Dear Chairperson Hitt:

This is a friendly reminder that Saturday, November 30, 2019, is the statutory deadline for county or local political parties to submit nominations of qualified persons who are willing to serve as Election Inspectors (poll workers) and members of the Municipal Board of Absentee Ballot Canvassers (MB-ABC), where required, in Wisconsin municipalities for the coming two years. *If the municipal clerk does not have office hours on Saturday, the deadline moves to Monday, December 2, 2019.* Wis. Stat. § 990.01(4)(c).

Please inform your county party chairs and applicable local party committeemen and committeewomen of their opportunity and responsibility to assist in the appointment process. The county or local party officeholder(s) charged with submitting the lists depends on the municipality and is set out in Wis. Stat. § 7.30(4). Please see the chart included with this letter. The applicable party officeholder(s) is responsible for submitting lists of nominated individuals to the Mayor, Village President or Town Board Chairperson of the municipality for each polling place. To facilitate the process, please provide a copy of the list to the municipal clerk, as well. In the City of Milwaukee, the lists are submitted to the Milwaukee City Board of Election Commissioners.

The county or local party official submitting the lists must certify that all nominees on the list have been contacted and have agreed to serve as an election official. Wis. Stat. § 7.30(4)(b).

The list must be submitted by the deadline in order to ensure appointment of the named nominees. Additional names may be added to the list at any time, provided the initial list was submitted timely. Nominated individuals must be qualified electors of the county in which the official will serve. The list may also designate any individuals as first-choice nominees, and if those individuals qualify, the governing body must appoint each first-choice nominee for as long as positions are available. Please consult Wis. Stat. § 7.30(4) for exact instructions. If a local party does not submit a list, or does not submit enough names, the Mayor, Village President, Town Board Chairperson or Board of Election Commissioners may nominate qualified individuals on a non-partisan basis, without regard to party affiliation. In this case qualified electors of the

municipality must be given priority for appointment. The governing body of the municipality appoints the inspectors for a two-year term before December 31, 2019.

A reminder to municipal clerks with respect to their duty to use names provided by the political parties when appointing inspectors has been posted to the agency website. For your information, the reminder can be accessed here.

Thank you for your assistance in ensuring that Wisconsin's elections remain open, fair and transparent, by providing our municipal clerks with your lists of qualified nominees.
