### Resources for Ballot Access Determinations

The April 5, 2022 Spring Elections is fast approaching, and clerks will soon be reviewing the different documents that allow a candidate to be placed on the April ballot. Copies of these documents and helpful checklists can be found [here](#).

Candidates running in municipalities



that require nomination papers will need to return a completed Declaration of Candidacy (EL-162), Campaign Registration Statement (CF-1), and their nomination papers by January 4, 2022 in order to be placed on the ballot. Whether you are an experienced clerk, or this is your first filing period, the WEC has training materials to help remind you of information that needs to be on the nomination papers and some commonly seen issues that appear on the nomination papers. Candidates that are nominated using the caucus process are required to file a Campaign Registration Statement (CF-1) and a Declaration of Candidacy (EL-162) within five days of being notified that they were nominated at the caucus. These forms can be completed and filed with the clerk on the night of the caucus if the candidate is present. If the candidate is not present at the caucus, the clerk should send a certified letter to the candidate letting them know they were nominated and have five days to return the necessary documents to be placed on the ballot.

### Badger Voters: Your Go-To Resource for Voter Data

It's a question many clerks probably hear frequently around nomination paper season. "Say, can I get a list of voters within a particular district/municipality?" And while clerks certainly have the ability to print out lists like these, technically the statutes require that fees be collected from the requestor to help "cover both the cost of reproduction and the cost of maintaining the list at the state and local level." Wis. Stat. § 6.36(6).

That's where Badger Voters comes in. Instead of taking the time yourself to create this list and that, each with all their own unique parameters and qualifications, we encourage you to send candidates and their campaigns to [BadgerVoters.wi.gov](http://BadgerVoters.wi.gov). There they can create their own requests for voter data (even custom ones!), get an estimate, submit their payment, and download their requested data all in one sitting. Not only does this take a little work off your plate, but it helps ensure that we're gathering the revenue to maintain Wisconsin's voter lists and keep convenient services like Badger Voters up and running.
