## Summary Biography of Meagan Wolfe

Meagan Wolfe was appointed as Interim Administrator of the Wisconsin Elections Commission on March 2, 2018. The bi-partisan, six-member Commission unanimously reaffirmed its appointment in January of 2019. The Wisconsin State Senate unanimously confirmed her appointment as Administrator on May 15, 2019 through June 30, 2023.

Wolfe serves as Wisconsin's chief election official and manages a staff which administers and enforces Wisconsin laws related to elections and voting. She also serves on the boards of several national election organizations where she advocates for the needs of Wisconsin's 1,922 local election officials and voters.

Prior to her appointment as Administrator, Wolfe served the agency as Assistant Administrator beginning in 2017. In that position, she managed agency staff members and IT team responsible for Wisconsin's statewide voter registration system, supervising the implementation of initiatives related to the system and other IT applications of the Commission. She also headed the Commission's elections security planning efforts. In addition, Wolfe assisted with the overall management and leadership of the WEC staff.

Wolfe joined state service as the Voter Services Election Specialist in 2011. Initially, she developed and implemented voter outreach communications and resources, both on a public information scale and in assisting individual voters. Wolfe conducted countless presentations about the Photo ID law and other voting and registration rules and processes, and developed many resources used by local election officials and organizations to educate voters. Later, she led the multi-year effort to assess the usability and accessibility of the MyVote Wisconsin website and to relaunch the website, making it is easier for voters to use and easier for clerks to assist military and overseas voters.
