

Movers Review Process

General Overview

As part of Wisconsin's membership in the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC), WEC contacts voters ERIC has flagged as potential movers. ERIC obtains data from a variety of sources such as the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, other participating states, and the National Change of Address (NCOA) database from the United States Postal Service.



If a postcard is returned to the clerk's office and the clerk is choosing to pursue deactivation for this record, they **MUST** send the additional **Undeliverable 30-Day Notice Letter** to the voter before inactivating the voter record.

* Decisions to modify these voter records are to be made by clerks at the municipal level. Clerks are encouraged to contact their municipal attorney for assistance in interpreting applicable statutes such as Wis. Stat. § 6.50(3).*



Voters who receive the postcard and have moved within the State of Wisconsin may choose to reregister online, by mail, at their clerk's office, or at their polling place on the next Election Day. **NOTE: The postcard provides affirmation options if the voter has not moved.**

Should the **Undeliverable 30-Day Notice Letter** come back as undeliverable the clerk can process and inactivate the voter record in WisVote:

- The Status Reason should be **Undeliverable** if it comes back without a forwarding or new address on the return piece.
- The Status Reason should be **Moved** if it has a new or forwarding address on the return piece.
