Introduction

The Wisconsin Elections Commission ("the Commission") accepted nomination papers from April 15 to June 3 for the 2024 Partisan Primary, as well as for a special election to fill a partial term in Congressional District 8. Candidates also filed nomination papers for a special election to fill a partial term in Wisconsin Senate District 4.

The Commission received 12 ballot access challenges by the deadline of 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 6, 2024.

Wisconsin Statute 8.07 states that "the commission shall promulgate rules under this chapter for use by election officials in determining the validity of nomination papers and signatures thereon." The Commission has carried out this duty within Wis. Admin. Code Chapter EL 2. For partisan elections, all nomination papers must comply with Wis. Stat. s. 8.15, and all declarations of candidacy must comply with Wis. Stat. s. 8.21. Each challenge below is evaluated under Wis. Stat. s. 8.15 using the standards of Wis. Admin. Code EL 2, and a recommendation to approve signatures is a recommendation that the signature complies with the requirements of Wis. Stat. s. 8.15. A recommendation to approve ballot access is a recommendation that enough valid signatures were submitted for the office under Wis. Stat. s. 8.15(3).

The most common challenges fall under Wis. Stats. ss. 8.15(2)&(3) regarding the validity of individual signatures, 8.15(4)(a) regarding the certification of the circulator, and 8.15(5)(a)&(b) regarding the header of a nomination paper.

Challenges to the sufficiency of nomination papers are brought pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code EL s. 2.07(2)(a). The Commission applies the standards in EL s. 2.05 to determine sufficiency. Wis. Admin. Code EL s. 2.07(1). Any information which appears on a nomination paper is entitled to a presumption of validity. Wis. Admin. Code EL s. 2.05(4). Where any required item of information on a nomination paper is incomplete, the Commission will accept the information as complete if there has been substantial compliance with the law. Wis. Admin. Code EL s. 2.05(5). The burden of proof applicable to establishing or rebutting a challenge is clear and convincing evidence. Wis. Admin. Code EL s. 2.07(4).

Explanation of Materials

This memo provides staff analysis and recommendations for all 12 ballot access challenges. Each challenge has its own section, which is intended to be read alongside the materials provided in the corresponding appendices as well as alongside the staff analysis spreadsheets. Each Appendix includes a copies of the challenge, response, and any rebuttals received by Sunday, June 9. Nine of the challenges also include Excel worksheets to track the various signature challenges. These Excel sheets are being provided in addition to the appendices and this memo. There is no spreadsheet for EL 24-62 – Purnima Nath v. Tim Rogers (CD-04), as that challenge is to the candidate's Declaration of Candidacy only. There is also no spreadsheet for EL 24-57 – LaKeshia Myers v. Dora Drake (SD4 – General) because the challenge was to entire pages only and did not require staff review. There is also no spreadsheet for EL 24-61 – Trevor Ford v. David Heffel (AD70) because the challenge relates a dispute over Candidate Heffel's correct municipality for voting purposes and did not require staff review.

Due to time constraints, staff reviewed responses to the extent they addressed any individual challenge staff initially marked "burden met." In these instances, staff evaluated whether or not the response overcame the argument put forth in the challenge and shifted the burden back to the challenger. If staff did not recommend that the initial burden had been met for a challenge, no burden was placed on the candidate, and staff did not review responses for additional arguments in favor of a signature's validity. If the Commission disagrees with the staff recommendation, any response can be reviewed and decided during the meeting.

I.EL 24-53 – Ann Stevning-Roe v. Elsa Duranceau (CD-07)

Challenger Name: Ann Stevning-Roe **Candidate Name**: Elsa Duranceau

Office Sought: U.S. Representative for Congressional District 7

Signatures Required: 1,000 - 2,000

Signatures Filed (After Facial Review): 1,020

Signatures Challenged: 464

Supplemental Signatures: None Filed

Correcting Affidavits: Yes

Final Staff Recommendation: 1,004

Commission staff initially verified that Candidate Duranceau had 1,005 signatures. Two correcting affidavits added 19 signatures back to Candidate Duranceau's petition. In reviewing the preliminary claim of Challenger Stevning-Roe that these initial totals were incorrect, staff have found that the correct initial total was actually 1,001. Accordingly, Candidate Duranceau should have had 1,020 signatures verified.

Challenger Stevning-Roe additionally brings 50 full-page challenges and 54 line challenges to 464 signatures, alleging these signatures are insufficient:

On June 8, 2024, Candidate Duranceau submitted a verified response responding to each challenge raised in the chart above, and also submitted a verified correcting affidavit from one of her circulators to attempt to rehabilitate 6 signatures.

Candidate Municipal Residence Inconsistencies

Challenger Stevning-Roe's first challenge alleges that 46 pages of nomination papers (consisting of 446 signatures) are invalid because Candidate Duranceau provided a different municipality (Merrill) in her circulator address than she did in the header of her papers (Pine River). Candidate Duranceau cites page 4 of the Commission's Common Nomination Papers Manual to refute this challenge, arguing that missing information in the circulator's address has been found substantially compliant if the missing information is supplied by reference to other information on the same page.

On her Declaration of Candidacy, Candidate Duranceau provided her present address as: W3478 County Line Road, Merril, WI 54452, and also indicated that her municipality of residence for voting is Pine River.

Commission staff have confirmed that Candidate Duranceau's municipality for voting purposes is the Village of Pine River, not Merrill. A municipality for residence, a municipality for mailing purposes, and a municipality for voting purposes are not always the same. In the circulator certification, Candidate Duranceau correctly provided her residential address, which is in Merrill. In the header of her nomination paper, Candidate Duranceau correctly provided her municipality for voting purposes, which is Pine River.

Accordingly, Challenger Stevning-Roe has not met the burden of clear and convincing evidence to demonstrate that Candidate Duranceau's residence is not in Merrill, and that her municipality for voting purposes is not in Pine River.

Signatories Outside CD-07

Staff determined that Challenger Stevning-Roe met the burden of proof to show that 6 signatures are outside of CD-07: Page 93, Line 10; Page 17, Line 6; Page 17, Line 10; Page 116, Line 7; Page 112, Line 5; and Page 113, Line 7.

Neither Candidate Duranceau's response nor the correcting affidavit of Emily Phillips attempt to refute these challenges.

Staff accordingly recommend that **6 signatures be struck** from Candidate Duranceau's verified total of 1,020 valid signatures.

Circulators Circulating for More than One Candidate

Staff determined that Challenger Stevning-Roe met the burden of proof to show that 6 signatures were collected by circulators who had previously circulated petitions for other candidates for the same office: Page 50, Line 1; Page 50, Line 2; Page 53, Line 1; Page 52, Line 2; Page 66, Line 1; and Page 66, Line 2.

Neither Candidate Duranceau's response nor the correcting affidavit of Emily Phillips attempt to refute these challenges.

Staff accordingly recommend that **6 signatures be struck** from Candidate Duranceau's verified total of 1,020 valid signatures.

Circulator Certificate Errors – Missing Signature

Staff determined that Challenger Stevning-Roe met the burden of proof to show that the signature of the circulator is missing on page 85. In her response, Candidate Duranceau affirms she was the circulator of Page 85, and that she inadvertently failed to sign on the signature line. Staff note that it appears as if Candidate Duranceau did provide her signature in the "name of candidate" field of the circulator certification. While Commission staff cannot rely on her correcting affidavit as it was received after the filing deadline, the fact that she included her signature on the circulator certificate in the first instance renders the page substantially compliant.

Illegible Signatory Addresses

Staff determined that Challenger Stevning-Roe met the burden of proof to show that 1 signature line contained illegible addresses: Page 112, Line 7. Candidate Duranceau does not refute that this signature is illegible in her response.

Staff determined that Challenger Stevning-Roe did **not** meet the burden to show that 3 signature lines contained illegible addresses: Page 107, Line 1; Page 30, Line 9; and Page 43, Line 8. Candidate Duranceau argues the same in her response.

Staff accordingly recommend that **1 signature be struck** from Candidate Duranceau's verified total of 1,020 valid signatures.

Addresses Not Valid for Voting Purposes

Challenger Stevning-Roe argues that some signatories provided municipalities that are "not valid voting municipalities." It is often unclear what exactly Challenger Stevning-Roe is challenging with respect to some lines in this section. Candidate Duranceau asserts in her response that the addresses for each of these signatories are sufficient. Based on screenshots, it appears as if Challenger Stevning-Roe is arguing that because MyVote shows a polling place in a different municipality from the signatories' residence, the signatories' addresses are somehow not valid.

Staff determined that Challenger Stevning-Roe has **not** met the burden of showing that the following signature lines contain addresses that are not voting municipalities, or that they are outside CD-07, or that they are invalid for any other reason: Page 5, Line 6; Page 102, Line 8; Page 5, Line 1; Page 105, Line 7; Page 110, Line 2; Page 110, Line 9; Page 108, Line 6; Page 108, Line 7; Page 108, Line 10; Page 111, Line 2; Page 114, Line 7; Page 3, Line 3; Page 26, Line 3; Page 26, Line 4; Page 29, Line 8; Page 30, Line 5; Page 30, Line 7; and Page 42, Line 7.

Missing Date of Elector Signature

Staff determined that while Challenger Stevning-Roe is correct that Page 71, Line 8 is missing the elector's date of signature, Commission guidance directs that a missing date is nevertheless substantially compliant when it is bracketed above and below by the same date such that the missing date can be inferred. Candidate Duranceau argues the same in her response.

Invalid/Nonexistent Addresses

Challenger Stevning-Roe alleges that a series of addresses are not valid and/or nonexistent because they do not return results in the Commission's MyVote website. Staff will note that only registered voters will return MyVote results. A voter does not need to be registered to sign nomination papers, they just need to be an eligible elector.

Staff determined that Challenger Stevning-Roe has met the burden of showing that the following signature lines contain addresses that are invalid or don't exist: Page 18, Line 10; Page 24, Line 10; and Page 31, Line 5. Candidate Duranceau attempts to rehabilitate these three lines by offering additional, different address information than what was provided by the signatories. However, EL s. 2.05(4) explicitly states that correcting affidavits must be filed "not later than three calendar days after the applicable statutory due date for the nomination papers." Candidate Duranceau's response, including the correcting affidavit of Emily Phillips, was not received until June 8, well after the correcting affidavit deadline on June 6.

Staff determined that Challenger Stevning-Roe has **not** met the burden of showing that the following signature lines contain addresses that are invalid or don't exist: Page 3, Line 9; Page 3, Line 10; Page 14, Line 8; Page 18, Line 1; Page 18, Line 2; Page 18, Line 3; and Page 46, Line 2.

Staff accordingly recommend that **3 signatures be struck** from Candidate Duranceau's verified total of 1,020 valid signatures.

Recommended Motion:

The Commission sustains 16 challenges, and does not sustain 488 challenges, in accordance with staff recommendations and the 2024 General Election Challenge Worksheet for EL 24-53. The Commission finds that Elsa Duranceau submitted 1,004 valid signatures, and the Commission adds Elsa Duranceau to the list of candidates to be approved for ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

II.EL 24-54 – Jane Benson v. Alexia Unertl (AD4)

Challenger Name: Jane Benson

Candidate Name: Alexia Unertl

Office Sought: Wisconsin Assembly District 4

Signatures Required: 200

Signatures Filed (After Facial Review): 232

Signatures Challenged: 31 Supplemental Signatures: 0 Correcting Affidavits: 0

Final Staff Recommendation: 227

Jane Benson alleges a number of common nomination paper challenges. The challenge states that it seeks to disqualify 39 signatures, leaving a total of 193 valid signatures. The majority of the challenges allege that the signatories did not provide their correct municipality of residence. Other challenges include the lack of a signature, illegible lines, ineligible dates, missing municipality, and missing date.

Staff counted a total of 32 challenges to 31 signature lines. Each challenge fell under Wis. Stat. s. 8.15(2). Each individual challenge has an entry and a staff recommendation within the attached staff worksheet for EL 24-54. Staff recommend sustaining 5 challenges, all due to missing or illegible information within signature lines, making them invalid under Wis. Stat. s. 8.15(2).

Staff recommend rejecting all challenges regarding incorrect municipality of residence. In each case, staff looked up the address as listed in the form and identified a residence within Assembly District 4. Five challenged signatures on page 13, as admitted in the rebuttal, appear to be fully compliant. Staff recommend that the remaining 21 challenges pertaining to municipality of residence be accepted as substantially compliant under Wis. Admin Code s. EL 2.05(5) because the information provided in the signature line clearly shows an existing address within the proper district for which the municipality of residence for voting purposes can be determined.

The response addressed only signature lines for which staff recommend that the initial burden was not met. Staff therefore did not reevaluate any of its recommendations as a result of the response. However, the responses provided largely mirror the staff analysis provided in the worksheet.

The rebuttal was received on June 7, and therefore could be evaluated before this memo was completed. In the rebuttal, the challenger concedes that the challenged signatures on page 13 were in fact valid, and states that she believes only 27 of her challenges should result in signatures being struck. It appears that the rebuttal refers only to the 32 challenges that staff evaluated in the challenge, and not 39 as stated in the challenge. The challenger asks the Commission to consider the challenge withdrawn because it could not result in a loss of ballot access.

Staff recommend that the Commission vote on the challenge and strike the 5 signatures that the challenge has shown to be invalid. Ultimately, many challenges fail to strike enough signatures to alter ballot access, but the Commission has still struck the signatures that it has found to be invalid. That a challenger does not wish to take more time from the Commission, staff, or the challenged candidate is a reasonable desire, but at this point the Commission has received a verified challenge and response which show that several invalid signatures had been recommended for approval. Staff recommend completing the challenge process and striking those signatures, which have undergone a thorough review as contemplated by Wis. Stat. s. 8.07 and Wis. Admin. Code s. EL 2.07.

Recommended Motion:

After reviewing all materials submitted by the parties and the staff worksheet and analysis, the Commission sustains 5 challenges against signatures lines, and does not sustain 26 challenges against signature lines, in

accordance with staff recommendations and the 2024 General Election Challenge Worksheet for EL 24-54. The Commission finds that Alexia Unertl submitted 227 valid signatures for the office of Assembly District 4, and the Commission adds Alexia Unertl to the list of candidates to be approved for ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

III.EL 24-55 – Tony Theisen v. Tony Wied (CD-08 – Special)

Challenger Name: Tony Theisen Candidate Name: Tony Wied

Office Sought: U.S. Representative to Congressional District 8 (Special Election)

Signatures Required: 1,000

Signatures Filed (After Facial Review): 1,667

Signatures Challenged: 228 Supplemental Signatures: 0 Correcting Affidavits: 0

Final Staff Recommendation: 1,667

Tony Theisen alleges that he personally observed a ciculator deploying fraudulent tactics to induce voters to sign Tony Wied's nomination papers (*e.g.* misleading voters to believe they were providing signatures to provide "housing for the homeless"). The combined response for EL 24-55 and EL 24-56 rebuts that allegation by noting that the allegations of fraud are based on hearsay, are speculative, do not establish that anyone who actually signed the nomination paper was misled, and do not overcome the presumption of validity. In addition, the circulator in question submitted a sworn affidavit refuting the allegations.

As to the allegations of fraud, staff do not believe Mr. Theisen's request to invalidate every nomination paper collected by the applicable circulator should be granted, or the challenge sustained. Giving due weight to each sworn statement, with a presumption of validity for nomination papers and a challenge burden falling on the challenger, there is no cause to sustain a challenge to all pages circulated by the specific circulator. The circulator directly denied the allegation. What is more, candidate Wied's nomination paper headings were all legally compliant and correctly completed. The proper headings on those nomination paper show that the electors signed with "full knowledge of its content," and the allegations raised in the challenge cannot overcome the presumption of validity. No evidence has been provided connecting the specific pages before the Commission to the pages that were allegedly signed by electors who had been misled. Further, no evidence has been provided from a signer of the pages before the commission stating that the signer was misled. Without being able to connect a specific allegation that a singer was misled to a signature before the Commission, the Commission is unable to strike any signatures. Even if the Commission were to look past these deficiencies in the challenge and instead strike these signatures, the candidate would still have enough signatures to qualify for ballot access.

The fraud challenge also fails because it was not raised using a proper statutory vehicle, and it alleges violations of criminal law against a person who is not a party to the challenge, with no opportunity for due process.

Wisconsin Statute $\S 5.05(2m)(a)$ provides in relevant part that:

For purposes of this subsection, the commission may only initiate an investigation of an alleged violation of chs. 5 to 10 and 12, other than an offense described under par. (c) 12., based on a sworn complaint filed with the commission, as provided under par. (c). Neither the commission nor any member or employee of the commission, including the commission administrator, may file a sworn complaint for purposes of this subsection.

Wisconsin Administrative Code § EL 2.07 also details the processes for challenges to nomination papers. This provision does not authorize investigation, prosecution referral, or even the examination of criminal allegations. Even if it did, it would be negated by the fact that Wis. Stat. § 5.05 provides the sole methodology for the Commission's examination of criminal allegations, which include the preclusion of unilaterally initiating an investigation without a sworn Wis. Stat. § 5.05 complaint. As such, entire-page challenges based on fraud allegations alleged by Mr. Theisen fail.

Recommended Motion:

The Commission sustains 0 challenges, and does not sustain 228 challenges, in accordance with staff recommendations and the 2024 General Election Challenge Worksheet for EL 24-55. The Commission finds that Tony Wied submitted 1,667 valid signatures, and the Commission adds Tony Wied to the list of candidates to be approved for ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

IV.EL 24-56 – Tony Theisen v. Tony Wied (CD-08 – General)

Challenger Name: Tony Theisen **Candidate Name**: Tony Wied

Office Sought: U.S. Representative to Congressional District 8 (General Election)

Signatures Required: 1,000

Signatures Filed (After Facial Review): 1,647

Signatures Challenged: 197 Supplemental Signatures: 0 Correcting Affidavits: 0

Final Staff Recommendation: 1,647

Tony Theisen alleges that he personally observed canvassers deploying fraudulent tactics to induce voters to sign Tony Wied's nomination papers (*e.g.* misleading voters to believe they were providing signatures to provide "housing for the homeless"). The combined response for EL 24-55 and EL 24-56 rebuts that allegation by noting that the allegations of fraud are based on hearsay, are speculative, do not establish that anyone who actually signed the nomination paper was misled, and do not overcome the presumption of validity. In addition, the circulator in question submitted a sworn affidavit refuting the allegations.

As to the allegations of fraud, staff do not believe Mr. Theisen's request to invalidate every nomination paper collected by the applicable circulator should be granted, or the challenge sustained. Giving due weight to each sworn statement, with a presumption of validity for nomination papers and a challenge burden falling on the challenger, there is no cause to sustain a challenge to all pages circulated by the specific circulator. The ciculator directly denied the allegation. What is more, candidate Wied's nomination paper headings were all legally compliant and correctly completed. The proper headings on those nomination paper show that the electors signed with "full knowledge of its content," and the allegations raised in the challenge cannot overcome the presumption of validity. No evidence has been provided connecting the specific pages before the Commission to the pages that were allegedly signed by electors who had been misled. Further, no evidence has been provided from a signer of the pages before the commission stating that the signer was misled. Without being able to connect a specific allegation that a singer was misled to a signature before the Commission, the Commission is unable to strike any signatures. Even if the Commission were to look past these deficiencies in the challenge and instead strike these signatures, the candidate would still have enough signatures to qualify for ballot access.

The fraud challenge also fails because it was not raised using a proper statutory vehicle, and it alleges violations of criminal law against a person who is not a party to the challenge, with no opportunity for due process.

Wisconsin Statute § 5.05(2m)(a) provides in relevant part that:

For purposes of this subsection, the commission may only initiate an investigation of an alleged violation of chs. 5 to 10 and 12, other than an offense described under par. (c) 12., based on a sworn complaint filed with the commission, as provided under par. (c). Neither the commission nor any member or employee of the commission, including the commission administrator, may file a sworn complaint for purposes of this subsection.

Wisconsin Administrative Code § EL 2.07 also details the processes for challenges to nomination papers. This provision does not authorize investigation, prosecution referral, or even the examination of criminal allegations. Even if it did, it would be negated by the fact that Wis. Stat. § 5.05 provides the sole methodology for the Commission's examination of criminal allegations, which include the preclusion of unilaterally initiating an investigation without a sworn Wis. Stat. § 5.05 complaint. As such, entire-page challenges based on fraud allegations alleged by Mr. Theisen fail.

Recommended Motion:

The Commission sustains 0 challenges, and does not sustain 197 challenges, in accordance with staff recommendations and the 2024 General Election Challenge Worksheet for EL 24-56. The Commission finds that Tony Wied submitted 1,647 valid signatures, and the Commission adds Tony Wied to the list of candidates to be approved for ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

V.EL 24-57 – LaKeshia Myers v. Dora Drake (SD4 – General)

Challenger Name: LaKeshia Myers

Candidate Name: Dora Drake

Office Sought: Wisconsin Senate District 4 (General Election)

Signatures Required: 400-800

Signatures Filed (After Facial Review): 692

Signatures Challenged: 692 Supplemental Signatures: None Correcting Affidavits: None Filed Final Staff Recommendation: 692

Commission staff verified 692 signatures after facial review. Challenger Myers is challenging all of them based on an allegation that Candidate Drake incorrectly used the nomination paper form for nonpartisan office for a partisan race.

Challenger Myers admits that Candidate Drake did include "Democratic Party" on all of her nomination papers, but argues that the fact that some of them say "Nonpartisan" at the top may have caused confusion for those signing. Challenger Myers does not assert, or offer any evidence, that any signatory was confused or misled by the title of the nomination paper they signed.

In her response, Candidate Drake argues that Challenger Myers has failed to cite any specific statute requiring that a nomination form state whether it is for a Partisan or Nonpartisan office. She concedes that she erroneously titled some of her papers as "Nonpartisan," but still substantially complied with s. 8.15(5)(a) because all of her nomination papers still indicated that she was running as a Democrat.

Staff determined that 67 pages, out of 77, have the phrase "Nomination Paper for Nonpartisan Office" at the top, but that all 77 pages have "Democratic Party" in the header. Since the pages are all labeled with a major political party, even signatories who signed a paper labeled "nonpartisan" would have understood that they were signing to support a candidate for a partisan office. Accordingly, Challenger Myers has not met the burden to show by clear and convincing evidence that any signatories were confused or misled by nomination papers that were

labeled "nonpartisan." Furthermore, the inclusion of "Democratic Party" means that Candidate Drake's nomination papers are still substantially compliant with the requirement of s. 8.15(5)(a) that the header contain an indication that she is a partisan candidate affiliated with a political party.

Recommended Motion:

The Commission does not sustain the challenge to Dora Drake's nomination papers because they are substantially compliant with s. 8.15(5)(a) and still indicate that she is a partisan candidate for a partisan office, despite some pages being labeled "nonpartisan." The Commission finds that Dora Drake submitted 692 valid signatures for the office of Wisconsin State Senate District 4, and the Commission adds Dora Drake to the list of candidates to be approved for ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

VI.EL 24-58 – Erin Esser v. Andrew Beck (CD-05)

Challenger Name: Erin Esser Candidate Name: Andrew Beck

Office Sought: U.S. Representative to Congressional District 5

Signatures Required: 1000

Signatures Filed (After Facial Review): 1018

Signatures Challenged: 93 Supplemental Signatures: No Correcting Affidavits: No

Signatures Not Challenged Reconsidered: 1

Final Staff Recommendation: 976

The challenge raises 93 individual challenges. Most of the challenges are common nomination paper challenges against individual signatures falling under Wis. Stat. s. 8.15(2). Allegations in this category including missing and illegible information concerning names and addresses. There were also a variety of challenges concerning electors not residing in the district under Wis. Stat. s. 8.15(3), or of signatures being dated after the date of the circulator certification under Wis. Admin. Code s. EL 2.05(15)(b). There are also challenges that a circulator previously circulated the nomination papers of another candidate, in violation of Wis. Stat. s. 8.04.

Many of these challenges required line-specific decisions concerning if the signatory had substantially complied with the requirement to provide a name and address, or if a name was legible. Detailed analysis on each line can be found in the attached staff worksheet for EL 24-58.

In six instances, on page 15 line 8, page 17 line 1, page 52 line 7, page 70 line 6, page 86, line 1, page 89 line 7, signatures that were struck by staff initially were challenged. These signatures were not counted toward the total of 1018, and thus should not be removed following this challenge. Staff would have accepted the challenges had the signatures been counted but did not write "burden met" on the worksheet because none should be subtracted from the total as a result. Instead, staff made a note for each instance.

In some instances, only a first initial and a last name were provided. Staff found substantial compliance only in instances when the address, last name, and first name given match a registered voter at that address and thus could be corroborated by a valid extrinsic source under EL 2.07(1). An elector need not be registered to vote to sign nomination papers, but they do need to provide a full name. In instances when the voter could not be looked up and verified by an extrinsic source, staff struck names only when no plausible name could be discerned on the page.

For any line staff recommended that the burden had been met by the challenger, staff reviewed the response. Each of these lines has a staff note in the "legal analysis" section.

A correcting affidavit was submitted for page 19, line 5 stating that the signature was collected on June 1, and not June 2 as shown on the page. This is likely correct, however, the correcting affidavit was not timely received by June 6, three days after the filing deadline. A response to a challenge cannot correct an error on the face of a nomination paper. It may provide context and illuminate what is present, but it cannot add or change what is present. Therefore, staff recommend that the challenger met the burden to show that the date was invalid for being after the date of the certification of the circulator.

The candidate and counsel also try to argue for the validity of a number of signatures that were struck by staff but not challenged in the response. In almost all cases, staff do not recommend counting the signatures because an element was missing entirely from the page. These issues could have been fixed by June 6 with a correcting affidavit, but they were not, and there is nothing on the page to demonstrate substantial compliance. These entries have a note in the "legal analysis" section, but do not list burden met or not met because no signatures were challenged. On page 72 line 4, staff recommend adding back a signature because East Troy is present in the signature line under address, and it identifies a house within the district.

Recommended Motion:

After reviewing all materials submitted by the parties and the staff worksheet and analysis, the Commission sustains 43 challenges against signatures lines, does not sustain 50 challenges against signature lines, and adds 1 signature to the total that was initially struck by staff but not challenged in accordance with staff recommendations and the 2024 General Election Challenge Worksheet for EL 24-58. The Commission finds that Andrew Beck submitted 976 valid signatures for the office of Congressional District 5, and the Commission removes Andrew Beck from the list of candidates to be approved for ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

VII.EL 24-59 – Trevor Ford v. Kelly Clark (AD33)

Challenger Name: Trevor Ford Candidate Name: Kelly Clark

Office Sought: Wisconsin Assembly District 33

Signatures Required: 200

Signatures Filed (After Facial Review): 236

Signatures Challenged: 102 Supplemental Signatures: No Correcting Affidavits: No

Final Staff Recommendation: 236

This challenge alleges under Wis. Stat. § 8.15(1) and Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.07(3)(c) that 102 signatures are invalid due to being dated after June 1. Staff verified in the worksheet for EL 24-59 that 102 signatures were indeed collected after June 1, however, staff recommend that the challenger has failed to show that the signatures were not collected within the time prescribed by statute.

Regarding valid dates for collecting signatures, Wis. Stat. § 8.15(1) provides that:

Nomination papers may be circulated no sooner than April 15 preceding the general election and may be filed no later than 5 p.m. on June 1 preceding the partisan primary Only those candidates for whom nomination papers containing the necessary signatures acquired within the allotted time and filed before the deadline may have their names appear on the official partisan primary ballot.

The statute provides only a beginning date and a filing date. As long as all signatures are acquired and filed before the filing deadline, they are compliant with regard to the circulation period.

In 2024, June 1 landed on a Saturday. Due to this, and the fact that the Commission office was not open on Saturday, June 1, all candidates could file their nomination papers on Monday, June 3 by the application of Wis. Stat. § 990.001(4)(c), which states in relevant part that:

When the last day within which . . . an act [is to be] done, which consists of . . . the filing with any . . . agency . . . of any . . . statement . . . or other document, falls on a Saturday and the duly established official office hours of such . . . agency . . . with which such . . . statement . . . or other document is required to be filed, do not include any office hours thereof on such Saturday . . . such act may be done on the next succeeding day that is not a Sunday or a legal holiday.

Because all signatures challenged were collected between the start of the circulation period and the filing deadline of June 3, this challenge should be rejected.

Staff do not believe that the challenger met any burden with clear and convincing evidence, and therefore the candidate's response was not needed to shift any burden back to the challenger. However, the response aligns with the staff discussion above, and the documents provided as evidence appear to be accurate copies of Commission materials concerning this year's nomination paper and filing deadlines.

Recommended Motion:

After reviewing all materials submitted by the parties and the staff worksheet and analysis, the Commission sustains 0 challenges against signatures lines, and does not sustain 102 challenges against signature lines, in accordance with staff recommendations and the 2024 General Election Challenge Worksheet for EL 24-59. The Commission finds that Kelly Clark submitted 236 valid signatures for the office of Assembly District 33, and the Commission adds Kelly Clark to the list of candidates to be approved for ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

VIII.EL 24-60 – Trevor Ford v. Steve Rydzewski (AD37)

Challenger Name: Trevor Ford Candidate Name: Steve Rydzewski

Office Sought: Wisconsin Assembly District 37

Signatures Required: 200

Signatures Filed (After Facial Review): 253

Signatures Challenged: 103 Supplemental Signatures: 0 Correcting Affidavits: 0

Final Staff Recommendation: 253

This challenge alleges under Wis. Stat. § 8.15(1) and Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.07(3)(c) that 103 signatures are invalid due to being dated after June 1. The challenged candidate, in a sworn response, noted that the Commission had moved the deadline to June 3. Candidate Rydzewski even confirmed this with staff as a follow up to the Commission's decision (*See* included email with Erin Hoag). Staff verified in the worksheet for EL 24-60 that 103 signatures were indeed collected after June 1, however, staff recommend that the challenger has failed to show that the signatures were not collected within the time prescribed by statute.

Regarding valid dates for collecting signatures, Wis. Stat. § 8.15(1) provides that:

Nomination papers may be circulated no sooner than April 15 preceding the general election and may be filed no later than 5 p.m. on June 1 preceding the partisan primary Only those candidates for whom nomination papers containing the necessary signatures acquired within the allotted time and filed before the deadline may have their names appear on the official partisan primary ballot.

The statute provides only a beginning date and a filing date. As long as all signatures are acquired and filed before the filing deadline, they are compliant with regard to the circulation period.

In 2024, June 1 landed on a Saturday. Due to this, and the fact that the Commission office was not open on Saturday, June 1, all candidates could file their nomination papers on Monday, June 3 by the application of Wis. Stat. § 990.001(4)(c), which states in relevant part that:

When the last day within which . . . an act [is to be] done, which consists of . . . the filing with any . . . agency . . . of any . . . statement . . . or other document, falls on a Saturday and the duly established official office hours of such . . . agency . . . with which such . . . statement . . . or other document is required to be filed, do not include any office hours thereof on such Saturday . . . such act may be done on the next succeeding day that is not a Sunday or a legal holiday.

Because all signatures challenged were collected between the start of the circulation period and the filing deadline of June 3, this challenge should be rejected.

Recommended Motion:

The Commission sustains 0 challenges, and does not sustain 103 challenges, in accordance with staff recommendations and the 2024 General Election Challenge Worksheet for EL 24-60. The Commission finds that Steve Rydzewski submitted 253 valid signatures, and the Commission adds Steve Rydzewski to the list of candidates to be approved for ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

IX. EL 24-61 – Trevor Ford v. David Heffel (AD70)

Challenger Name: Trevor Ford Candidate Name: David Heffel

Office Sought: Wisconsin Assembly District 70

Signatures Required: 200

Signatures Filed (After Facial Review): 320

Signatures Challenged: 320 Supplemental Signatures: 0 Correcting Affidavits: 0

Final Staff Recommendation: 0

There is no 2024 General Election Challenge Worksheet for this matter because the nature of the challenges made it unnecessary. The ballot access challenge filed by Trevor Ford against David Heffel alleges, in substantive part, two deficiencies related to his nomination papers and declaration of candidacy. First, Mr. Heffel has one address listed as his residence for voting purposes on his declaration of candidacy (12363 UW Highway 12, city of Tomah), and a different residential address listed in the header of all 38 of his nomination papers (12326 US Highway 12, city of Tomah). Second, Mr. Heffel lists his municipality for voting purposes as the city of Tomah when it should be the town of La Grange, both on his nomination papers and on his declaration of candidacy.

Mr. Heffel's sworn response indicates that he does not dispute the challenges listed above. Instead, the candidate argues that the mistakes were not fraudulent or intentional, and they should not invalidate his candidacy because the incorrect address would still fall within Assembly District 70.

Pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code EL § 2.07(3)(a), "The burden is on the complainant to establish any insufficiency (of nomination papers). If the complainant establishes that the information on the nomination paper is insufficient, the burden is on the challenged candidate to establish its sufficiency..." The burden of proof applicable to establishing or rebutting a challenge is clear and convincing evidence." Wis. Admin. Code EL § 2.07(4). Wisconsin Administrative Code EL § 2.05(4) provides, "Any information which appears on a nomination paper is entitled to a presumption of validity..."

Relevant statute and guidance provide as follows:

Wis. Stat. § 8.15(5) (See also similar provisions for alternate election cycles such as Wis. Stat. § 8.10(2)):

- (a) Each nomination paper shall have substantially the following words printed at the top: I, the undersigned, request that the name of (insert candidate's last name plus first name, nickname or initial, and middle name, former legal surname, nickname or middle initial or initials if desired, but no other abbreviations or titles) residing at (insert candidate's street address) be placed on the ballot at the (general or special) election to be held on (date of election) as a candidate representing the (name of party) so that voters will have the opportunity to vote for (him or her) for the office of (name of office). I am eligible to vote in (name of jurisdiction or district in which candidate seeks office). I have not signed the nomination paper of any other candidate for the same office at this election.
- (b) Each candidate shall include his or her mailing address on the candidate's nomination papers.

Commission Guidance and Training:

Candidates must list their residential address and their municipality of residence for voting purposes. If the candidate has a mailing address that is different than their residential address, this needs to be added as well... (Citing "Candidate Ballot Access Procedures, Page 5).

Similarly, Wis. Stat. § 8.21(4)(b), which pertains to declarations of candidacy requires, "A statement that discloses the candidate's municipality of residence for voting purposes, and the street and number, if any, on which the candidate resides."

Commission staff believe Mr. Ford has met his burden of establishing insufficiency through a reading of the plain language of the statue. However, the response, as well as independent Commission staff research, raised other important concerns as well.

An initial reading of Wis. Stats. §§ 8.15(5) and 8.21(4)(b), and the Commission's own guidance, support a belief that Mr. Heffel's nomination papers and declaration of candidacy had several address deficiencies. This shifts the burden to the respondent to establish sufficiency. Wis. Admin. Code EL § 2.07(3)(a). Rather than rebutting the evidence and establishing sufficiency at that point, Mr. Heffel admitted to all challenges in a sworn statement.

Thus, the only question that remains is whether the substantiated challenges render all the nomination papers insufficient. Commission staff recommend that the Commissioners sustain the challenges and find the papers insufficient. The requirements found in the plain language of the statutes cited above were not met. The following constitutes a summary of the collective non-compliance that staff found upon examination of Mr. Heffel's materials:

- The residential address listed in the header of all 38 of Mr. Heffel's nomination papers is 12326 US Highway 12 in the city of Tomah. WEC staff were not able to verify that such an address even exists after searching several resources. As such, a signer would have had no way to verify where the candidate resides. Mr. Heffel, in his sworn response, does nothing to confirm his correct address, or that the address above exists. Thus, the record is devoid of a way to confirm compliance, or even partial compliance, were the Commission to consider granting ballot access to the candidate. The candidate's argument that the incorrect address is still in the district is, subsequently, of no consequence.
- Mr. Heffel was the circulator for all but one of his nomination papers, page 37, and the address he lists as circulator on these pages is 12363 US Highway 12, which does not conform to the address required and listed in the header. Even if this is the correct address, there is no evidence in the record to show that it was on the page when signers viewed the page (*i.e.* the Commission cannot even infer that signers had a second opportunity to confirm Mr. Heffel's residency viewing the circulation address).
- Mr. Heffel has one address listed as his residence on his declaration of candidacy (12363 US Highway 12) and a different address listed as his residence on all of his nomination papers (12326 US Highway 12). One cannot reside at two different residences for voting purposes.
- Even if Mr. Heffel actually resides at one of those addresses, he likely has the wrong municipality listed. Staff were able to confirm this for his declaration of candidacy, where 12363 US Highway 12 is actually in the town of La Grange and not in the city of Tomah.

Recommended Motion:

The Commission sustains 320 challenges, and does not sustain 0 challenges, in accordance with staff recommendations for EL 24-61. The Commission finds that David Heffel submitted 0 valid signatures, and the Commission adds David Heffel to the list of candidates to be denied ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

X. EL 24-62 Purnima Nath v. Tim Rogers (CD-04)

Challenger Name: Purnima Nath Candidate Name: Tim Rogers

Office Sought: U.S. Representative to Congressional District 4

Signatures Required: 1,000

Signatures Filed (After Facial Review): 1,119

Signatures Challenged: 0 Supplemental Signatures: No Correcting Affidavits: No

Final Staff Recommendation: 1,119

Purnima Nath challenges the validity of Tim Rogers' Declaration of Candidacy. Under Wis. Stat. s. 8.15(4)(b), "[n]omination papers shall be accompanied by a declaration of candidacy under s. 8.21," and under Wis. Stat. s. 8.30(4) "[t]he official or agency with whom a declaration of candidacy is required to be filed may not place a candidate's name on the ballot if the candidate fails to file a declaration of candidacy within the time prescribed under s. 8.21." Therefore, if a candidate fails to file a Declaration of Candidacy, or files one that is incomplete or invalid, the Commission would be precluded from approving that candidate for ballot access.

The challenge alleges that Tim Rogers' Declaration of Candidacy is incomplete, and that he missed the deadline to file a sufficient declaration. Specifically, it alleges that the Declaration of Candidacy did indicate whether it was an original or an amended declaration by checking one of the two boxes at the top of the form, and that the word "Congressional" was misspelled as "Congressinal."

The Declaration of Candidacy was received before the deadline, and the only question before the Commission is whether the declaration is complete. Staff recommend that the Commission find that the Declaration of Candidacy is complete and dismiss this challenge. Staff agree with the Challenger that the Declaration of Candidacy does not indicate whether it is an amended form, and that the word "congressional" is misspelled. However, neither of these issues are fatal.

Regarding the first allegation, the check boxes on the Declaration of Candidacy form aid Commission staff and municipal clerks in carrying out Wis. Stat. s. 8.21(6), which requires state and local candidates to "file an amended declaration of candidacy under oath with the same officer or agency if any information contained in the declaration of candidacy changes at any time after the original declaration of candidacy is filed." As an initial matter, this requirement only applies to state and local candidates and thus not to Tim Rogers as a candidate for Congressional District 4. In any case, there is not a statutory requirement to check either box when turning in either an original or an amended Declaration of Candidacy. Staff recommend that all candidates check the appropriate box to ensure that the document is processed correctly, but the failure to do so is not a violation of Wis. Stat. s. 8.21 or grounds to deny a candidate ballot access under Wis. Stat. S. 8.30(4).

Regarding the second allegation, all candidates are required to state "[t]hat the signer is a candidate for a named office." Wis. Stat. s. 8.21(2)(a). Candidates are thus required to state the name and number of the office. In this case, it is overwhelmingly clear that Tim Rogers is a candidate for Congressional District 4. While an incorrect number or the lack of any indication of an office title could potentially invalidate a declaration, that is not the case here. The declaration contains a minor misspelling, but the statutory requirement to name a specific office has been met.

Because staff do not believe that any burden has been met to demonstrate that Tim Rogers filed an incomplete declaration of candidacy, it was not necessary to review the response for additional arguments. However, staff agree with the response that the declaration was timely filed and sufficient. The response may be attempting to amend the declaration. This is not necessary, but if the candidate wishes, he could complete an amended form at any time.

Recommended Motion:

After reviewing all materials submitted by the parties and the staff analysis, the Commission dismisses the challenge to Tim Rogers' Declaration of Candidacy in accordance with staff recommendations for EL 24-62. The Commission finds that Tim Rogers submitted a timely and valid Declaration of Candidacy and 1,119 valid signatures for the office of Congressional District 4, and the Commission adds Tim Rogers to the list of candidates to be approved ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

XI.EL 24-63 Morgan Hess v. Deanna Alexander (AD12)

Challenger Name: Morgan Hess **Candidate Name**: Deanna Alexander

Office Sought: Wisconsin Assembly District 12

Signatures Required: 200 – 400

Signatures Filed (After Facial Review): 218

Signatures Challenged: 22 Supplemental Signatures: None **Correcting Affidavits**: None

Final Staff Recommendation: 207 Verified Signatures

Commission staff verified that Candidate Alexander had 218 signatures after facial review. Challenger Hess alleges that 22 of these signatures are insufficient:

Candidate Alexander provided a sworn response refuting several interpretations of addresses, and also provided affidavits of several signatories to refute Challenger Hess' arguments and assumptions. Challenger Hess and counsel requested to voluntarily withdraw their challenges in the late evening of Sunday, June 9th, and they also rescinded their request to speak at the meeting. The question of whether a complaint can be voluntarily withdrawn, and how to subsequently treat the individual challenges, must be decided by the Commission today. As with the *Benson* challenge above, staff have still made the recommendations below, and believe the challenge should proceed despite this request.

As further detailed in the spreadsheet included in **Appendix 11**, Commission staff assessed each challenged signature and consulted extrinsic sources when necessary.

Illegible Elector Certifications

When a candidate alleges that a certification is noncompliant or insufficient because words or phrases in the certification are missing, illegible, or obscured, the Commission will consider whether the missing letters and words in the certification preserve each essential point within the certification. If each essential point within the certification is preserved, despite the missing or obscured words, the pages are substantially compliant and the challenge fails.¹

For Page 8, staff examined the original nomination paper and determined that substantial portions of the elector certification above the signature lines are completely obscured, likely due to a poor-quality copy. The elector certification is a critical component of the nomination papers because it informs electors of their rights and responsibilities for signing nomination papers. For Page 8, staff determined that signatories of that page could not have received all of the necessary information in the certification. In her response, Candidate Alexander alleges that the ink on the certifications of these pages "began deteriorating AFTER the nomination papers were signed and certified." She provided affidavits from 6 of the signatories on Page 8 (Line 1, Line 2, Line 10, Line 3, Line 7, and Line 4), all of whom certify that the information on the page was printed and legible to them. They further certified that the degraded ink pages did not look like that to them when they signed. Based on these affidavits, staff determined that Candidate Alexander has met the burden by clear and convincing evidence to show that the signatories on Line 1, Line 2, Line 3, Line 4, Line 7, and Line 10 all were able to read the entire elector certification prior to signing. Accordingly, staff recommend only **striking 4 signatures** from Page 8 for those electors in Line 5, Line 6, Line 8, and Line 9.

For Page 24, staff examined the original nomination paper and determined that each essential point within the certification is preserved, despite a few words that are not perfectly clear. Accordingly, Challenger Hess has not met the burden to show that the signatures on this page are not substantially compliant. In her response, Candidate Alexander provided affidavits from 3 of the signatories on Page 24 (Line 4; Line 2; and Line 3) all of whom certify that the information on the page was printed and legible to them. They further certified that the degraded ink pages did not look like that to them when they signed. Based on staff review and these affidavits, staff do not recommend striking any signatures from Page 24.

Residential Address Outside AD12

Staff determined that Challenger Hess met the burden of proof to show that 6 signatures are outside of AD12: Page 3, Line 3; Page 3, Line 4; Page 7, Line 1; Page 15, Line 3; Page 27, Line 9; Page 27, Line 10.

Candidate Alexander argues in her response that Challenger Hess did not offer sufficient information, exhibits, or documentation to show that five of the six challenged lines above were not located within AD12, but does not otherwise argue that these addresses actually are within AD12. EL s. 2.07(2)(a) states that a challenge to nomination papers "shall be established by affidavit, or other supporting evidence..." Challenger Hess asserted in her sworn complaint that district residence or non-residency was determined using the Legislature's district map tool. Commission staff ultimately determined that each of the five addresses above are outside of AD12, and accordingly recommends **striking 5 signatures** on this ground.

For the sixth challenge – Page 15, Line 3 – Candidate Alexander asserts that this address actually reads 4920 N 108th Street. On the line in question, there is a legitimate legibility question over whether the residence number is "4420" or "4490." Candidate Alexander did not submit an affidavit from this elector in her response, but asserts that the order of residence numbers for the rest of the signatures on this page supports the conclusion that this residence number is actually "4490." However, Candidate Alexander was not the circulator for Page 15 and does not clarify in her response if this assertion is based on personal knowledge, or if it is based on speculation. Staff determined that the best read of the residence number on Page 15, Line 3 is "4420." There is no registered voter at either address matching the name on this line. The address "4420 N 108th St" is outside of AD12, so staff recommend **striking 1 signature** on this ground.

Registered to Vote Outside AD12

Challenger Hess alleges that the address provided on Page 14, Line 10 is actually a mailing address, and that the signatory is registered to vote at a different residential address that is outside AD12. Challenger Hess provided a purported screenshot of the Democratic National Committee's Votebuilder website in support of this claim, but does not offer any additional allegations or evidence to support the claim that the address on the nomination paper is a mailing address, and the address in the Votebuilder website is a residential address. The Commission does not have a mailing address on file for this voter, so it is unable to confirm Challenger Hess' allegation that Votebuilder received all of the data in Exhibit B "directly from WEC." As part of her response, Candidate Alexander provided an affidavit from this elector who certified that he resides at the address he provided on Page 14, Line 10.

Accordingly, Commission staff determined that Challenger Hess has not met the clear and convincing evidence burden to demonstrate that this voter resides outside of AD12.

Address Does Not Exist

Staff determined that Challenger Hess has met the burden of proof to show that 1 signature line includes an address that does not exist: Page 27, Line 2. Candidate Alexander alleges that the individual who signed on Line 2 lives at the same address as the individuals on Lines 1 and 3, and that Line 2 should be properly read as "5205 N. 107th St." Commission staff believe that the address on Page 27, Line 2 is clearly read as "5205 N 101st St." Candidate Alexander did not provide a correcting affidavit from this elector, but she was the circulator for this page. However, EL s. 2.05(4) explicitly states that correcting affidavits must be filed "not later than three calendar days after the applicable statutory due date for the nomination papers." Candidate Alexander's response was not received until June 9, well after the correcting affidavit deadline on June 6. Since Line 2 is perfectly legible, and since Candidate Alexander is unable to provide a new address for this elector, Commission staff confirm that the address "5205 N 101st St" does not appear to exist. Accordingly, Commission staff recommend that 1 signature be struck on this ground.

Recommended Motion:

The Commission sustains 11 challenges, and does not sustain 11 challenges, in accordance with staff recommendations and the 2024 General Election Challenge Worksheet for EL 24-63. The Commission finds that Deanna Alexander submitted 207 valid signatures for the office of Assembly District 12, and the Commission adds Deanna Alexander to the list of candidates to be approved ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

XII.EL 24-64 – Brennan Balestrieri v. Angela Kennedy (AD18)

Commission staff verified that Candidate Kennedy had 236 signatures after facial review of both her original submission and her supplemental signatures. Challenger Balistrieri alleges that 133 of these signatures are insufficient:

Candidate Kennedy did not timely submit a challenge response.

Incomplete/Illegible Name

Staff determined that Challenger Balestrieri did **not** meet the burden of proof to show that 1 signature line includes an incomplete name: Page 8, Line 7. In this line, the signatory's last name and first initial are clearly visible, along with his purported address, and staff recommend that this signature be counted because it substantially complies with s. 8.15(5)(a).

Invalid Address (Does not Exist or Not Residential Address)

Staff determined that Challenger Balestrieri met the burden of proof to show that **4 signature lines** include an address that does not exist, or is not a residential address: Page 5, Line 9; Page 7, Line 3; Page 19, Line 8; and Page 19, Line 9. Accordingly, staff recommend striking these 4 signatures.

Staff determined that Challenger Balestrieri did **not** meet the burden of proof to show that 7 signature lines include an address that does not exist, or is not a residential address: Page 13, Line 2; Page 13, Line 4; Page 18, Line 1; Page 18, Line 4; Page 20, Line 3; Page 20, Line 4; and Page 20, Line 5. Accordingly, staff do not recommend striking these 7 signatures.

Address Outside AD18:

Staff determined that Challenger Balestrieri met the burden of proof to show that **6 signatures** are outside of AD18: Page 1, Line 4; Page 9, Line 1; Page 9, Line 2; Page 14, Line 4; Page 17, Line 7; and Page 18, Line 10. Accordingly, staff recommend striking these 6 signatures.


Duplicate Signatures:

Staff determined that Challenger Balestrieri met the burden of proof to show that **2 signatures** are duplicates because these signatories signed Candidate Kennedy's nomination papers after signing nomination papers for another candidate for the same office: Page 15, Line 10; and Page 16, Line 8. Accordingly, staff recommend striking these 2 signatures.

Invalid Signature Dates (Unconfirmed Signer):

Challenger Balestrieri alleges that a large number of Candidate Kennedy's signatures are invalid because the handwriting of the date of signing, municipality, and other fields is so different from that of the signatory's, that it constitutes evidence that someone other than the signatory completed those fields. Specifically, Challenger Balestrieri alleges that many dates and municipalities for these signatures were "filled out and duplicated by an unknown and undocumented elector or circulator."

For example, Challenger Balestrieri alleges that the handwriting of some of these signature lines alone proves his assertions, as seen on lines 5 through 10 on page 8 of Candidate Kennedy's nomination papers:



However, nothing in s. 8.15 or EL s. 2.05 requires that the signatory be the one to physically write the required information on a nomination paper, such as their address, municipality, and date of signing, that accompanies their printed name and signature. Accordingly, even if Challenger Balestrieri's allegations were true that someone else completed this information on behalf of the signatory, that would not render any of the challenged signatures invalid on this ground. Had he alleged that an unauthorized individual signed on behalf of an elector without their knowledge or permission, that might compel a different conclusion, but on the basis of his allegations, staff conclude that Challenger Balestrieri has not met the burden of clear and convincing evidence on this challenge ground.

Recommended Motion:

The Commission sustains 12 challenges, and does not sustain 121 challenges, to 118 signature lines in accordance with staff recommendations and the 2024 General Election Challenge Worksheet for EL 24-64. The Commission finds that Angela Kennedy submitted 224 valid signatures for the office of Assembly District 18, and the Commission adds Angela Kennedy to the list of candidates to be approved ballot access. Commission staff shall issue a closure letter to the parties consistent with this motion.

SUBJECT: Ballot Access for the 2024 General Election, Special Election in Congressional District

8, and Special Election in Senate District 4.

This memorandum presents a summary of important and noteworthy information regarding candidates requesting ballot access for the 2024 General Election, Special Election in Congressional District 8, and Special Election in Senate District 4.

Summary

Wis. Stat. § 8.15(1) sets the deadlines for filing candidacy paperwork for June 1. June 1, 2024 fell on a Saturday. Wis. Stat. § 990.001(4)(c) allows the WEC to accept nomination papers for candidates running in the November 5, 2024 General Election on the next business day, which fell on June 3, 2024 at 5:00 p.m.

The deadline to file candidacy paperwork for the Special Election in Senate District 4 was on June 4, 2024 at 5:00 p.m. These deadlines were communicated to the public and to the political parties well ahead of time.

The first day to circulate nomination papers was Monday, April 15, 2022, and the first set of papers was filed on April 22. The last day to circulate nomination papers in most districts was the deadline of June 3 or June 4 in the case of Senate District 4.

In summary:

- 428 candidates applied to run for 194 state and federal offices.
- Four candidates applied to run for the Special Election in Congressional District 8.
- Two candidates applied to run for the Special Election in Senate District 4.
- A total of 389 petitions were filed with the Wisconsin Elections Commission.
- 45 candidates, who initially applied, ultimately did not submit any nomination papers.

Notifications of Noncandidacy- Extended Deadlines

Seventy-six incumbents filed notifications of noncandidacy with the Elections Commission by the Friday, May 24, 2024 deadline. Notifications of Noncandidacy are filed by incumbents who are not seeking reelection to the office they currently hold, including incumbents whose district number was changed due to the implementation of new Assembly and State Senate districts in 2024. If an incumbent officeholder does not timely file a Notification of Noncandidacy and subsequently does not file nomination papers, there is a 72-hour extension of the filing deadline for candidates other than the incumbent. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(1). Five incumbents, from the Assembly, did not timely file either nomination papers or a notification of noncandidacy, which resulted in a 72-hour extension for the offices of Representative to the Assembly, Districts 9, 31, 87, 88, and 89. No candidates filed during the extension period which expired at 5 p.m. on Thursday, June 6. A listing of candidates who filed notifications of noncandidacy is included with this memo in Appendix A. No challenges were filed during the extended time-period, meaning the Commission will be able to determine ballot access at the June 10 meeting and will not need to hold a later meeting for these extended contests.

Nomination Paper Review

In reviewing the nomination papers, staff examined each candidate's submission to determine that it contained a valid number of signatures for the office.

- Candidates for **Statewide offices, including United States Senator**, must file a minimum of **2,000** valid signatures of qualified electors of the state to qualify for ballot access. Wis. Stat. § 8.15 (6)(a).
- Candidates for **Representative in Congress** must file a minimum of **1,000** valid signatures of qualified electors from the district to qualify for ballot access. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(6)(b).
- Candidates for **State Senator** must file a minimum of **400** valid signatures of qualified electors from the district to qualify for ballot access. Wis. Stat. § 8.15 (6)(c).
- Candidates for **Representative to the Assembly** must file a minimum of **200** valid signatures of qualified electors from the district to qualify for ballot access. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(6)(d).
- Candidates for **District Attorney** in counties *over* **100,000** in **population** must file a minimum of **500** valid signatures of qualified electors from the county. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(6)(dm).

• Candidates for **District Attorney** in counties *under* **100,000** in **population** must file a minimum of **200** valid signatures of qualified electors from the county. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(6)(dm).

In addition to filing sufficient nomination paper signatures, each state candidate is also required to also file a Declaration of Candidacy (EL-162) with the WEC and file a Campaign Registration Statement (CF-1), and a Statement of Economic Interests (SEI) with the Wisconsin Ethics Commission in order to qualify for ballot access. Wis. Stat. §§ 11.05(2g), 8.21, 19.43(4). For the 2024 Fall Elections, Statements of Economic Interests were due at the Ethics Commission office by Thursday, June 6, 2024. For the Special Election in Senate District 4, the Statements of Economic Interests were due at the Ethics Commission office by Friday, June 7, 2024. If a 2024 Statement of Economic Interest (SEI) was already filed with the Ethics Commission for another purpose, that SEI was used to fulfill the filing requirement. Federal candidates are only required to file a Declaration of Candidacy in addition to their nomination papers. Wis. Stat. § 8.21.

Failure to file any required ballot access document prevents the candidate's name from appearing on the ballot. Wis. Stat. § 8.30. Staff used the guidance provided in Wis. Admin. Code EL § 2.05 to review the nomination papers submitted to determine if a given signature was facially valid. Signatures were struck for a variety of issues including but not limited to, incomplete addresses or dates, addresses that are located outside of the district, illegible printed name or an incomplete certification of the circulator. The nomination paper review guide that staff use for guidance when reviewing petition pages has been provided to you along with the materials prepared for this meeting. Wis. Admin. Code EL § 2.05 does not require the review process to include the identification and elimination of duplicate signatures or signatures from individuals who are ineligible to vote due to age, residency, citizenship, or other disqualifying factors.

It has been the policy of the staff of the Wisconsin Elections Commission to review all nomination papers and determine sufficiency within one business day of submission. Further, for papers received on deadline day, a determination regarding sufficiency was either made before staff retired for the evening or on the day following the deadline. Each submitted petition is subject to two rounds of review by staff before sufficiency is determined. Staff reviewed the majority of all submitted petitions the same day they were submitted to the WEC.

In total, staff reviewed roughly 194,912 valid signatures as part of the 389 submitted petitions. This total does not include signatures that were reviewed by staff but were not considered valid. By the deadline for filing nomination papers, 146 candidates had also filed additional supplemental nomination papers or correcting affidavits..

Staff continued to implement the changes put in place in 2020 for conducting candidate meetings and facilitating paperwork filings. An appointment-based system was used to stagger visits to our office and decrease the likelihood of congestion at the front desk and in meeting space areas for each day of the filing period, except for the June 3 deadline when candidates were processed in order of arrival. Candidates without appointments were also accommodated throughout the filing period and no candidate was turned away for lack of an appointment. WEC staff is proud to report that all petitions were reviewed and made available to the public to review on badgervoters.wi.gov the same day they were filed.

Nomination Paper Copy Requests

In order to facilitate requests for copies of nomination papers and limit the amount of visitors to the WEC offices, staff made candidate petitions, declarations of candidacy, and correcting affidavits available for

download via the Badger Voters data request site (https://badgervoters.wi.gov/). Requesters were not charged for the request. Requests for copies of petitions had traditionally been fulfilled through in person review and photocopying of files in the WEC offices. After the review process was complete, each petition was scanned and uploaded to the site and available for download by the public at no cost to the requestor. All challenges, replies, supplemental papers, and correcting affidavits were also made available to the public on badgervoters.wi.gov.

Irregularities in Ballot Access Documents Not Affecting Ballot Status

During review of nomination papers and other ballot access documents, WEC staff identified the following irregularities, none of which affected ballot status:

Name of Office Sought

• As has been the previous practice of the Commission, staff accepted for differences in listing of office titles, such as "Assembly," "State Assembly," "State Representative," "Senate," "Senator," and "House of Representatives".

Printed names of signers on nomination papers appear to be written by the circulator.

• Staff continues to find printed names of signers and address information that appear to be in the same handwriting as the circulator. Wis. Stat. § 8.10 (4)(b), requires the printed name and address information to be made by the signer of the petition, unless the signer requests assistance in signing or printing their name and address. As in past elections cycles, staff did not strike such signatures. Had staff struck the signatures for this reason, each candidate would still have sufficient signatures.

Staff Recommendations for Approval of Ballot Access

Once the Commission considers each of the challenges, they will next consider approving ballot access for all candidates who qualify. A listing of candidates recommended for ballot status is included with this memorandum in Appendix B and C. Staff requests the Commission affirmatively approve the ballot status of those candidates listed who have met or exceeded the minimum valid signatures and have filed all necessary ballot access documents. Candidates that the staff have determined meet the required ballot access requirements are marked as "approve" on the report.

The deadline for challenges to ballot access was Thursday June 6, 2024. Twelve challenges were filed with the Commission by the deadline of 4:30 p.m. The Commission may have chosen to add or remove candidates from this list as part of the challenge determination process.

This listing includes candidates whose nomination papers contain nominal issues such as form template issues, improper but common replacements for office titles, and suspiciously similar handwriting. During its rounds of review, Commission staff determined that these minor issues were not detrimental to the sufficiency of the papers, and that the papers substantially complied with all requirements under the applicable laws and administrative code provisions.

For the June 10, 2024 Commission Meeting Ballot Access for the 2024 General Election, Special Election in CD 8, and SD 4. Page 5

Recommended Motion #1: The 356 candidates representing ballot-status parties marked "approve" on the "Candidates Tracking by Office" report in Appendix B are approved for ballot access for the August 13, 2024 Partisan Primary, in addition to any candidates who were subject to challenge but were ultimately approved for ballot access by the Commission.

Recommended Motion #2: The two candidates representing ballot-status parties marked "approve" on the "Candidates Tracking by Office" report in Appendix C are approved for ballot access for the July 2, 2024 Special Partisan Primary.

Recommended Motion #3: The 17 candidates not representing ballot-status parties marked "approved" on the "Candidates Tracking by Office" report in Appendix B are approved for ballot access for the November 5, 2024 General Election, in addition to any independent candidates who were subject to challenge but were ultimately approved by the Commission.

Staff Recommendations for Denial of Ballot Access

Staff requests the Commission affirmatively deny the ballot status of those candidates listed who have not met the minimum number of valid signatures, have not filed all necessary ballot access documents or are otherwise do not meet the statutory requirements to be placed on the ballot. Candidates that staff have determined do not meet the required ballot access requirements are marked as "deny" on the report.

Recommended Motion #4: The 43 candidates representing ballot-status parties and independent candidates marked "denied" on the "Candidates Tracking by Office" report in Appendix B are denied ballot access for the August 13, 2024 Partisan Primary and the November 5, 2024 General Election respectively, in addition to any candidates who were subject to challenge but were ultimately denied ballot access by the Commission.

Frequently Asked Questions Regarding the Use of Form EL-122 (Official Absentee Ballot Certificate & Application):

The Wisconsin Elections Commission ("Commission") has received many questions regarding the use of its Form EL-122: the Official Absentee Ballot Certificate & Application. Specifically, the use of the form in its current format is being challenged in *Thomas Oldenburg v. WEC et al.* (Case No. 24-CV-0043). The following FAQ is designed to provide answers to those questions and to address misrepresentations that have been circulating on social media and elsewhere.

Was Form EL-122, Official Absentee Ballot Certificate & Application, found to be non-compliant with statute and prohibited from use in Wisconsin for absentee voting?

No. The *Oldenburg* case is still ongoing, and the substantive legal questions and requested relief have not been decided by the court. A final order and decision has not been issued.

Misinformation on this topic is circulating throughout the state and misrepresents a temporary injunction issued by the *Oldenburg* Court. The temporary injunction order did not determine Form EL-122 to be unlawful or otherwise prohibit clerks and voters from using it in Wisconsin. The injunction order only stated in relevant part that, "Defendants [i.e. the Commission and its Administrator] are hereby enjoined from requiring that Form EL-122 to be used by the clerks of this state."

This temporary injunction does nothing more than make the use of Form EL-122 voluntary rather than mandatory. Accordingly, clerks and voters can still use Form EL-122 without violating the temporary injunction.

A copy of the temporary injunction is attached, and clerks should consult with local counsel if they have further questions on its scope or applicability, and the broader applicability of decisions in circuit courts outside of your counties.

Has the Commission created or prescribed another form that serves the same purpose of the EL-122?

No. The Commission has not created or prescribed another form for use in Wisconsin absentee voting.

The sources misrepresenting the information above are saying a clerk or voter can be convicted of a crime if they use Form EL-122, is that true?

The Commission believes that Form EL-122 complies with the law and has taken that position in the *Oldenburg* case. Again, there has been no final order and decision issued in that case yet. It is unlikely that

using the Form EL-122 before a final decision in *Oldenberg* would subject a clerk or voter to criminal liability for using a document that has served as a certificate and application for many years, and for recent elections as it was amended last year. Even a final order and decision could be subject to appeal, and this case is likely a long way from final disposition. Again, it is recommended that you consult with local counsel about the applicability of the temporary injunction and any risks of liability.

Will a voter's absentee ballot be invalidated if they use Form EL-122?

Likely not. The temporary injunction did not prohibit anyone from using Form EL-122 in the upcoming elections, nor did it say that any ballots returned using the form should be invalidated. While someone may challenge a ballot that was returned using Form EL-122, the Commission believes that such a challenge should not be sustained. There is some question as to whether a ballot can be challenged on this basis at all, but Wis. Stat. § 6.95 also provides in substantive part that, "...If the returns are reported under s. 7.70, a challenge may be reviewed by the chairperson of the commission or the chairperson's designee..." This means that the Wisconsin Elections Commission Chairperson has authority to review any sustained challenge.

Additionally, the challenges raised by the *Oldenberg* plaintiff only relate to absentee ballots that were requested by email (which includes MyVote requests) or facsimile. It has nothing to do with absentee ballots that were requested by any other method. As for absentee ballots requested by email or facsimile, as stated above, no final order and decision has been issued in the *Oldenburg* case. As such, there is no reason to believe that a challenge should be sustained, whether locally or upon review/appeal.
