *Matter of Recall of Redner*, 153 Wis. 2d 383, 391, 450 N.W.2d 808, 811 (Ct. App. 1989) (analyzing petition requirement under recall procedures).
- 41. This is not a case of blurred or faint nomination papers. Indeed, dozens of the signatures this Complaint *does not* challenge appear on pages where the required information on the form is faint or blurred. (*See, e.g.*, Signatory / Elector Certification on Exhibit A at 26 and 27)

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But the Challenged Pages are not just faint. Rather, words and portions of words are missing entirely. Under such circumstances, there has been no substantial compliance. See Jacoway v. Gault, 20 Ark. 190, 194 (1859) ("A literal compliance with the statute is not required—the words of the statute need not be used—words of similar import may be employed, but the Courts cannot dispense with a substantial compliance with the statute. [...] Courts cannot, by intendment, supply important words omitted in the certificate[.]"); Schreiner v. Allen, 13 A.D.2d 871, 871, 216 N.Y.S.2d 57, 58 (1961) (in applying substantial-compliance standard to requirement that poll books contain a statement on each page, distinguishing between statements that are "faint" versus those that do not "appear in such form as to be visible and comprehensible").

42. The Challenged Papers, for the reasons articulated in Chart A, do not comply with the applicable statutory requirements and therefore the signatures on those pages cannot count towards Melotik's required 200 signatures.

II. Thirty-four of Melotik's Signatures Are Invalid and Cannot Be Counted.

- 43. Separate and apart from this Complaint's challenges to the Challenged Papers, thirty-four (34) individual signatures on Melotik's nomination papers are invalid.
- 44. For nomination signatures to be valid, the signatory must reside in the jurisdiction or district which the candidate named on the paper will represent if elected. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(3).
- 45. "In addition to his or her signature, in order for the signature to be valid, each signer of a nomination paper shall legibly print his or her name in a space provided next to his or her signature and shall list his or her municipality of residence for voting purposes, the street and number, if any, on which the signer resides, and the date of signing." Wis. Stat. § 8.15(2).
- 46. In addition, an "individual signature on a nomination paper may not be counted" when any of the following apply:

- (a) The date of the signature is missing, unless the date can be determined by reference to the dates of other signatures on the paper.
- (b) The signature is dated after the date of certification contained in the certificate of circulator.
- (c) The address of the signer is missing or incomplete, unless residency can be determined by the information provided on the nomination paper.
- (d) The signature is that of an individual who is not 18 years of age at the time the paper is signed. An individual who will not be 18 years of age until the subject election is not eligible to sign a nomination paper for that election.
- (e) The signature is that of an individual who has been adjudicated not to be a qualified elector on the grounds of incompetency or limited competency as provided in s. 6.03 (3), Stats., or is that of an individual who was not, for any other reason, a qualified elector at the time of signing the nomination paper.

Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(15).

- 47. The challenge to addresses listed below are based on an investigation using the Wisconsin Legislative District Viewer, and, where that did not conclusively resolve the address issue, using the Ozaukee County Parcel search, available at https://maps.legis.wisconsin.gov/ and https://www.ascent.co.ozaukee.wi.us/LandRecords/PropertyListing/RealEstateTaxParcel#/Search, respectively.
- 48. Nor can a circulator certify his or her own signature on a nomination paper, consistent with the bedrock principle that "no man can be a judge in his own case." *Guthrie v. Wis. Emp. Rels. Comm'n*, 111 Wis. 2d 447, 456, 331 N.W.2d 331 (1983). If a circulator could certify his or her own signature, that would render the certification wholly illusory and defeat the intent of the certification. *See State v. Wilson*, 2017 WI 63, ¶42, 376 Wis. 2d 92, 896 N.W.2d 682 ("When construing statutes, meaning should be given to every word, clause and sentence in the statute, and a construction which would make part of the statute superfluous should be avoided wherever possible."). Allowing a circulator to certify their own signature makes no more sense that allowing

someone to notarize their own signature, which is forbidden. Dep't of Fin. Inst., *Notary Public Info*. (May 2020) at 8 ("A notary public may not perform a notarial act with respect to a record in which the notary or their spouse or domestic partner is a party or has direct beneficial interest. If you do, then the document may be voided.").³

- 49. The following defects are present:
 - a. Fifteen (15) signatories listed addresses that lie outside of Assembly District 24.
 - b. Seven (7) signatories have illegible names or addresses.
 - c. Five (5) signatories list addresses that do not exist.
 - d. In seven (7) instances, a circulator purported to certify their own signature.

51. The signatures in Charts B and C are invalid and cannot be counted towards Melotik's required 200 signatures.

CONCLUSION

- 52. For the foregoing reasons, Respondent Paul Melotik has not properly submitted nominating papers that contain the requisite number of valid signatures to be placed on the ballot for Wisconsin's July 18, 2023 special election in Wisconsin Assembly District 24.
- 53. Complainant Morgan Hess respectfully requests that Wisconsin Elections Commission conduct any investigation it deems appropriate pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 5.06 and Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.07, promptly hold a hearing on this matter to the extent it deems necessary, and ultimately rule that the nomination papers submitted by Melotik are legally deficient for the reasons set forth in this Verified Complaint.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 5.05(1)(e) and 5.06(6), the Wisconsin Elections Commission ("Commission") is provided with the inherent, general, and specific authority to consider the submissions of parties to a complaint, and to issue findings and orders. Theodore Lipscomb, Sr. has filed a verified complaint with the Commission appealing the decision of the Milwaukee County Election Commission ("MCEC") to approve ballot access for Candidate Jim Sullivan for the 2020 Spring Election as a candidate for County Executive. The Commission has reviewed the complaint and supporting documentation as well as the response of the MCEC filed by Milwaukee County Clerk George Christenson and Elections Director Julietta Henry. The Commission issues the following Decision and Order.

Procedural Background

Candidate Jim Sullivan filed nomination papers for the Office of Milwaukee County Executive containing 2,690 signatures with the Milwaukee County Election Commission on January 7, 2020. Following a review of these signatures, MCEC staff determined that Candidate Sullivan had submitted 2,450 valid signatures¹, which exceeds the total of 2,000 valid signatures required to qualify for ballot access for the Office of Milwaukee County Executive.

On January 10, 2020, Theodore Lipscomb, Sr. filed a challenge to the nomination papers of Candidate Sullivan. The challenge asserted that 1,001 signatures should be struck as invalid because the circulators who collected those signatures had previously circulated nomination papers for another candidate for the same office, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 8.04.

¹ Paragraph 13 of the complaint alleges that MCEC staff determined that 2,397 signatures were valid, but page 7 of the MCEC hearing transcript indicates that its staff accepted 2,450 signatures as valid. For purposes of this decision, the Commission uses the figure cited by MCEC staff in the hearing transcript.

Candidate Sullivan's response to the challenge argued that Wis. Stat. § 8.04's prohibition regarding the same circulator collecting signatures for multiple candidates is directory rather than mandatory, there was no evidence of fraud on the part of the circulator or Candidate Sullivan, and that counting the signatures as valid gives effect to the will of the electors as required by Wis. Stat. § 5.01(1).

Based on the complaint filed with the Commission as well as the challenge and response filed with the MCEC, the relevant facts are not in dispute. Following its review, MCEC staff determined that Candidate Sullivan had filed nomination papers containing 2,450 valid signatures and qualified for ballot status. Mr. Lipscomb challenged 1,001 of the 2,450 signatures. The basis of the challenge was that four individuals who circulated nomination papers for Candidate Sullivan (Alisha Pettis, Lesa Trotter, Keith Pettis and Dominique Thomas) also circulated and submitted nomination papers for David Crowley, another candidate for Milwaukee County Executive. Striking the challenged signatures would disqualify Mr. Sullivan from having his name on the Spring Election ballot.

The four individuals first circulated nomination papers for Candidate Crowley and subsequently circulated nomination papers for Candidate Sullivan. Candidate Sullivan's response to the challenge stated that the three circulators were hired by a vendor, Simon Warrant, who was retained by Sullivan's campaign to assist with the circulation of nomination papers. Candidate Sullivan asserts that his campaign was assured by Simon Warren that its employees would not circulate nomination papers for any other candidates for County Executive.

On January 14, 2020, the Milwaukee County Election Commission conducted a hearing regarding the challenge filed by Mr. Lipscomb, Sr. After considering arguments of both parties, the MCEC considered a motion to approve the challenge and strike 1,001 signatures. The motion failed on a vote of 1-1, with one member of the MCEC being absent. As a result, the decision of MCEC staff to approve Candidate Sullivan for ballot status stood.

On January 17, 2020, the Commission received a timely, verified complaint from Mr. Lipscomb, Sr. appealing the MCEC's decision. The complaint asserts that Wis. Stat. § 8.04 requires striking the 1,001 signatures which were challenged before the MCEC, and that the MCEC abused its discretion by determining that § 8.04 was discretionary and permitting Candidate Sullivan's name to be placed on the Spring Election ballot. The complaint requests that the Commission strike signatures collected in violation of § 8.04 and determine that Candidate Sullivan does not qualify for ballot access.

On January 17, 2020, MCEC staff submitted a letter in response to the complaint. The letter states that, in light of the MCEC's tie vote regarding the challenge to Candidate Sullivan's nomination papers, the MCEC's response is limited to submitting the filings of the parties and the record of the proceedings. The Commission also notes that, while Candidate Sullivan is not a party to the appeal, the Commission has reviewed and considered his response to Mr. Lipscomb's challenge that was filed with the MCEC as well as the arguments made at the MCEC's January 14, 2020 hearing.

Candidate Sullivan chose not to file a reply to the MCEC's response to the complaint.

The Commission's role in resolving verified complaints filed under Wis. Stat. § 5.06, which challenge the decisions or actions of local election officials, is determining whether a local official acted contrary to applicable election laws or abused their discretion in administering applicable election laws.

Commission Findings

The Commission makes the following findings:

Wis. Stat. § 8.04 states as follows:

Nomination paper signatures. If any person signs nomination papers for two candidates for the same office in the same election at different times, the earlier signature is valid, and the later signature is invalid. If any person circulates a nomination paper for two candidates for the same office in the same election at different times, the earlier paper is valid, and the later paper is invalid.

Emphasis added.

There is no dispute that four individuals circulated nomination papers for two candidates for the same office at the same election at different times. The affidavits of each of the circulators state that they first circulated nomination papers for Candidate Crowley and subsequently circulated nomination papers for Candidate Sullivan. Based upon the plain language of Wis. Stat. § 8.04, these circumstances appear to require that the earlier papers circulated for Candidate Crowley are valid, and the later papers circulated for Candidate Sullivan are invalid and the signatures on those pages should be struck as invalid.

In his response to the challenge filed with the MCEC, Candidate Sullivan argued that the circulators' actions constituted a "good faith error" on the part of the vendor and circulators, and in the absence of any fraudulent intent, Candidate Sullivan should not be penalized. Candidate Sullivan noted that he was assured by Simon Warren that the circulators he retained would not circulate nomination papers on behalf of any other candidate for Milwaukee County Executive. Candidate Sullivan's response to the challenge argued that Wis. Stat. § 8.04 should be construed as directory, not mandatory, and that counting the challenged signatures as valid would give effect to the will of the electors as required by Wis. Stat. § 5.01(1) which states as follows:

CONSTRUCTION OF CHS. 5 TO 12. Except as otherwise provided, chs. 5 to 12 shall be construed to give effect to the will of the electors, if that can be ascertained from the proceedings, notwithstanding informality or failure to fully comply with some of their provisions.

Candidate Sullivan cited several court decisions to attempt to support his assertion that Wis. Stat. § 8.04 should be construed as directory rather than mandatory and that counting the

challenged signatures as valid would give effect to the will of the electors pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 5.01(1). The Commission concludes that the cases cited do not support this conclusion for several reasons.

Candidate Sullivan is correct that Wisconsin courts have long recognized that some election statutes should be construed as directory rather than mandatory, and that in such cases, the term "shall" is construed to mean "may." For example, in 1867 the Wisconsin Supreme Court found that

the statutory regulations for conducting an election are directory and not jurisdictional in their character, the main object of such laws being to afford all persons entitled to vote an opportunity to exercise the elective franchise, to prevent illegal votes, and to ascertain with certainty the true number of votes cast, and for whom. *State ex rel. Bancroft v. Stumpf*, 21 Wis. 586 (1867).

In 1966, the Wisconsin Supreme Court summarized the effect of determining whether an election statute is mandatory or directory:

An act done in violation of a mandatory provision is void, whereas an act done in violation of a directory provision, while improper, may nevertheless be valid. Deviations from directory provisions of election statutes are usually termed "irregularities," and as has been shown in the preceding subdivision, such irregularities do not vitiate an election. *Gradinjan v. Boho*, 29 Wis. 2d 674, 682, 139 N.W.2d 557 (1966).

And in 1968, the Wisconsin Supreme Court described the type of election statutes which should be construed as directory instead of mandatory:

Statutes giving directions as to the mode and manner of conducting elections will be construed by the courts as directory, unless a noncompliance with their terms is expressly declared to be fatal, or will change or render doubtful the result, as where the statute merely provides that certain things shall be done in a given manner and time without declaring that conformity to such provisions is essential to the validity of the election. *Lanser v. Kaconis*, 62 Wis. 2d 86, 91, 214 N.W.2d 425 (1974).

Candidate Sullivan cited other court decisions which have construed election statutes as directory. In each case, however, the statute at issue involved the mode or manner of conducting an election, such as processing and counting ballots, not the requirements or procedures for circulating and completing nomination papers and qualifying for ballot access. In 1978, the Wisconsin Supreme Court held that the deadline for filing nomination papers and the place of filing are mandatory requirements, and failing to satisfy those requirements disqualified a judicial candidate from ballot access. *Ahlgrimm v. State Elections Bd.*, 82 Wis.2d 585, 263 N.W.2d 152 (1978). In *Ahlgrimm*, the Court noted that the statute regarding the place of filing was not ambiguous, and also stated:

We view the requirements of sec. 8.10(2), Stats., and sec. 8.10(6), Stats., as being reasonable regulations of the right to be a candidate for public office. These regulations governing the time and place of filing nomination papers must be strictly enforced in order to insure the orderly exercise of such right. . . Because the petitioner did not timely file with the State Elections Board his nomination papers for the office of circuit judge, his name cannot appear on the ballot. As unfortunate and regrettable as this result might be, especially in this situation where there will be no candidate for circuit judge in the 21st Judicial Circuit on the ballot, nevertheless, the burden was on the petitioner to properly file. He did not do so. *Ahlgrimm*, 82 Wis. 2d at 597. (Citation omitted).

The Court of Appeals subsequently summarized how the "will of the electors" phrase in Wis. Stat. § 5.01(1) should be interpreted in determining whether an election statute is directory or mandatory:

However, our supreme court has interpreted this statute as applying only after an election has been held and the will of the electors manifested. See *State ex rel. Oaks v. Brown*, 211 Wis. 571, 579, 249 N.W. 50, 53 (1933). This holding remained undisturbed by our supreme court's decision in *State ex. rel. Ahlgrimm v. State Elections Bd.*, 82 Wis.2d 585, 263 N.W.2d 152 (1978). Accordingly, § 5.01(1) is inapplicable to the instant case, as there was no election from which the will of the electors had manifested. *City of Chippewa Falls v. Town of Hallie*, 231 Wis. 2d 85, 604 N.W.2d 300 (Ct. App. 1999).

In short, Wisconsin courts have determined that assessing the will of the electors is relevant to the determination of whether an election statute is directory or mandatory only in the context of conducting an election or when the will of the electors can be observed at an election or through examining ballots cast. The courts have not extended that analysis to the processes for circulating and reviewing nomination papers. To the contrary, regulations regarding nomination papers have been construed as mandatory, as in the *Ahlgrimm* decision, and regulations pertaining to the qualifications of circulators of a referendum petition have also been construed as mandatory, as in the *City of Chippewa Falls* decision.

Viewed in the framework established by the court cases cited above, it seems apparent that the prohibition on serial circulation of nomination papers in Wis. Stat. § 8.04 does not fit in the category of a directory statute. It is not related to the actual conduct of an election, the exercise of the right to vote, or the interpretation of a vote on a ballot. Rather, it is a regulation regarding the conduct of nomination paper circulators. It must be construed as mandatory and "must be strictly enforced in order to insure the orderly exercise" of the nomination process and ballot access decisions. *Ahlgrimm*, 82 Wis. 2d at 597.

In addition, because § 8.04 governs the process of circulating nomination papers and not the content of the papers, the challenged signatures cannot be counted as valid by virtue of EL § 2.05(5), Wis. Adm. Code, which states that "[w]here any *required item of information* on a nomination paper is incomplete, the filing officer shall accept the information as complete if there has been substantial compliance with the law." (Emphasis added). "Substantial

compliance with the law" applies to the completeness of information on a nomination paper, not the process of circulating nomination papers.

The Commission recognizes that ruling the Sullivan nomination papers at issue are invalid may seem a harsh result when the candidate was assured by the vendor that its circulators would not collect signatures for other candidates for the same office, and where there is no evidence of fraudulent intent on the part of either the candidate or the circulators. However, as in *Ahlgrimm*, the statutory prohibition is unambiguous and it is a reasonable regulation regarding of the right to be a candidate for office, which the Legislature has created and the Commission is required to administer and enforce. As part of Chapter 260, Laws of 1979, the Legislature amended Wis. Stat. 8.04 as follows:

SECTION 55m. 8.04 of the statutes is amended to read:

8.04 Nomination paper signatures. If any person signs nomination papers for 2 candidates for the same office in the same election at different times, the earlier signature is valid and the later signature shall be stricken. Any person who signs or circulates nomination papers for one candidate may later circulate nomination papers for another candidate for the same in the same election if he changes his mind and intends to support the latter candidate is invalid. If any person circulates a nomination paper for 2 candidates for the same office in the same election at different times, the earlier paper is valid and the later paper is invalid.

This amendment specifically eliminated the ability of a circulator to collect signatures for multiple candidates for the same office at the same election, even if they changed their mind and intended to support the latter candidate. Instead, the Legislature created a strict prohibition against counting signatures as valid on the second set of nomination papers submitted. It is also instructive to note that even the earlier version of § 8.04 did not permit counting signatures as valid for <u>both</u> candidates involved.

Candidate Sullivan's response to the challenge argues that § 8,04 should be construed as directory because the Legislature has not "included an express and clear command," citing a 1981 decision of the Court of Appeals, *Matter of Hayden*, 105 Wis. 2d 468, 483, 313 N.W.2d 869 (Ct. App. 1981). In the Commission's opinion, however, § 8.04 itself is the "express and clear command." Rather than using the terms "shall" or "may," the statute plainly states that "the earlier paper *is* valid and the later paper *is* invalid." It leaves no room for the filing officer to guess as to whether the prohibition is mandatory or directory.

In addition, the first clause of Wis. Stat. § 8.04 invalidates signatures of individuals who have signed the nomination papers of another candidate for the same office at the same election. This is consistent with Wis. Stat. § 8.10(4)(b) which states that "[o]nly one signature per person for the same office is valid." Candidates would be hard pressed to argue that signatures of the same individual can be counted on nomination papers of two candidates, and yet that would be the logical result of treating the serial circulator provision of Wis. Stat. § 8,04 as directory.

Declining to enforce the prohibitions in Wis. Stat. § 8.04 would put other candidates that comply with the rules at a disadvantage. Also, if § 8.04 is construed as directory rather than

mandatory, applying the same logic to other procedural requirements would effectively eliminate all rules governing the nomination paper process. Such an interpretation would also eliminate any certainty regarding what, if any, rules apply to the circulation process and govern review by filing officers.

Ultimately, it is the candidate's responsibility to ensure that the nomination papers they file have the minimum number of required signatures. "Each candidate for public office has the responsibility to assure that his or her nomination papers are prepared circulated, signed and filed in compliance with statutory and other legal requirements." $EL \S 2.05(1)$, Wis. Adm. Code. The circulation period affords candidates the opportunity to screen their nomination papers and to proactively strike signatures that are invalid prior to filing. "After a nomination paper has been signed, but before it has been filed, a signature may be removed by the circulator. . .." $EL \S 2.05(16)$, Wis. Adm. Code.

A candidate who does not vet their nomination papers prior to filing assumes the risks and mistakes resulting from circulators who are unaware of or do not comply with the regulations governing the circulation of nomination papers. It is true that a violation of Wis. Stat. § 8.04 cannot be detected by simply reviewing the candidate's own nomination papers. But given the number of candidates circulating nomination papers for the Office of County Executive, the apparently common practice of relying on paid circulators rather than circulators who support a single candidacy, and the filing of nomination papers late in the circulation period, candidates are responsible for ensuring that procedural requirements such as § 8.04 are satisfied.

Noncompliance with the requirements of nomination paper circulation cannot be excused simply because circulators acted based upon their mistaken understanding of or disregard for the laws. Furthermore, the consistent evaluation of nomination papers by filing officers cannot be based upon the knowledge or expertise of individual circulators.

Conclusion

For the reasons stated above, the Wisconsin Elections Commission finds that the Milwaukee County Election Commission did not comply with the election laws when it accepted signatures on nomination papers for Candidate Jim Sullivan which were collected by circulators who had previously collected signatures for Candidate Crowley in violation of Wis. Stat. § 8.04. The Commission finds that § 8.04 is unambiguous and is to be construed as a mandatory regulation of the circulation process.

The Commission finds that 1,001 signatures submitted by Candidate Sullivan shall be stricken as invalid, resulting in a total of 1,449 valid signatures, which is less than the 2,000 valid signatures required to obtain ballot status.² The Commission orders that Jim Sullivan's name

² Based upon the record in the companion appeal regarding nomination papers of Candidate Bryan Kennedy, the actual number of invalid signatures may be greater because circulators collected signatures for both Candidate Kennedy and Candidate Sullivan, and the dates of circulation appear to overlap. The record does not reflect a calculation of these additional signatures by the complainant, Candidate Sullivan or the MCEC. The Commission's calculation of invalid signatures is therefore the minimum number that should be stricken.

shall not appear on the ballot for the Office of County Executive at the 2020 Spring Primary or Spring Election.

Right to Appeal – Circuit Court

This letter constitutes the Commission's resolution of this complaint. Wis. Stat. § 5.06(2). Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 5.06(8), any aggrieved party may appeal this decision to circuit court no later than 30 days after the issuance of this decision.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. §§ 5.05(1)(e) and 5.06(6), the Wisconsin Elections Commission ("Commission") is provided with the inherent, general, and specific authority to consider the submissions of parties to a complaint, and to issue findings and orders. Theodore Lipscomb, Sr. has filed a verified complaint with the Commission appealing the decision of the Milwaukee County Election Commission ("MCEC") to approve ballot access for Candidate Bryan Kennedy for the 2020 Spring Election as a candidate for County Executive. The Commission has reviewed the complaint and supporting documentation as well as the response of the MCEC filed by Milwaukee County Clerk George Christenson and Elections Director Julietta Henry. The Commission issues the following Decision and Order.

Procedural Background

Candidate Bryan Kennedy filed nomination papers for the Office of Milwaukee County Executive containing 2,939 signatures with the Milwaukee County Election Commission on January 6, 2020. Following a review of these signatures, MCEC staff determined that Candidate Kennedy had submitted 2,684 valid signatures, which exceeds the total of 2,000 valid signatures required to qualify for ballot access for the Office of Milwaukee County Executive.

On January 10, 2020, Theodore Lipscomb, Sr. filed a challenge to the nomination papers of Candidate Kennedy. The challenge asserted that 844 signatures should be struck as invalid because the circulators who collected those signatures had previously circulated nomination papers for another candidate for the same office, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 8.04.

Candidate Kennedy's response to the challenge argued that Wis. Stat. § 8.04's prohibition regarding the same circulator collecting signatures for multiple candidates is directory rather than mandatory, there was no evidence of fraud on the part of the circulator or Candidate Kennedy, and that counting the signatures as valid gives effect to the will of the electors as required by Wis. Stat. § 5.01(1).

Based on the complaint filed with the Commission as well as the challenge and response filed with the MCEC, the relevant facts are not in dispute. Following its review, MCEC staff determined that Candidate Kennedy had filed nomination papers containing 2,684 valid signatures and qualified for ballot status. Mr. Lipscomb challenged 844 of the 2,684 signatures. The basis of the challenge was that three individuals who circulated nomination papers for Candidate Kennedy (Alisha Pettis, Lesa Trotter, and Dominique Thomas) also circulated and submitted nomination papers for David Crowley, another candidate for Milwaukee County Executive. Striking the challenged signatures would disqualify Mr. Kennedy from having his name on the Spring Election ballot.

The three individuals first circulated nomination papers for Candidate Crowley and subsequently circulated nomination papers for Candidate Kennedy. Candidate Kennedy's response to the challenge stated that the three circulators were hired by Urban Media, which was retained by Kennedy's campaign to assist with the circulation of nomination papers. Candidate Kennedy asserts that he was assured by Urban Media that its employees would not circulate nomination papers for any other candidates for County Executive.

On January 14, 2020, the Milwaukee County Election Commission conducted a hearing regarding the challenge filed by Mr. Lipscomb, Sr. After considering arguments of both parties, the MCEC considered a motion to approve the challenge and strike 844 signatures. The motion failed on a vote of 1-1, with one member of the MCEC being absent. As a result, the decision of MCEC staff to approve Candidate Kennedy for ballot status stood.

On January 17, 2020, the Commission received a timely, verified complaint from Mr. Lipscomb, Sr. appealing the MCEC's decision. The complaint asserts that Wis. Stat. § 8.04 requires striking the 844 signatures which were challenged before the MCEC, and that the MCEC abused its discretion by determining that § 8.04 was discretionary and permitting Candidate Kennedy's name to be placed on the Spring Election ballot. The complaint requests that the Commission strike signatures collected in violation of § 8.04 and determine that Candidate Kennedy does not qualify for ballot access.

On January 17, 2020, MCEC staff submitted a letter in response to the complaint. The letter states that, in light of the MCEC's tie vote regarding the challenge to Candidate Kennedy's nomination papers, the MCEC's response is limited to submitting the filings of the parties and the record of the proceedings. The Commission also notes that, while Candidate Kennedy is not a party to the appeal, the Commission has reviewed and considered his response to Mr. Lipscomb's challenge that was filed with the MCEC as well as the arguments made at the MCEC's January 14, 2020 hearing.

Candidate Kennedy chose not to file a reply to the MCEC's response to the complaint.

The Commission's role in resolving verified complaints filed under Wis. Stat. § 5.06, which challenge the decisions or actions of local election officials, is determining whether a local official acted contrary to applicable election laws or abused their discretion in administering applicable election laws.

Commission Findings

The Commission makes the following findings:

Wis. Stat. § 8.04 states as follows:

Nomination paper signatures. If any person signs nomination papers for two candidates for the same office in the same election at different times, the earlier signature is valid, and the later signature is invalid. If any person circulates a nomination paper for two candidates for the same office in the same election at different times, the earlier paper is valid, and the later paper is invalid.

Emphasis added.

There is no dispute that three individuals circulated nomination papers for two candidates for the same office at the same election at different times. The affidavits of each of the circulators state that they first circulated nomination papers for Candidate Crowley and subsequently circulated nomination papers for Candidate Kennedy. Based upon the plain language of Wis. Stat. § 8.04, these circumstances appear to require that the earlier papers circulated for Candidate Crowley are valid, and the later papers circulated for Candidate Kennedy are invalid and the signatures on those pages should be struck as invalid.

In his response to the challenge filed with the MCEC, Candidate Kennedy argued that the circulators' actions constituted an "innocent error by a third-party vendor" for which Candidate Kennedy should not be penalized. Candidate Kennedy noted that he was assured by Urban Media that the circulators retained by it would not circulate nomination papers on behalf of any other candidate for Milwaukee County Executive. Candidate Kennedy's response to the challenge argued that Wis. Stat. § 8.04 should be construed as directory, not mandatory, and that counting the challenged signatures as valid would give effect to the will of the electors as required by Wis. Stat. § 5.01(1) which states as follows:

CONSTRUCTION OF CHS. 5 TO 12. Except as otherwise provided, chs. 5 to 12 shall be construed to give effect to the will of the electors, if that can be ascertained from the proceedings, notwithstanding informality or failure to fully comply with some of their provisions.

Candidate Kennedy cited several court decisions to attempt to support his assertion that Wis. Stat. § 8.04 should be construed as directory rather than mandatory and that counting the challenged signatures as valid would give effect to the will of the electors pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 5.01(1). The Commission concludes that the cases cited do not support this conclusion for several reasons.

Candidate Kennedy is correct that Wisconsin courts have long recognized that some election statutes should be construed as directory rather than mandatory, and that in such cases, the

term "shall" is construed to mean "may." For example, in 1867 the Wisconsin Supreme Court found that

the statutory regulations for conducting an election are directory and not jurisdictional in their character, the main object of such laws being to afford all persons entitled to vote an opportunity to exercise the elective franchise, to prevent illegal votes, and to ascertain with certainty the true number of votes cast, and for whom. *State ex rel. Bancroft v. Stumpf*, 21 Wis. 586 (1867).

In 1966, the Wisconsin Supreme Court summarized the effect of determining whether an election statute is mandatory or directory:

An act done in violation of a mandatory provision is void, whereas an act done in violation of a directory provision, while improper, may nevertheless be valid. Deviations from directory provisions of election statutes are usually termed "irregularities," and as has been shown in the preceding subdivision, such irregularities do not vitiate an election. *Gradinjan v. Boho*, 29 Wis. 2d 674, 682, 139 N.W.2d 557 (1966).

And in 1968, the Wisconsin Supreme Court described the type of election statutes which should be construed as directory instead of mandatory:

Statutes giving directions as to the mode and manner of conducting elections will be construed by the courts as directory, unless a noncompliance with their terms is expressly declared to be fatal, or will change or render doubtful the result, as where the statute merely provides that certain things shall be done in a given manner and time without declaring that conformity to such provisions is essential to the validity of the election. *Lanser v. Kaconis*, 62 Wis. 2d 86, 91, 214 N.W.2d 425 (1974).

Candidate Kennedy cited other court decisions which have construed election statutes as directory. In each case, however, the statute at issue involved the mode or manner of conducting an election, such as processing and counting ballots, not the requirements or procedures for circulating and completing nomination papers and qualifying for ballot access. In 1978, the Wisconsin Supreme Court held that the deadline for filing nomination papers and the place of filing are mandatory requirements, and failing to satisfy those requirements disqualified a judicial candidate from ballot access. *Ahlgrimm v. State Elections Bd.*, 82 Wis.2d 585, 263 N.W.2d 152 (1978). In *Ahlgrimm*, the Court noted that the statute regarding the place of filing was not ambiguous, and also stated:

We view the requirements of sec. 8.10(2), Stats., and sec. 8.10(6), Stats., as being reasonable regulations of the right to be a candidate for public office. These regulations governing the time and place of filing nomination papers must be strictly enforced in order to insure the orderly exercise of such right. . . Because the petitioner did not timely file with the State Elections Board his nomination papers for the office of circuit judge, his name cannot appear on the ballot. As

unfortunate and regrettable as this result might be, especially in this situation where there will be no candidate for circuit judge in the 21st Judicial Circuit on the ballot, nevertheless, the burden was on the petitioner to properly file. He did not do so. *Ahlgrimm*, 82 Wis. 2d at 597. (Citation omitted).

The Court of Appeals subsequently summarized how the "will of the electors" phrase in Wis. Stat. § 5.01(1) should be interpreted in determining whether an election statute is directory or mandatory:

However, our supreme court has interpreted this statute as applying only after an election has been held and the will of the electors manifested. See *State ex rel. Oaks v. For the reasons stated above, the Wisconsin Elections Commission finds that the Milwaukee County Election Commission did not comply with the election laws when it accepted signatures on nomination papers for Candidate Bryan Kennedy which were collected by circulators who had previously collected signatures for Candidate Crowley in violation of Wis. Stat. § 8.04. The Commission finds that § 8.04 is unambiguous and is to be construed as a mandatory regulation of the circulation process.

The Commission finds that 844 signatures submitted by Candidate Kennedy shall be stricken as invalid, resulting in a total of 1,840 valid signatures, which is less than the 2,000 valid signatures required to obtain ballot status. The Commission orders that Bryan Kennedy's name shall not appear on the ballot for the Office of County Executive at the 2020 Spring Primary or Spring Election.

VERIFIED RESPONSE OF PAUL MELOTIK IN OPPOSITION TO COMPLAINT OF MORGAN HESS

Introduction

Paul Melotik is the only Republican candidate for the July 18, 2023, Special Election for Representative to the 24th Assembly District (the "Election"), and hundreds of Wisconsinites are eager to vote for him in the Special Election. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 8.15(6)(d), the Melotik campaign filed nomination papers with the Wisconsin Election Commission containing 369 signatures—well over the 200 signatures the law requires. The Commission accepted all 369 of those signatures as valid. The complainant here, Morgan Hess, only alleges that a handful of the accepted signatures are invalid due to issues with the signatures themselves. Nor does she aver that

any of the signers were misled by information on the nomination form. Instead, she alleges the Challenged Papers omitted information from their (1) Header; (2) Signatory / Elector Certification, and/or (3) Circulator Certification that she claims should result in the invalidation of all of the signatures on the Challenged Papers. Complaint, ¶24. The Commission should deny the challenge and uphold the validity of the signatures against Hess's categorical challenges.

Background Facts

Paul Melotik, a Republican candidate for Wisconsin Assembly whose campaign is run through Melotik for State Assembly (the "Campaign"), is the only Republican candidate for the July 18, 2023 Special Election for Representative to the 24th Assembly District (See Melotik Aff. ¶1). In support of his candidacy for the State Assembly, Melotik circulated, executed as a circulator, and included with his total nomination papers 15 nomination forms, including page numbers 11, 12, 13, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 25, 33, 39, 41, and 43, for a total of 140 signatures. (See Melotik Aff. ¶2). In addition, Paul Marti circulated and executed as a circulator three nomination forms, including page numbers 16, 30, and 44, for a total of 30 signatures (see Marti Aff. ¶2) and Tom Grabow circulated and executed as a circulator 10 nomination forms, including page numbers 1-6, 8-10, and 36, for a total of 95 signatures (see Grabow Aff. ¶2).

Melotik submitted 44 pages of nomination forms to the Wisconsin Elections Commission ("WEC") on May 22, 2023 that included 369 total signatures, well above the minimum required of 200 signatures. (See Melotik Aff. ¶3; Ex. A to Complaint). The nomination forms were reviewed by WEC staff and found to be valid with no fatal flaws identified. (See Melotik Aff. ¶3.) That same day the WEC's nomination tracker was updated, indicating Melotik submitted 369 valid

signatures. *Id.* Therefore, there was no reason to believe there was a fatal flaw to any of the nomination papers such that additional signatures would have needed to be collected prior to the May 23, 2023 deadline to file at least 200 nomination signatures. *Id.*

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 8.15(4)(a), all three circulators stated their respective residence with street and number at the bottom of each nomination page, personally circulated their nomination papers and personally obtained each of the signatures, and knew (to the best of their knowledge) that each elector signing the nomination form was an elector of the district, that each elector signed the paper with full knowledge of its content, that each elector knew their respective residences given, and that each signer signed on the date stated opposite his or her name. (See Melotik Aff. ¶¶4-6; Marti and Grabow Affs. ¶¶3-5). As circulators, all are qualified electors of this state, having residences, respectively, in Grafton, Wisconsin (in addition, all three circulators are a U.S. citizen aged 18 or older who would not be disqualified from voting under Wis. Stat. § 6.03). (See Melotik ¶7 and Marti and Grabow Affs. ¶6).

Melotik intends on supporting himself in the July 18, 2023 Special Election for the District 24 Assembly District and Mari and Grabow intend on supporting him as well. (See Melotik ¶8 and Marti and Grabow Affs. ¶7).

Specifically with respect to the Circulator Certification, all three circulators were aware that falsifying the certifications is punishable under Wis. Stat. § 12.13(3)(a) and indicated the date that they made each certification next to their respective signatures on each nomination form. (See Melotik ¶¶9-10 and Marti and Grabow Affs. ¶¶8-9). When executing the Circulator Certification,

for each of the nomination forms they submitted, the three circulators were aware of and agreed to the terms of the Certification, which reads in full:

I further certify I am either a qualified elector of Wisconsin, or a U.S. citizen, age 18 or older who, if I were a resident of this state, would not be disqualified from voting under Wis. Stat. § 6.03. I personally circulated this nomination paper and personally obtained each of the signatures on this paper. I know that the signers are electors of the jurisdiction or district the candidate seeks to represent. I know that each person signed the paper with full knowledge of its content on the date indicated opposite his or her name. I know their respective residences given. I intend to support this candidate. I am aware that falsifying this certification is punishable under Wis. Stat. § 12.13(3)(a).

(See Melotik ¶11 and Marti and Grabow Affs. ¶10). None of the circulators falsified any information in respect to or fraudulently defaced or destroyed any of the nomination papers and did not file any nomination paper knowing any part of it was falsely made. (See Melotik ¶12 and Marti and Grabow Affs. ¶11). All three circulators have stated to the extent any individual letters or words were omitted from any of the Header, Signatory / Elector Certification, and/or Circulator Certification sections of a nomination form, it was simply the result of poor photo copying and creases in the nomination form. (See Melotik ¶13 and Marti and Grabow Affs. ¶12).

Argument

I. Applicable Legal Principles

This is a challenge to the sufficiency of Melotik's nomination papers brought pursuant to Wis. Adm. Code § EL 2.07. In such a challenge, "[t]he burden is on the challenger to establish any insufficiency," and the challenger must meet this burden via clear and convincing evidence. Wis. Adm. Code §§ EL 2.07(3)(a), 2.07(4). If the challenger does meet that burden, the burden

then shifts to the challenged candidate to establish the sufficiency of the challenged information via clear and convincing evidence. Wis. Adm. Code § EL 2.07(3)(a); 2.07(4).

With respect to nomination papers in particular, it is well-established that "[a]ny information which appears on a nomination paper is entitled to a presumption of validity," Wis. Admin. EL § 2.05(4). Further, "[w]here any required item of information on a nomination paper is incomplete, the filing officer shall accept the information as complete if there has been substantial compliance with the law." Wis. Adm. Code § EL 2.05(5). In keeping with this rule, the Commission has consistently taken the position that technical irregularities on the nomination form do not invalidate the signatures on that form. For example, at its June 10, 2022 meeting, the Commission unanimously voted to deny the challenge to Gubernatorial candidate Timothy Michels' signature pages. Similar to the case here, the complainant did not allege that any of the accepted signatures were invalid or that any of the signers were misled by information on the nomination form. Instead, the complaint alleged that one version of the nomination forms was "legally deficient" because the mailing address printed on that form did not include a specific municipality. One Commissioner commented she didn't think the complaint "rose to the level where we can argue that it's sufficient to keep someone off the ballot is my inclination on this. It's up to the voters." See https://www.wpr.org/wisconsin-elections-commission-unanimously-rejectschallenge-tim-michels-nominating-petitions.

Finally, as a general matter, election "statute[s] should be interpreted to enable [] people to vote" for their preferred candidate. *Sommerfeld v. Board of Canvassers of City of St. Francis*, 269 Wis. 299, 302, 69 N.W.2d 235, 237 (1955), *superseded by statute on other grounds as stated in*

Teigen v. WEC, 2002 WI 64, ¶80, 403 Wis. 2d 607, 976 N.W.2d 519. Sommerfeld explains that not all election "requirements" are mandatory. In particular, provisions merely "giving directions as to the mode and manner of conducting elections will be construed by the courts as directory, unless a noncompliance with their terms is expressly declared to be fatal, or will change or render doubtful the result." 269 Wis. at 303 (quoting 29 C.J.S. Election § 214 and emphasis added). "[A]n act done in violation of a directory provision, while improper, may nevertheless be valid." Id. A provision can be directory even when it uses words like "shall" that may appear to be mandatory. Id. at 303 ("We have held that the word 'shall' can be construed to mean 'may."").

II. Hess's Categorical Challenges Must Fail

Hess raises one or more of three distinct categorical challenges to entire pages of the nominating signatures submitted for Melotik. Specifically, Hess challenges pages 1-6, 8-13, 15-17, 19-25, 28-31, 34-41, and 44 of the nomination papers for alleged defects relating to (1) the Header; (2) the Signatory/Elector Certification; and (3) the Circulator Certification.

With respect to the Header Requirement, Wisconsin election law provides that "each candidate shall include his or her mailing address on the candidate's nomination papers." Wis. Stat. § 8.15(5)(b). Notably, however, the forms themselves have spaces for both the candidate's residential address and the candidate's mailing address, and only require that the mailing address be provided if it differs from the residential address. Otherwise, the forms contain several other spaces relating to the type of election, date of election, name of the candidate's party, title of the office, district, and name of the jurisdiction or district in which the candidate seeks office.

With respect to the Signatory/Elector Certification, Wisconsin law mandates that "[e]ach nomination paper shall have *substantially* the following words printed at the top" and sets forth the following:

I, the undersigned, request that the name of (insert candidate's last name plus first name, nickname or initial, and middle name, former legal surname, nickname or middle initial or initials if desired, but no other abbreviations or titles) residing at (insert candidate's street address) be placed on the ballot at the (general or special) election to be held on (date of election) as a candidate representing the (name of party) so that voters will have the opportunity to vote for (him or her) for the office of (name of office). I am eligible to vote in (name of jurisdiction or district in which candidate seeks office). I have not signed the nomination paper of any other candidate for the same office at this election.

Complaint, ¶27 (quoting Wis. Stat. 8.15(5)(a) (emphasis added)).

With respect to Circulator Certification, Wis. Stat. § 8.15(4)(a) does not set forth a prescribed form for the certification, but instead sets forth the relevant requirements that must be met:

The certification of a qualified circulator stating his or her residence with street and number, if any, shall appear at the bottom of each nomination paper, stating he or she personally circulated the nomination paper and personally obtained each of the signatures; he or she knows they are electors of the ward, aldermanic district, municipality or county, as the nomination papers require; he or she knows they signed the paper with full knowledge of its content; he or she knows their respective residences given; he or she knows each signer signed on the date stated opposite his or her name; and, that he or she, the circulator, is a qualified elector of this state, or if not a qualified elector of this state, is a U.S. citizen age 18 or older who, if he or she were a resident of this state, would not be disqualified from voting under s. 6.03; that he or she intends to support the candidate; and that he or she is aware that falsifying the certification is punishable under s. 12.13(3)(a). The circulator shall indicate the date that he or she makes the certification next to his or her signature. The certification may be made by the candidate or any qualified circulator.

Further, "[n]o signature on a nomination paper shall be counted unless the elector who circulated the nomination paper completes and signs the certificate of circulator and does so after, not before,

the paper is circulated. No signature may be counted when the residency of the circulator cannot be determined by the information given on the nomination paper." Wis. Adm. Code § EL 2.05(14).

A. Analysis of the Categorical Challenges

Hess identifies each of the challenged pages of nomination papers, the number of signatures on those pages, and the alleged defects in those pages in a chart on page 7 of her complaint, and attaches the challenged pages as separate exhibits to the complaint. As set forth below, Hess's challenges must fail with respect to a number of signatures that would more than suffice to allow Melotik to clear the 200-signature threshold.

As an initial matter, the complaint misstates and misapplies Wisconsin's legal standards when it suggests the relevant Header, Signatory/Elector Certification, and Circulator Certification requirements are mandatory, not directory. The Complaint cites a part of the WEC's Administrative Code that expressly provides that the absence of a page number will not invalidate the signatures on that page. The Complaint argues that the Code's failure to identify other defects that would not result in the invalidation of signatures means that other defects would invalidate the signatures on the page.

This argument is not consistent with the legal principles discussed above, which plainly favor ballot access and allow for substantial compliance to be enough unless otherwise expressly provided by law. Wis. Stat. § 5.01, for example, makes clear that the statutory provisions at issue "shall be construed to give effect to the will of the electors, if that can be ascertained from the proceedings, *notwithstanding informality or failure to fully comply with some of their provisions.*"

(emphasis added). And, Wis. Adm. Code § EL 2.05(5) allows the Commission to accept incomplete information so long as there has been substantial compliance.

Indeed, contrary to the Complaint's suggestion that the relevant statutes and codes must expressly state that a defect will not invalidate the nomination papers in order for the nomination papers to survive, the rule is actually the contrary. It is the presence of an express declaration in statute or administrative code that a defect will result in the invalidation of the relevant paperwork that would lead to treating a requirement as mandatory. See Sommerfeld, 269 Wis. at 303 (quoting 29 C.J.S. Election § 214). Here, such a statement only exists with respect to the requirement that "the elector who circulated the nomination paper completes and signs the certificate of circulator and does so after, not before, the paper is circulated" and that "[n]o signature may be counted when the residency of the circulator cannot be determined by the information given on the nomination paper." Wis. Adm. Code § EL 2.05(14). As relevant here, however, the law does not provide that signatures cannot be counted just because the certificate of the circulator—although signed appropriately, with the required residency information—has certain letters or characters obscured due to copying or creasing issues.

On this point, the Complaint's reliance on the Decision and Order in *Lipscomb v. Sullivan* (see Exhibit K to Complaint) is wholly misplaced. There, Lipscomb filed a specific and unique challenge to the nomination papers of Sullivan, arguing that 1,001 of Sullivan's signatures should be struck as invalid because the circulators who collected those signatures had previously circulated nomination papers for another candidate for the same office, David Crowley, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 8.04. See Exhibit K at 1. Sullivan focused on the distinction between

directory and mandatory prohibitions. *Id.* at 2. In determining that the prohibition on a serial circulation of nomination papers in Wis. Stat. 8.04 did not fit the category of a directory statute, the Commission found it was "not related to the actual conduct of an election, the exercise of the right to vote, or the interpretation of a vote on a ballot. Rather, it is a regulation regarding the *conduct* of nomination paper circulators." *Id.* at 5 (emphasis added). In addition, the Commission found that "because 8.04 governs the *process* of circulating nomination papers and not the content of the papers, the challenged signatures cannot be counted as valid by virtue of EL § 2.05(5), Wis. Adm. Code." *Id.* Recall, there the Code states that "[w]here any required item of information on a nomination paper is incomplete, the filing officer shall accept the information as complete if there has been substantial compliance with the law." In the present Complaint before the Commission, there is simply no allegation that the circulators supportive of Melotik incorrectly circulated the nomination forms or otherwise committed a "process" error. Instead, the Complaint focuses on individual letters and words missing from the certification. The present complaint involves content, not conduct, and thus EL § 2.05(5) applies.

Further, with respect to substantial compliance, one of the very cases cited in the Complaint supports a denial of the allegations here. The court in *Matter of Recall of Redner*, 153 Wis. 2d 383, 391, 450 N.W.2d 808, 811 (Ct. App. 1989) indeed emphasized that "[s]ubstantial compliance requires the petitions be circulated in a manner that protects against fraud and that assures the signers knew the contents of the petitions." *Id.* at 391. However, the Court ultimately held that the recall petitions were sufficient to allege "cause" for recall. Among other arguments, the complainant argued the header "RECALL PETITION" and the affidavit of circulation must be on

one page. *Id.* at 392. The Court found that the requirement was directory and that the complainant "fails to convince us that any defect rose to the level where it facilitated misrepresentation or that the trial court erred when it found substantial compliance." *Id.* In addition, similar to the claims here, the complainant alleged the affidavits of the electors did not properly allege personal knowledge as required by Wis. Stat. § 8.15(4)(a). The basic complaint was that the circulators stated, for example, "that each of the signers is a qualified elector within the City of Hudson," rather than *I know* "that each of the signers is a qualified elector within the City of Hudson." *Id.* at 393. The Court noted that the trial court found that this form substantially complied with the statutory requirements and did "not find an abuse of discretion in failing to issue a writ on these grounds." *Id.* Overall, the Court found the following:

"Chapters 5 to 12 shall give effect to the will of the electors, if that can be ascertained from the proceedings, notwithstanding informality or failure to fully comply with some of its provisions." Stahovic v. Rajchel, 122 Wis.2d 370, 376, 363 N.W.2d 243, 246 (Ct.App.1984). The petitions are not free of error. However, no one seriously disputes that, at least as of six months ago, a sufficient number of electors wished to vote on Mayor Redner's recall. Redner has not met his heavy burden of showing that a writ should issue and that the trial court abused its discretion by failing to issue a writ.

Id. at 395.

1. Hess's categorical challenge to Exhibit B (88 signatures) must fail.

With respect to Exhibit B, Hess seeks to invalidate 88 signatures from Pages 1-6 and 8-10 of the nominating papers, based on alleged defects to the Signatory/Elector Certification and the Circulator Certification. No such invalidating defects exist.

First, with respect to the Signatory/Elector Certification, the pages in Exhibit B appear to be missing the "I" in line one, the letter "s" in the "statement" in line two, and the letter "c" in the word "candidate" in line three. Complaint, Ex. B. Any reasonable reader reviewing the Signatory/Elector Certification on the pages in Exhibit B would understand the import of what the elector was seeking to do by signing the nomination paper and none of the omissions materially affect the substance of certification. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(5)(a) does not require that each nomination paper use the provided example of a signatory/elector certification verbatim and to the letter, but only requires that each nomination paper "shall have substantially the following words." The Signatory/Elector Certification on the pages in Exhibit B has "substantially" the words provided by statute, even with the omitted letters, and at minimum substantial compliance with the signatory/elector certification has occurred. Hess's challenge based on this requirement must fail.

Second, with respect to the Circulator Certification, the pages on Exhibit B appear to be missing the "I" and the letter "f" in the word "further" in line one, the letters "ci" in the word "circulated" in line two, the letters "th" in the word "that" in line three (and only missing a part of the letter "h"), and the letter "a" in the word "aware" in line four. Again, the omission of these letters does not alter the substance of the document and a reasonable reader would understand the substance of the certification, as indicated by the fact that the Commission originally accepted these signatures as valid. Each piece of information required by Wis. Stat. § 8.15(4)(a) is included in the certification. At minimum, substantial compliance with Wis. Stat. § 8.15(4)(a) has been established. And, because it contains the residency of the circulator and is signed and dated after

it was circulated, the mandatory requirements associated with this certification have also been established.

For the above reasons, the categorical challenge to Exhibit B (88 signatures) must fail.

2. Hess's categorical challenge to Exhibit C (37 signatures) must fail.

With respect to Exhibit C, Hess seeks to invalidate 37 signatures, from pages 13, 20, and 25 based on alleged defects to the Header, the Signatory/Elector Certification and the Circulator Certification. No such invalidating defects exist.

For Pages 13 and 20 of Exhibit C, the nomination papers contain all of the required information. The only defects are the omission of certain characters and/or words from the Header, the Signatory/Elector Certification and/or the Circulator Certification, but none of these omissions materially affect the meaning of the certifications or the header. Additionally, although Page 20 has obscured material in the "mailing address" and "zip code" spaces in the header, neither of those spaces were required. The mailing address space only needed to be filled out if it differed from the candidate's residential address (which it did not) and the zip code box is not identified as a required piece of information. These pages fully comply with the relevant requirements. At minimum, there is substantial compliance. The categorical challenge to the 19 signatures on these two pages should fail.

For Page 12 of Exhibit C, the same arguments regarding the omission of certain characters and/or words applies, except that this page does have, fully obscured, the required selection of whether it is a special or a general election. With respect to this issue, this is plainly the type of technical noncompliance that should not result in the invalidation of the 8 signatures on this page,

especially since there is no suggestion that the signatures were improperly gathered or that electors were misled as to the date of the upcoming election. The Commission should find substantial compliance with respect to this page.

Finally, for Page 25 of Exhibit C, the same arguments apply except this page also obscures the "3" from the "2023" in the date of the circulator's certification, the inclusion of that character is not necessary to conclude from the context of the nominating paper that it was certified after the signatures were gathered and the challenge to the 10 signatures on this page should fail. The Commission should find substantial compliance with respect to this page.

3. Hess's categorical challenge to Exhibit D (34 signatures) must fail.

With respect to Exhibit D, Hess seeks to invalidate 34 signatures from pages 11, 21, 23, and 41 of the nomination papers, based on alleged defects in the Header and/or the Signatory/Elector Certification. This challenge must fail. Again, the only alleged defects here are the omission of certain characters from certain entries in the Header and from the words in the Signatory/Elector Certification. None of the omissions in this exhibit would prevent a reasonable reader from understanding the substance of the entries or the certification, as indicated by the fact that the Commission originally accepted these signatures as valid. With respect to the Header, each piece of required information can ultimately be deciphered and, regardless, strict compliance is not necessary and substantial compliance has occurred. With respect to the Signatory/Elector Certification, again although certain characters are obscured, the full substance of the Signatory/Elector Certification would be understood by a reasonable reader and the relevant statute does not demand a letter for letter recital of the sample certification provided in the statute. See

Wis. Stat. § 8.15(5)(a) ("Each nomination paper shall have *substantially* the following words . . . " (emphasis added)). The Signatory/Elector Certification fully complies with the statutory requirements. At minimum, there is substantial compliance. The categorical challenge to the 34 signatures in Exhibit D must fail.

4. Hess's categorical challenge to Exhibit E (33 signatures) must fail.

With respect to Exhibit E, Hess seeks to invalidate 33 signatures from Pages 15, 24, 36, and 38 of the nomination papers based on alleged defects in the Header and/or the Signatory/Elector Certification. This challenge must fail.

First, with respect to the 10 signatures contained on Page No. 15 within Exhibit E, all that has occurred is the obscuring or omission of certain characters or words in the Header and Signatory/Elector Certification, but the substance of these sections would be understood by a reasonable reader and has not been materially affected, as indicated by the fact that the Commission originally accepted these signatures as valid. With respect to the Signatory/Elector Certification in particular, the relevant statute does not demand a letter for letter recital of the sample certification provided in the statute. *See* Wis. Stat. § 8.15(5)(a) ("Each nomination paper shall have *substantially* the following words" (emphasis added)). The Header and Signatory/Elector Certification on Page No. 15 fully comply with the statutory requirements. At minimum, there is substantial compliance.

The challenge to the 23 signatures contained in Pages 24, 36, and 38 of Exhibit E should be rejected for the same reasons. These pages also do include some handwriting filling in some of the missing information, but no evidence has been presented as to when the handwriting was

added. Under these circumstances, there is no clear and convincing evidence that the forms were missing required information at the time they were circulated.

5. Hess's categorical challenge to Exhibit F (29 signatures) must fail.

With respect to Exhibit F, Hess seeks to invalidate 29 signatures from Pages 16, 30, and 44 of the nomination papers, based on alleged defects to the Header, the Signatory/Elector Certification and the Circulator Certification. This challenge must fail. With respect to Pages 30 and 44 of Exhibit F, Hess's objections are the same as with other exhibits—there are characters obscured in the Header, the Signatory/Elector Certification, and/or the Circulator Certification. As already discussed, the obscuring of these characters does not materially impact the meaning of the nomination papers and they would be understood by a reasonable reader, as indicated by the fact that the Commission originally accepted these signatures as valid. Pages 30 and 44 are in full compliance with the relevant requirements and, at minimum, there has been substantial compliance. The challenge to the 19 signatures represented by these pages must fail.

With respect to the 10 signatures on Page 16 of Exhibit F, the same arguments apply except here the day of the election in the "General Election Date" space is fully obscured. Nonetheless, this is the type of technical issue that should not result in the invalidation of the 10 signatures on this page, especially since there is no suggestion that the signatures were improperly gathered or that electors were misled as to the date of the upcoming election. The Commission should find substantial compliance with respect to this page.

6. Hess's categorical challenge to Exhibit G (25 signatures) must fail.

With respect to Exhibit G, Hess seeks to invalidate 25 signatures from Pages 17, 19, and 39, based on alleged defects in the Signatory/Elector Certification. Again, all that has occurred here is that certain characters are obscured, but the full substance of the Signatory/Elector Certification would be understood by a reasonable reader and the relevant statute does not demand a letter for letter recital of the sample certification provided in the statute, as indicated by the fact that the Commission originally accepted these signatures as valid. *See* Wis. Stat. § 8.15(5)(a) ("Each nomination paper shall have *substantially* the following words" (emphasis added)). The Signatory/Elector Certification fully complies with the statutory requirements. At minimum, there is substantial compliance. The categorical challenge to the 25 signatures in Exhibit G must fail.

7. Hess's categorical challenge to Exhibit H (17 signatures) must fail.

With respect to Exhibit H, Hess seeks to invalidate 17 signatures from pages 28, 31, and 35 of the nomination papers, based on alleged defects in the Signatory/Elector Certification. Again, all that has occurred here is that certain characters are obscured, but the full substance of the Signatory/Elector Certification would be understood by a reasonable reader and the relevant statute does not demand a letter for letter recital of the sample certification provided in the statute, as indicated by the fact that the Commission originally accepted these signatures as valid. *See* Wis. Stat. § 8.15(5)(a) ("Each nomination paper shall have *substantially* the following words" (emphasis added)). The Signatory/Elector Certification fully complies with the statutory

requirements. At minimum, there is substantial compliance. The categorical challenge to the 17 signatures in Exhibit H must fail.

8. Hess's categorical challenge to Exhibit I (16 signatures) must fail.

With respect to Exhibit I, Hess seeks to invalidate 16 signatures from Pages 29, 34, and 40 based on alleged "Various" defects. Hess makes no attempt to explain what specific defects she claims exist with respect to these signatures, but presumably she takes issue with the fact that certain characters are obscured in the headers and elector certifications on the pages in this exhibit. Again, however, a reasonable reader would understand the substance of the headers and the elector certifications, as indicated by the fact that the Commission originally accepted these signatures as valid. The headers and the elector certifications contain the required information, even if certain characters are obscured. At minimum, substantial compliance has occurred and the categorical challenge to the 16 signatures must fail.

9. Hess's categorical challenge to Exhibit J (8 signatures) must fail.

With respect to Exhibit J, Hess seeks to invalidate 8 signatures from Page No. 37 of the nominating papers, based on alleged defects to the Header. The Header for the single page contained in this exhibit appears to contain all required information, however, and it is unclear the basis for the challenge. Hess may be basing her challenge on the fact that the election date provided appears to contain some handwriting to fill in the date, but she provides no evidence as to when this handwriting was applied or provide any explanation for why a violation has occurred with respect to his form. The challenge to the 8 signatures in Exhibit J must fail.

III. Only 20 Of The Complaint's 34 Remaining Challenges To Individual Signatures Have Any Basis In Law.

As to the remaining challenges to individual signatures, the Wisconsin Statutes and Administrative Code lay out in detail the basis for any challenge. First, a signatory must reside in the jurisdiction or district which the candidate named on the paper will represent if elected. See Wis. Stat. § 8.15(3). Next, "[i]n addition to his or her signature, in order for the signature to be valid, each signer of a nomination paper shall legibly print his or her name in a space provided next to his or her signature and shall list his or her municipality of residence for voting purposes, the street and number, if any, on which the signer resides, and the date of signing." Wis. Stat. § 8.15(2). Finally, the Administrative Code details five very specific bases for a challenge to an individual signature. An individual signature on a nomination paper may not be counted when any of the following occur: "(a) The date of the signature is missing, unless the date can be determined by reference to the dates of other signatures on the paper. (b) The signature is dated after the date of certification contained in the certificate of circulator. (c) The address of the signer is missing or incomplete, unless residency can be determined by the information provided on the nomination paper. (d) The signature is that of an individual who is not 18 years of age at the time the paper is signed. An individual who will not be 18 years of age until the subject election is not eligible to sign a nomination paper for that election. (e) The signature is that of an individual who has been adjudicated not to be a qualified elector on the grounds of incompetency or limited competency as provided in s. 6.03 (3), Stats., or is that of an individual who was not, for any other reason, a qualified elector at the time of signing the nomination paper." Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(15)(a)-(e).

The complaint focuses on the following four alleged defects: a. Fifteen (15) signatories listed addresses that lie outside of Assembly District 24. b. Seven (7) signatories have illegible names or addresses. c. Five (5) signatories list addresses that do not exist. d. In seven (7) instances, a circulator purported to certify their own signature. Complaint, ¶49.1

With respect to "illegible names or addresses," other than listing the WEC Page, signature line, name, and challenge type, the complaint offers no additional support for the allegation that the names or addresses are "illegible." With respect to complaints, "[t]he burden is on the challenger to establish any insufficiency." Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.07(3)(a). Even if the Commission were to determine a piece of information or a single letter were "illegible," the Code is clear that "[w]here any required item of information on a nomination paper is incomplete, the filing officer shall accept the information as complete if there has been substantial compliance with the law." Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(5). Here, without any evidence to the contrary offered by the Complaint, there has been substantial compliance with the law. The Commission should treat the following signatures, which Hess challenges as illegible, as valid:

Next, with respect to the argument that a circulator cannot certify his or her own signature, this argument is baseless. The Complaint argues that a circulator cannot certify his or her own signature on a nomination paper "consistent with the bedrock principle that 'no man can be a judge in his own case." Complaint, ¶48 (citing Guthrie v. Wis. Emp. Rels. Comm'n, 111 Wis. 2d 447, 456, 331 N.W.2d 331 (1983)). It further argues if a circulator could do so it would render the certification "wholly illusory and defeat the intent of the certification," analogizing along the way to a process for notarizing documents and guidance provided by the Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions. *Id.* But that is not the correct statutory analysis and wholly inconsistent with the statutory framework directly on point.

In Wisconsin, statutory interpretation follows the clearly detailed path enunciated in *State ex rel. Kalal v. Circuit Court*. 2004 WI 58, 271 Wis. 2d 633, 681 N.W.2d 110. In *Kalal*, the Court held the purpose of statutory interpretation is to "determine what the statute means so that it may be given its full, proper, and intended effect." *Id.* at ¶44. Statutory interpretation begins with the language of the statute and statutory language is "given its common, ordinary, and accepted meaning," unless there are technical or specially-defined words or phrases. *Id.* at ¶45. If the statutory language yields a "plain, clear statutory meaning, then there is no ambiguity," and there is no need to consult extrinsic sources of interpretation. *Id.* at ¶46. Applying this standard, the

key terms or phrases in the relevant statutory provisions appear unambiguous and are not "technical" in nature. Because of this, there is simply no need to consult extrinsic sources such as irrelevant case law or Department of Financial Institutions guidance. Instead, the Commission should focus on the statutory guidance related to the circulation of nomination forms.

In unambiguous and clear language it is declared that "[t]he certification may be made by the candidate or any qualified circulator." Wis. Stat. § 8.15(4)(a). When the Legislature included the language allowing for the candidate or any qualified circulator to make the certification, it did not exclude a circulator who him or herself had also signed the nomination form. This comports with the Administrative Code directly on point. As explained above, Wisconsin Administrative Code § EL 2.05(15)(a)-(e) lays out in clear terms the five scenarios in which an individual signature on an a nomination paper may not be counted, including a missing signature date, the signature being dated after the date of certification, the address of the signer is missing or incomplete, the signer is not 18 years old, and the signature is that of an individual who has been adjudicated not to be a qualified elector. None of the proscriptions include a prohibition on the circulator him or herself from certifying their own signature. The Commission should treat the following signatures, which Hess challenges as invalid because certified by the same individual, as valid:

IV. The Commission May Exercise Its Discretion to Allow Ballot Access.

Even if the Commission believes that material errors exist with respect to Melotik's nomination papers, the Commission can and should exercise its discretion to keep Melotik on the ballot. Wis. Stat. § 8.30(1)(a) provides that the Commission "may refuse to place the candidate's name on the ballot if . . . [t]he nomination papers are not prepared, signed, and executed as required." *In re Guardianship and Protective Placement of Catherine P.*, 2006 WI App 105, ¶ 72, 294 Wis. 2d 637, 671, 718 N.W.2d 205, 222 ("We generally construe the word 'may' in a statute as allowing for the exercise of discretion." (citing *Rotfeld v. Wis. Dep't of Nat. Res.*, 147 Wis.2d 720, 726, 434 N.W.2d 617 (Ct. App. 1988))). So even if the Complaint is correct, the Commission still has discretion to put Melotik on the ballot. There are good reasons for such an exercise of discretion here.

It is well-established that laws that affect candidates always also affect voters and "[t]he impact of candidate eligibility requirements on voters implicates basic constitutional rights" under the First and Fourteenth Amendments. *Anderson v. Celebrezze*, 460 U.S. 780, 786 (1983). For example, the Supreme Court has acknowledged that ballot access laws implicate "the right of individuals to associate for the advancement of political beliefs, and the right of qualified voters,

regardless of their political persuasion, to cast their votes effectively." *Williams v. Rhodes*, 393 U.S. 23, 30–31 (1968). "Both of these rights, of course, rank among our most precious freedoms." *Id.* at 30; *see also Wagner v. Milwaukee Cnty. Election Comm'n*, 2003 WI 103, ¶ 76, 263 Wis. 2d 709 ("These types of cases often raise issues related to the First Amendment, due process, and equal protection under the law.")

Here, preventing Melotik from appearing on the ballot would not serve any of the State's legitimate regulatory interests and would deprive hundreds of Wisconsinites of their right to vote for their preferred candidate. With the exception of the thirty-four signatures for which Hess individually challenges their validity, there is no indication that any of the signatures that Hess seeks to invalidate for categorical reasons are not otherwise valid signatures from those eager to support Melotik. Ousting Melotik from the ballot simply because the forms used to collect those signatures, due to copying or creasing issues, omitted single characters or words in the Header, Signatory / Elector Certification, and Circulator Certification sections—without materially impacting the substance of those sections—would unreasonably impair the right of voters to associate and restricts the voters' opportunity to cast a ballot for the candidate of their choice. This would be especially true when, as here, Melotik is the *only* Republican candidate to have secured the minimum number of signatures for placement on the Special Election ballot. Were the Commission to deny Melotik ballot access, the Commission would be denying at least one half of the voters of the 24th Assembly District the option of voting for a candidate in the General Election that aligns with their political beliefs. Therefore, even if the Commission deemed Melotik's

challenged nomination forms invalid, it should exercise its discretion and allow Melotik on the ballot for the July 18, 2023 Special Election.

Conclusion

The Commission originally accepted all 369 of the signatures on the nominating petitions as valid. The Complaint seeks to invalidate wholesale entire pages of these signatures based on the minor obscuring of letters and numbers from the relevant paperwork due to copying issues or the creasing of the papers. The vast majority of these issues do not materially impact the meaning of the headers and relevant certifications, however, and even when it does there is a basis for a finding of substantial compliance. For the foregoing reasons, the Commission should reject Hess's Complaint and include Melotik on the ballot for the July 18, 2023 Special Election.
