Challenge -

1. The Petition was impermissibly vague and failed to state a reason for the recall which is related to Angela's official responsibilities making all signatures insufficient on its face.

Rebuttal - Wisconsin does not require specific grounds for recall. Any elected official may be subject to recall for any reason. However, all petition sheets contained the statement "Disregard for Board Procedures, Lack of Transparency and Communication, Conflict of Interest and Ethical Violations, Violation of District Policies and Code of Conduct." The Official Statement of Intent to Circulate Recall Petition states specific reasons for the recall (**See Exhibit A**). Electors have a right to seek information and, in the event, someone feels they were mis-informed, there is a process for requesting removal of their signature.

Challenge -

2. Electors have requested their signatures be removed from the Petition prior to filing because they were misled by circulators, yet, not all elector signatures that so requested have been removed.

Rebuttal -

Dingleberry McDicklicker – Signature was never found on the recall petition sheets; therefore, it could not be crossed off (**See Exhibit B**).

Mary Geurts - Signature was crossed off on Page 35 of Recall Petition (See Exhibit C).

Richard Geurts – Signature was NOT crossed from Recall Petition because removal of name from petition instructions were not followed. Per Board Clerk, Tony Decker on 1/30/25, he specifically states "To remove your name from a signed recall petition, please email Rayn Warner at raynw@yahoo.com and also email me at decker@wrightstown.k12.wi.us (See Exhibit D). In this case, Richard Geurts only emailed Tony Decker, therefore, his name was NOT crossed from the Recall Petition (See Exhibit E).

Matt DeCleene - Signature was crossed off on Page 130 of Recall Petition. (See Exhibit F).

Allan Lamers - Signature was crossed off on Page 50 of Recall Petition. (See Exhibit G).

Gunnar Hansen – Signature was never found on the recall petition sheets; therefore, it could not be crossed off. **(See Exhibit H)**.

Ellen Uebele – Signature was never found on the recall petition sheets; therefore, it could not be crossed off. (See Exhibit I).

Jean Brandt - Signature was crossed off on Page 24 of Recall Petition. (See Exhibit J).

Gary Brandt - Signature was crossed off on Page 24 of Recall Petition. (See Exhibit J).

Mary Olbrich – Signature was never found on the recall petition sheets; therefore, it could not be crossed of. (See Exhibit K).

Jeni Ann Olson – Signature was crossed off on Page 23 of Recall Petition. (See Exhibit L).

Victoria Ropson - Signature was crossed off on Page 6 of Recall Petition. (See Exhibit M).

Nicole Franz – This was inadvertently missed, please cross from the Recall Petition.

Crystal Theunis – Signature was crossed off on Page 50 of the Recall Petition. (See Exhibit G).

Michael Theunis – Signature was crossed off on Page 50 of the Recall Petition. (See Exhibit G).

Stacy Treml - Signature was crossed off on Page 23 of Recall Petition. (See Exhibit L).

Jacob Heezen – This was inadvertently missed, please cross from the Recall Petition.

Makenna Leick - Signature was crossed off on Page 146 of the Recall Petition. (See Exhibit N).

Jason Meulemans – Signature was crossed off on Page 147 of the Recall Petition. (See Exhibit O). However, he asked to get back on the Recall Petition, so he signed again on Page 155 of the Recall Petition. (See Exhibit P).

Challenge -

3. Circulators altered over 258 addresses or municipality names that were written on the Petition by electors thereby making them ineligible to be counted.

Rebuttal - The claim that over 258 instances of petition signature information were edited by circulators or other parties to alter the municipality of signers is unfounded and lacks proper evidence. It is important to note that such changes, if they occurred, were the result of clerical errors or simple administrative oversights, rather than deliberate tampering. Furthermore, the process of collecting and verifying signatures is rigorous and closely monitored to ensure accuracy and transparency. Any confusion arising from multiple municipalities being listed for a single signer can be easily rectified through standard review procedures, which include careful cross-checking of records. Rather than undermining the legitimacy of the petition, these instances should be viewed as isolated cases that can be corrected without affecting the overall integrity of the petition process.

According to Wisconsin Elections Commission (WEC) employee Riley Willman, the address, municipality, and circulator information on petition sheets can be corrected by the circulator. The recent annexation of the Village of Greenleaf from the Village of Wrightstown has caused confusion regarding the municipality, as WCSD residents' taxes were issued by the Village of Wrightstown, and public search tools for looking up municipality information have not yet been updated. The WEC has suggested that the district clerk exercise some flexibility and allow for grace when reviewing municipality details, given this recent change. All cases in which the municipality has been modified, the residency of the signer of the petition sheet can be determined by the address given, therefore, they **SHOULD NOT** be stricken out

from the Recall Petition Sheets. **(See Exhibit Q)** which details out the Wisconsin Elections Commission Recall of Local Elected Officials Manual.

In addition to this, all 258 signatures must be included in the signature count because their address can be determined to be within the jurisdiction or district from which the elected official (See Exhibit R) being recalled is elected by visiting:

Furthermore, it was noted to cross out all signatures obtained by Tricia Vande Hey (challenger incorrectly spelled it as Tricia Vande Hay, Tricia Vander Hey) from December 21st. Nowhere in the Recall Local Elected Officials Manual (See Exhibit Q), does it identify acceptable or nonacceptable places to obtain signatures. There were several notifications sent out to the public via Face Book, local newspaper, Angela's personal Face Book pages and website which allowed petition signers to remove their signature if they felt compelled to do so (See Exhibit D). The case noted in the challenge that elector DeCleene (challenger incorrectly spelled it as DeCleese) notified us of his wish to remove his name, and we followed through with his request (See Exhibit F).

In Wisconsin, recall petitions can be circulated by any eligible voter, and there is no law explicitly prohibiting a fellow member of the same board from circulating a recall petition. However, the circulator must still comply with all relevant requirements for circulating petitions, such as ensuring that the petition includes the correct information, the signatures are properly gathered, and the petition is filed within the legal time frame.

Angela may have concerns regarding this petition when a fellow board member is involved in the recall process, but legally, there is no specific restriction against it. Keep in mind that all signatures must be gathered from registered voters within the appropriate district or municipality, and the circulator must make sure to follow the established procedures to ensure the recall petition is valid. Therefore, all signatures obtained by Rayn Warner and Tiffany Van Vreede **must be included** in the signature count.

If signers felt they were deceived or manipulated, they had the opportunity to remove their name from the recall petition (See Exhibit D).

Challenge -

4. Circulators fraudulently induced electors to sign the Petition using and making false statements about Angela, including the wonton and intentional misuse of district logos on private solicitation materials.

Rebuttal - The petition signature sheets clearly stated the reason for the petition at the top of the sheet. Any suggestion of false statements about Angela is merely an opinion and does not constitute a valid reason to deem the petition insufficient. On January 4, 2025, it was brought to our attention that

r4wcsd.com and the Residents for Wrightstown Community School District Face Book pages were using the Wrightstown Community School District's logo. The school district's logos are **not trademarked**, however, the group changed both r4wcsd.com and Residents for Wrightstown Community School District Face Book page on January 4, 2025, to address this concern, avoid any additional legal fees, and to avoid further conflict. On January 11, 2025, the school district's legal counsel contacted the petitioner regarding concerns about the non-trademarked logo use, however, at that time, this concern was already rectified on the website and Face Book pages.

Challenge -

5. The Petition was circulated multiple times on school district property and during school district events, violating numerous written school district policies including po2430, po9700, po3210, po0144.5, and p. 29 of the staff handbook.

Rebuttal - The policies are vague and do not specifically address the circulation of recall petitions on school property. It is public knowledge, based on a social media post, that there was an isolated incident on January 8th where a petition was signed at a sports club event. The signatures collected on that date were stricken (**See Exhibit S**), and the circulator contacted the electors, notifying them that they would need to re-sign if they still wished to support the recall of Angela Hansen-Winker. The recall circulator also reached out to Board Clerk Tony Decker to inquire about how to handle the situation. Tony Decker informed the circulator that there was no need to strike and recollect the signatures. However, the circulator decided it was best to strike the signatures and ask electors to sign again. Jaret Farrell, Tim Nelson, Bryan Rosenbaum, Jennifer Farrell, Abby Raye, and Stuart Ninabuck were stricken out on Page 135 of the Recall Petition (**See Exhibit S**). Jaret Farrell, Jennifer Farrell, and Stuart Ninabuck re-signed on Page 52 of the Recall Petition (**See Exhibit T**), Tim Nelson re-signed on Page 80 (**See Exhibit U**), and Abby Raye re-signed on Page 149 of the Recall Petition (**See Exhibit V**).

Challenge -

6. Circulators who are also government officials restricted public access to recall allegations made on a private Facebook page in violation of Federal and Wisconsin open records laws and Angela's First Amendment rights.

Rebuttal — Circulators are not government officials they are private individuals who gather signatures to qualify an initiative of a recall petition. Recall allegations were published on the website R4WCSD.com. The Facebook page mentioned is administered by private community members. Restricting access to a Facebook page is not a violation of first amendment rights. The First Amendment right protects government restrictions of free speech. The Facebook page is not operated by a government official or agency therefore violation of First Amendment rights is not of concern.

Challenge -

 School board members and circulators induced and coerced signatures from unsuspecting electors using false statements and bribes, despite knowing the truth from Angela's public press release.

Rebuttal - This statement is entirely unfounded and misleading. There is no evidence to support the claim that school board members or circulators induced or coerced signatures from electors through false statements or bribes. The circulators acted within the bounds of the law, and any claims about misleading electors are based on opinion rather than fact. Furthermore, Angela's public press release, while important, does not negate the fact that the petition followed all proper procedures, and those electors signed voluntarily. The accusations of coercion and dishonesty are simply not substantiated by the facts surrounding the petition process.

Other Challengs/Rebuttals:

Challenge - r4wcsd.com and Residents For Wrightstown Community School District Face Book page did not state they were acting separate from Wrightstown Community School District, and several signers were confused as they thought the recall was being sponsored by WCSD.

Rebuttal — This statement is false. See **Exhibit W** where the Face Book page specifically states "this is not an official school board page. This page is not administered or put out by the school district. It's a page created by and for the residents of our school district." Furthermore, the r4wcsd.com page also has a disclaimer which can be viewed on **Exhibit X**.

Challenge - District should reject page 107 of the petition because the circulator failed to provide a street address as required by state law.

Rebuttal - Rayn Warner discussed this issue with Board Clerk Tony Decker on February 24, 2025 (See Exhibit AA). Tony Decker stated that Jen Vande Hey could properly fill out her portion as required by state law on a photocopy of the sheet that was originally submitted. This document is included behind the Exhibits provided. Therefore, all signatures on page 107 should be included in the Recall Petition count.

Challenge - Melinda Lemke and Tiffany Van Vreede held administrator roles for the Residents for Wrightstown Community School District page which is viewed as a conflict of interest.

Rebuttal – Per **Exhibit Y and Z**, both Melinda Menting Lemke and Tiffany Van Vreede were changed from administrator role to member role on December 4, 2024 which was well before the Intent to Circulate a Petition was submitted.



If you have signed a petition to recall Angela Hansen-Winker and wish to remove your name from that petition, there are a few items to keep in mind.

To remove your name from a signed recall petition, please email Rayn Warner at raynw@yahoo.com and also email me at decker@wrightstown.k12.wi.us

Include your name, address, and reason for removal. Typical removal reasons are something along
the line that you felt the circulator of the petition misled you in some way shape or form. You don't
have to go into detail. A simple "I felt I was misled about the recall reasons" statement will suffice.
By the way, just changing your mind or claiming ignorance of the recall reason is not a valid reason
to have your name removed.

Each person who signed a petition must email both Rayn and I. You may not list multiple names on a single email.

Example - if a married couple wants to have their names removed, each person must email Rayn
and I, and each email must contain name, address, and reason for removal. There cannot be
multiple names on a single removal request. If there are multiple names listed, the person sending
the email will be removed, but the other(s) listed must submit their own request.

You must request to have your name removed prior to the recall package being submitted. Any removal requests after recall package submission will not be processed.

 Rayn has up until 5:00 p.m. on February 16, 2025, to submit the recall package but can submit it any time before that.

After emailing me, I will confirm receipt of your removal request.

Once the recall package is submitted, I will verify all valid signature removal requests have been crossed out on the petition paperwork and will not be counted.

RECALL OF LOCAL ELECTED OFFICIALS

August 2020

Introduction

Recall gives voters the right to reconsider their choice of an elected official; however, it does not automatically result in removal of an official from office. It provides an opportunity for voters to require an elected official to run for office again before the expiration of his or her term. The requirements for initiating recall efforts are very specific and must be carefully followed.

The statutory provisions for recalling local elected officials are provided in Wis. Stat. § 9.10 and Wis. Admin. Code EL Ch. 2. The requirements include filing a campaign registration statement and statement of intent to circulate a recall petition with the appropriate filing officer, and preparing, circulating, and filing a recall petition.

A Glossary of Terms used in the discussion of recall procedures is found on pages 10.

Recall of Local Elected Officials: Wis. Stat. §§ 9.10(1)(a) and 9.10(4)

The qualified electors of any city, village, town, town sanitary district, or school district may petition for the recall of any incumbent elected official by filing a petition with the same official or agency with whom nomination papers or declarations of candidacy for the office are filed, demanding the recall of the officeholder. This is a statutory extension of the right to recall congressional, judicial, legislative, or county officials found in the Wisconsin Constitution since November, 1926. See *Wisconsin Constitution, Article XIII, Section 12*.

Recall of Congressional, County and State Officials

The qualified electors of any congressional, judicial, legislative, county, or of any prosecutorial unit may also petition for the recall of any incumbent elected official. Please see the Wisconsin Elections Commission Manual "Recall of Congressional, County, and State Officials" for information on this process.

Who Can be Recalled?

Any local elected officeholder who has served a minimum of one year of the term for which he or she was most recently elected, as of the date the recall petition is offered for filing, can be recalled. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2)(s).

After one recall petition and recall election, no further recall petition may be filed against the same official during the term for which he or she was elected. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(6).

A recall election should not be held if the regular term of an elected officeholder's position is scheduled for re-election at a Spring Election to be held within six weeks of the date the recall petition is certified as sufficient by the local filing officer.

Who Can Petition for a Recall?

Any qualified elector of the election district from which the officeholder was elected may petition for a recall. A qualified elector is a United States citizen, 18 years of age or older, who has resided in the district or jurisdiction for at least 28 days. Disqualification of electors is addressed in Wis. Stat. § 6.03. A disqualified elector under Wis. Stat. § 6.03, may not petition for a recall. The person who files the recall petition is referred to as the petitioner.

Registration of a Recall Committee: Wis. Stat. §9.10(2)(d)

Before circulating a petition for recall the petitioner must register with the appropriate filing officer (See *Glossary of Terms* for definition of filing officer). Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2)(d), registration is accomplished by filing a Campaign Registration Statement under Wis. Stat. § 11.0902.

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2)(d), a Statement of Intent to Circulate a Recall Petition (Form EL-170i) must be attached to the registration form indicating:

- Petitioner's intent to circulate a recall petition.
- Name of the officeholder for whom recall is sought.
- Reason for the recall which is related to the official responsibilities of the officeholder (the same reason must appear on the petition).

A sample Statement of Intent to Circulate Recall Petition form is included with this manual.

After the petitioner has filed the required registration documents with the filing officer, circulation of the petition may begin.

Circulating the Recall Petition: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2)(d)

Circulation of the recall petition must be completed within 60 days after the petitioner files a campaign registration statement and intent to circulate a recall petition with the filing officer. The completed petition must be offered for filing (submitted to the filing officer), no later than 5:00 p.m. on the 60th day after the date of registration. Any signature on a recall petition that is dated either before the date of registration or more than 60 days after the registration date is invalid.¹

If the deadline for submitting the petition falls on a weekend or holiday, the petition must be filed by the next business day, but valid signatures may not be dated outside of the 60-day circulation window.

¹ Measuring 60 days from the date of registration results in 61 actual days during which petition signatures are valid.

Number of Signatures Required: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(1)

The petition must contain the signatures of qualified electors equal to at least 25% of the vote cast for the office of Governor at the last General Election held within the same district or jurisdiction as that of the officeholder. The filing officer is required to determine, and inform any interested person upon request, the number of signatures required to recall an officeholder of that district or jurisdiction. To calculate the required number of signatures, refer to the election results page of the agency website: http://elections.wi.gov/elections-voting/results.

Petition Format Requirements: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2)

The format of a recall petition must meet the statutory requirements found in Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2). In addition, other requirements relating to preparation and form of the petition are governed by Wis. Stat. § 8.40 and Wis. Admin. Code EL Ch. 2. A sample Recall Petition (EL-170) is included with this manual.

Recall petition requirements:

- Every recall petition must have on its face, at the top of each petition page, in bold print, the words "RECALL PETITION."
- The recall petition must identify the name of the officeholder. Only one officeholder can be named on a recall petition. If more than one officeholder is to be recalled, a separate petition must be circulated and filed for each.
- The petition must contain a statement of the reason for the recall which is related to the official responsibilities of the officeholder.

Each petition must provide a space for electors to:

- Sign their name.
- Print their name.
- List their municipality of residence, along with the post office address, including street and number, if any, or rural route (the address must be complete and clearly show that the signer resides in the district or jurisdiction represented by the officeholder).
- List the date of signing.
- Each separate sheet of a recall petition must contain a completed Certification of Circulator.

Individual Signature Requirements

The specific requirements that apply to each signature on a petition to recall a local officeholder are listed here and can also be found in Wis. Stat. § 8.40 and Wis. Admin. Code EL § 2.09, which incorporates by reference the requirements of Wis. Admin. Code EL § 2.05.

• The signature listed must be that of a qualified elector of the jurisdiction or district represented by the officeholder.

- The legible, printed name of the signer.
- The full address, including municipality of residence, of each signer must be listed on the
 petition and must be within the election district or jurisdiction of the officeholder.
- Each signature must be dated when it is affixed to the petition.
- The date of the signature must be within 60 days from the date the recall petitioner registered with the filing officer. The date of the signature may not be before the date the recall petitioner registered with the filing officer.
- The date of the signature must not be later than the date of the circulator's signature in the Certification of Circulator.

Certification of Circulator: Wis. Stats. §§ 9.10(2)(a) and 8.40(2)

Each page of a recall petition must contain the Certification of Circulator. The language of the certification must comply with the requirements of Wis. Stat. § 8.40(2). The certification section on each page must be completed by the circulator, <u>after</u> the signatures are obtained.

Specific requirements of the circulator are:

- The circulator must list his or her full address, including municipality of residence, street and number, if any, or rural route. Other information, such as state of residence and zip code, is not required.
- The circulator must sign and date the certification <u>after</u> he or she has obtained the signatures.
- The person signing as circulator must have personally circulated the petition and personally obtained each of the signatures on the paper.
- The circulator must state that he or she is aware that falsifying the certification is punishable under Wis. Stat. § 12.13(3)(a).

Review of Petition by Filing Officer: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a)

The filing officer should notify the official subject to the recall that a petition has been offered for filing against him or her. This is not required by law, but is a recommended practice.

Within 31 days after the petition is offered for filing, the filing officer is required to determine the sufficiency of the petition. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a). (See also Wis. Admin. Code EL §§ 2.05 and 2.09, regarding the treatment and sufficiency of petitions.) A careful review of the petition must be completed by the filing officer to verify that:

- The format of the petition follows the requirements of Wis. Stat. § 8.40.
- The petition contains all the information required under Wis. Stat. § 9.10 and clearly informs the electorate of the intentions of the petitioner.

- Each signer is a qualified elector of the district represented by the officeholder.
- The address listed by each signer is within the district represented by the officeholder.
- The date of signing for each elector is within the 60-day circulation period, and not later than the date the certification was signed by the circulator.
- The circulator has properly completed the Certification of Circulator (See previous section for requirements of circulator.)

The information on the petition is presumed to be valid. The filing officer is not required to consult extrinsic resources in reviewing the petitions, but may do so if time permits.

Certificate of Sufficiency/Insufficiency: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a)

The filing officer's findings must be stated in a certificate attached to the petition within 31 days after the petition is offered for filing. The certificate must state the number of petition sheets filed with the filing officer and the number of valid signatures. If the petition is found to be sufficient, the filing officer shall file the petition and transmit the certificate and petition to the appropriate local governing body, subject to special note in next paragraph. The local governing body, school board, or board of election commissioners shall then promptly call a recall election. If the petition is found to be insufficient, the certificate shall state the specific items creating the insufficiency.

Special Note: The filing officer should allow at least 10 days after the petition has been offered for filing to issue a certificate of sufficiency to allow time for a challenge to the petition.

Correcting an Insufficient Petition: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a)

If a recall petition is found to be insufficient, the certificate shall state the specific items creating the insufficiency. A petitioner may amend the petition by filing affidavits or other proof correcting certain insufficiencies within 5 days following the attachment of the original certificate by the filing officer. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a).

Correctable insufficiencies as prescribed by Wis. Stat. § 9.10(2)(e) and (r) include, but are not limited to:

- The failure of the circulator to sign the certification or to include all required information.
- The person signing the petition omitted the date or wrote the incorrect date.
- The failure of the circulator to write his or her complete address on the certification.

Within 2 days after the amended petition is offered for filing, the filing officer shall again carefully examine the face of the petition to determine its sufficiency and attach an amended certificate stating the findings. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a).

If the filing officer makes a finding that the petition is sufficient, he or she shall immediately attach a certificate of sufficiency, file the petition, and provide it to the local governing body, school board, or board of election commissioners who shall then promptly call a recall election.

Challenges to a Recall Petition: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a)

Within 10 days after a recall petition is offered for filing with the filing officer, the officeholder can challenge the sufficiency of the recall petition. The challenge must be made in the form of a written, sworn complaint and filed with the filing officer who received the recall petition. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) and Wis Admin. Code EL Ch. 2.

The challenge must specify any alleged insufficiency in the petition. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code Ch. EL 2. Any challenge to the validity of signatures on a recall petition must demonstrate by affidavits or other supporting evidence a failure to comply with statutory requirements. The burden of proof is on the challenger. The information on a recall petition is presumed to be valid unless proven otherwise. Wis. Admin. Code EL Ch. 2.05(4).

Some of the grounds for challenge and the resulting effect are:

- Grounds: An elector has signed the recall petition more than once.

 Resulting Effect: The second and subsequent signatures are not counted.
- Grounds: A person signed the name of another elector.

 Resulting Effect: The signature shall not be counted, unless the elector was unable to sign due to physical disability and authorized the individual to sign on his or her behalf. In this case, a notation clarifying the situation should be made on the petition by the signer.
- Grounds: An individual is ineligible to sign the petition because he or she is not a qualified elector of the district or jurisdiction.

 Resulting Effect: The signature may not be counted.
- Grounds: A challenger establishes that the purpose of the petition was misrepresented by the circulator and the signer was not aware of the purpose of the petition.

 Resulting Effect: The signature may not be counted.
- Grounds: A signature is obtained before the first day for circulation, after the last day for circulation, or after the date of certification contained in the certificate of circulator.
 Resulting Effect: The signature may not be counted.

When a challenge is made, the filing officer must review the challenge, all rebuttals, and replies, and make a determination of sufficiency within 14 days after the expiration of time allowed for such challenges, rebuttals, and replies as set forth below. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a).

Rebuttals and Replies: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a)

The filing officer is required to determine the sufficiency of the petition within 31 days after the petition is offered for filing. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(a). If a challenge is filed within 10 days after the petition is offered for filing, the following schedule for a rebuttal, reply, and final sufficiency determination totals the maximum 31 days for determining sufficiency of the petition.

Within 5 days after a challenge is filed, the petitioner may file, with the filing officer, a written rebuttal to the challenge.

Within 2 days after the filing of a rebuttal, the officeholder may file a reply to any new matter raised in the rebuttal.

Within 14 days after the expiration of time allowed for the officeholder to file a reply to the rebuttal, the filing officer shall file the certificate of sufficiency/insufficiency.

Appeal of Determination of Sufficiency: Wis. Stat. § 5.06(1)

After a certificate of sufficiency/insufficiency has been issued by the filing officer, any elector of the jurisdiction or district dissatisfied with the determination (including the incumbent officeholder or the petitioner) may file a written sworn complaint with the Wisconsin Elections Commission. The complaint must be filed promptly (within 10 days of the date that the complainant knew or should have known of the determination) so as not to prejudice the rights of any other party.

The complaint must include statements of fact based on the knowledge and belief of the complainant that:

- The issuance of the certificate is contrary to law, or
- The filing officer abused his or her discretion with respect to the determination of sufficiency/insufficiency.

The complaint may be accompanied by relevant supporting documents and a request that the filing officer be required to correct his or her determination and issue a new certificate that is consistent with law. Wis. Stat. § 5.06(1). The Wisconsin Elections Commission will conduct an investigation and decide the matter. The Commission may affirm or reverse the decision of the filing officer and state its findings in an order which will be immediately sent to the filing officer. If the filing officer's decision is reversed, the Commission's order will require the filing officer to correct the determination, and issue a new certificate accordingly.

Any election official or complainant who is aggrieved by the Commission's order may appeal the decision of the Commission to the circuit court no later than 30 days after issuance of the order. The proper jurisdiction is the court for the county where the filing officer conducts business or where the complainant resides. The Commission's order remains in effect while the appeal is pending, unless the circuit court orders otherwise. Wis. Stat. § 5.06(8). The Wisconsin Elections Commission may issue a stay of the recall election, while it considers the officeholder's petition for review.

For more information about filing a complaint with the Wisconsin Elections Commission, please contact the WEC at (608) 266-8005 or review information found on the agency website at http://elections.wi.gov.

Date of Recall Election: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(d)

The governing body shall call a recall election promptly after a certificate of sufficiency is filed. The recall election shall be held on the Tuesday of the 6th week commencing after the date on which the certificate of sufficiency is filed. If the 6th Tuesday is a legal holiday, the recall election shall be held on the first day after Tuesday which is not a legal holiday.

Recall Primary: Wis. Stat. §9.10(4)(f) and (g)

If more than two persons compete for the office, a recall primary will be held on the date originally set for the recall election. The recall election will then be held on the Tuesday of the fourth week after the recall primary. If that day is a legal holiday, the recall election will be held on the first day after Tuesday which is not a legal holiday. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(g).

The two candidates receiving the highest number of votes in the recall primary will be certified to appear on the ballot in the recall election. However, if the incumbent officeholder or any other candidate at the recall primary receives the *majority* of the total number of votes cast in the recall primary, that person shall be elected to serve for the residue of the unexpired term of the incumbent and the recall election will not be held. Wis. Stat. §9.10(4)(f).

Candidates at the Recall Election: Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(e).

The officeholder against whom the recall petition is filed shall automatically appear on the ballot as a candidate at the recall election, or at the primary if a primary is required, unless the officeholder resigns within 10 days after the date the certificate of sufficiency is issued.

All other candidates must file a registration statement, circulate and file nomination papers (EL-169), and file a declaration of candidacy (EL-162) with the appropriate filing officer. A Statement of Economic Interest (SEI) may be required for certain offices. For more information regarding whether an SEI form must be filed, please contact the Wisconsin Ethics Commission at (608) 266-8123 or ethics@wi.gov.

1) Campaign Registration Statement

Candidates at the recall election must register with the appropriate filing officer by filing a Campaign Registration Statement, as soon as they form the intent to be a candidate and before receiving contributions or making disbursements. The deadline for registration is 5:00 p.m. on the 4th Tuesday before the date of the recall election or recall primary.

2) Declaration of Candidacy (EL-162)

A Declaration of Candidacy (EL-162) must also be filed by candidates at the recall election no later than the deadline for filing nomination papers, which is 5:00 p.m. on the 4th Tuesday before the date of the recall election or recall primary. The candidates must designate on this form the same office title as appears on the nomination papers.

3) Nomination Papers for Nonpartisan Office (EL-169)

Candidates at the recall election for city, village, town, or town sanitary district offices must circulate and file nomination papers, regardless of the method used for nomination at other elections. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(e). Candidates at the recall election for school district offices only file nomination papers if that is the method used for regular elections. The proper form is Nomination Paper for Nonpartisan Office (EL-169).

The nomination papers must contain at least the required minimum number of valid signatures of qualified electors and must be filed no later than 5:00 p.m. on the 4th Tuesday before the date of the recall election or recall primary. Candidates in the recall election may begin circulating

nomination papers after the governing body has scheduled the election. For the number of signatures required, check with the filing officer, or refer to Wis. Stat. § 8.10(3).

4) Statement of Economic Interests (SEI)

A Statement of Economic Interest (SEI) may be required for certain offices. For more information, please contact the Wisconsin Ethics Commission at (608) 266-8123 or ethics@wi.gov.

Candidates for the recall election must designate, on their nomination papers, which position they are seeking, and in the case of multiple positions for at-large seats, which officeholder they are opposing. If more than one village trustee, town supervisor, or school board member is being recalled, the nomination papers must clearly state which of the officeholders the candidate is opposing. For example, for at-large seats such as school board member, the nomination papers must state "School Board Member for the position currently held by (insert officeholder's name)."

If a candidate fails to file any of the required forms by the filing deadline of 5:00 p.m. on the 4th Tuesday before the recall election or recall primary, the candidate's name will not be placed on the ballot.

Recall of More Than One Officeholder

When more than one petition is filed at the same time for the recall of more than one officeholder from the same district, each petition must be handled separately. If the recall petitions are found to be valid, a separate election contest will be required for each incumbent officeholder. For example, if valid petitions are filed to recall two school board members, there will be two recall elections. If only one of these positions requires a recall primary, because three or more candidates are seeking this position, the recall primary will be held on the same day as the recall election for the other position.

When more than one position is to be listed on a single ballot, each position must be listed separately with instructions to electors to vote for one candidate for each position.

Interim Position of Incumbent

If the officeholder resigns *after* the completion of the petitioner's registration, but before the filing of the petition, or before the primary or election, the recall proceeds unaffected. However, the time of resignation may affect whether the resigned officeholder appears on the ballot. If the officeholder resigns more than 10 days after the date of certification of the recall petition, the resigned officeholder remains on the ballot for the recall primary or recall election. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(4)(e).

If the officeholder does not resign, he or she continues to perform the duties of the office. If the incumbent is defeated at the recall election, he or she continues to perform the duties until a certificate of election is issued to the successor. Wis. Stat. § 9.10(5)(b).

Campaign Finance Disclosure Requirements

Petitioners seeking to recall elected officials and recall candidates must comply with the campaign finance disclosure requirements of Wisconsin law, Wis. Stat. Ch. 11. For questions about campaign finance requirements, please contact the Wisconsin Ethics Commission at (608) 266-8123 or ethics@wi.gov.

Glossary of Terms

Certification of Circulator – a statement at the bottom of each sheet of a petition, which is signed and dated by the circulator.

Campaign Registration Statement – Wisconsin Ethics Commission form, filed by petitioner to register intent to file a recall petition; each candidate at the recall election, except for the officeholder; and any others actively supporting or opposing the recall effort.

Circulation period – a 60-day period beginning the day after registration when petition signatures can be collected.

Circulator – a qualified elector who circulates a petition. A circulator is not required to be a resident of the jursidiction or district subject to recall, but must be otherwise a qualified elector if he or she were a resident of Wisconsin. Wis. Stat. § 6.03.

Declaration of Candidacy – Wisconsin Elections Commission form (EL-162), a statement of qualification to hold office if elected, to be filed by all candidates at the recall election, except for the officeholder. (Sample is included with this manual.)

Filed – the recall papers have been reviewed and a certificate of sufficiency or insufficiency is attached by the filing officer.

Filing Officer – for town, village, or city offices, the appropriate municipal clerk. For school district offices, the school district clerk. For City of Milwaukee offices, the Board of Election Commissioners.

Nomination Papers – Wisconsin Elections Commission form (EL-169), for nonpartisan local offices, to be filed by candidates at the recall election, except for the officeholder. (Sample is included with this manual.)

Offered for filing – submitting the petition to the filing officer for review for certificate of sufficiency or insufficiency (note: the filing officer should not accept partial petitions and make partial determinations of sufficiency until such time as the petitioner is submitting the petition for a complete review for sufficiency and the filing officer is prepared to make the sufficiency determination.)

Officeholder – the elected official for whom recall is sought.

Petition – Wisconsin Elections Commission form (EL-170), a document which conforms to Wis. Stats. §§8.40 and 9.10(2). (Sample is included with this manual.)

Petitioner – the individual or group initiating and filing the recall petition.

Registration – the act of filing a Campaign Registration Statement with the appropriate filing officer along with a Statement of Intent to Recall, which includes the name of the officeholder and the reason for recall.

Sworn Complaint - a written challenge, sworn to before a person authorized to administer oaths.

Questions concerning recall of Congressional, State and Couny elected officials should be directed to the county clerk or to the Wisconsin Elections Commission. 
