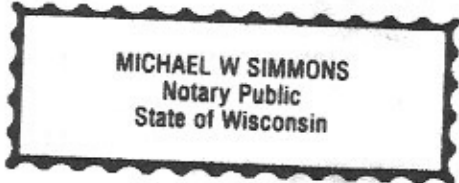

I, Richard Strohm, allege that:

The nomination signatures collected by Josh Heilman, Las Vegas, NV, 89149; on behalf of Kevin Nicholson, on pages 239, 247, 248, 249, and 260, must be disqualified as the signatures of the Electors were obtained after the date of certification of the circulator. Seeing the signatures were certified on 5/13/2018, but collected on 5/14/2018, in violation of Elections Commission Rule 2.05(14) they must be disqualified.

In addition, all signatures obtained by Joshua Heilman of Las Vegas, NV, 89149; Patrick Cleary of Broomall, PA, 19008; Jonathan Ewing of Madison, AL, 35758; Violet Purama of Brooksville, FL, 34601; John Vinson of Tarpon Springs, FL; Linda Reid of Holiday, FL, 34691; Alivia Gladem, Genoa, IL, 60135; Madeline Jory, Hunstville, AL; are disqualified as they are not qualified electors in the State of Wisconsin. Wisconsin Statute 6.10 establishes elector residency requirements and defines that a qualified elector in Wisconsin must reside in Wisconsin. Seeing as Joshua Heilman of Las Vegas, NV, 89149; Patrick Cleary of Broomall, PA, 19008; Jonathan Ewing of Madison, AL, 35758; Violet Purama of Brooksville, FL, 34601; John Vinson of Tarpon Springs, FL; Linda Reid of Holiday, FL, 34691; Alivia Gladem, Genoa, IL, 60135; and Madeline Jory of Hunstville, AL, do not reside in the state of Wisconsin, the more than 2,700 signatures they certified and collected must be disqualified.
