is about accessible voting equipment, and they may need to touch the

equipment to answer these questions. However, reviewers will not

touch the screen or use the equipment. Polling places are chosen somewhat randomly. However, priority is given to sites that have gone the longest without a review. Clerks will not be notified beforehand if their polling place has been chosen for review.

Clerks should inform chief inspectors of this program. Site reviewers will begin their visits by introducing themselves to the chief inspector and providing them with a letter explaining the review program and giving the Accessibility Specialist's name and contact information. The chief inspector should keep this letter with other Election Day materials.

Once the reviewer completes their survey, they will follow up with the chief inspector before leaving. About 60 days after the election the clerk will receive an email notifying them that their report is ready and
