This complaint is brought under Wis. Stat. § 5.06.

- I, Abraham A. Voelker, allege that:
- Complainant is a candidate for the Barron County Board of Supervisors for District
 in the Spring 2022 election.
- 2. On or about January 7, 2022, Complainant filed a complaint challenging an opponent's nomination papers ("Challenge") with the election filing officer, Barron County Clerk DeeAnn Cook ("Respondent"). A true and correct copy of that complaint is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.
- 3. On or about January 11, 2022, Complainant received from Respondent via email a decision ruling against Complainant's challenge ("**Decision**"). A true and correct copy of that decision is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**.

Appeal of Respondent's Ruling to Wisconsin Elections Commission

- 4. Wis. Stat. § 5.06 sets forth requirements for election compliance and appeal.
- 5. Wis. Stat. § 5.06(1) states that:

"Whenever any elector of a jurisdiction or district served by an election official believes that a decision or action of the official or the failure of the official to act with respect to any matter concerning nominations, qualifications of candidates, ... election administration or conduct of elections is contrary to law, or the official has abused the discretion vested in him or her by law with respect to any such matter, the elector may file a written sworn

complaint with the commission requesting that the official be required to conform his or her conduct to the law, be restrained from taking any action inconsistent with the law or be required to correct any action or decision inconsistent with the law or any abuse of the discretion vested in him or her by law."

- 6. In Challenge, Complainant argued that an election opponent violated Wis. Stat. §§ 8.10, 8.15 and Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05 by filing nomination papers that did not have a circulator signature, then returning at a later date and attempting a correction by signing the already-filed nomination papers' circulator signature field rather than filing a separate affidavit.
- 7. In Decision, Respondent ruled against Complainant's Challenge and found that Complainant's election opponent's nomination papers are valid.
- 8. For the reasons provided in Challenge, Complainant believes that Respondent's interpretation of statute and code is not in conformance with law, and exceeds Respondent's discretion in administering statute. Therefore per Wis. Stat. § 5.06 Complainant is appealing Respondent's decision to the Wisconsin Elections Commission.

WHEREFORE the Complainant requests:

- (1) that Respondent be required to correct Decision in conformance with the law;
- (2) that Respondent be restrained from taking any further action inconsistent with the law;
- (3) any other relief this Commission deems warranted.

This complaint is brought under Wis. Stat. § 8.07 and Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.07. I, Abraham A. Voelker, allege that:

1. On or about December 2, 2021, Jerry McRoberts ("Respondent") filed signatures and paperwork with Barron County Clerk DeeAnn Cook ("Clerk") to get his name on the April 5, 2022 election ballot for the position of Barron County Board Supervisor for District 19.

Count I - Respondent Failed to Provide Circulator Signature on Nomination Papers

- 2. Wis. Stat. § 8.10 sets forth requirements for nomination for spring elections.
- 3. Wis. Stat. § 8.10(3) states that "[t]he certification of a qualified circulator under s. 8.15 (4) (a) shall be appended to each nomination paper."
- 4. Wis. Stat. § 8.15(4)(a) states that "[t]he certification of a qualified circulator ... shall appear at the bottom of each nomination paper..."
- 5. Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05 sets forth requirements for the treatment and sufficiency of nomination papers.
- 6. Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(14) provides that "[n]o signature on a nomination paper shall be counted unless the elector who circulated the nomination paper completes and signs the certificate of circulator..."

- 7. Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(16) states that "[a]fter a nomination paper has been filed, no signature may be added or removed."
- 8. Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(4) provides that "errors in information contained in a nomination paper, committed by either a signer or a circulator, may be corrected **by an affidavit** of the circulator, an affidavit of the candidate, or an affidavit of a person who signed the nomination paper." (emphasis added).
- 9. Nomination Paper Challenges is a manual published by the Wisconsin Elections Commission, describing itself as:

"summarizing previous decisions of the State Elections Board and the Government Accountability Board related to the most common challenges to nomination papers and other election petitions. It is intended to itemize and consolidate previous decisions which state and local filing officers may rely on as precedents regarding the general legal questions and principles involved."

- 10. On page four of the manual, under the subheading 2.b. Circulator Date and Signature, it states "[t]he circulator may correct errors in the certificate of the circulator, such as the circulator failed to sign or otherwise complete the certificate... If the circulator has not corrected these errors **by affidavit** by the correction deadline, the challenge must be approved and the signatures on those pages struck" (emphasis added).
- 11. On December 15, 2021, Complainant made an in-person visit to the Barron County Clerk's office where Clerk provided Complainant for public inspection three unnumbered pages of Nomination Paper for Nonpartisan Office ("Nomination Paper") filed by Respondent. A true and correct copy of those papers as taken by Complainant's cell phone camera on December 15, 2021 is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**. At this visit Complainant witnessed that the "Signature of circulator" field on every Nomination Paper was blank and Clerk commented that she would contact Respondent about it.

- 12. On January 4, 2022, Complainant again visited the Barron County Clerk's office where Clerk again provided Complainant with the same three unnumbered Nomination Paper pages for a second inspection. A true and correct copy of those papers as taken by Complainant's cell phone camera on January 4, 2022 is attached hereto as **Exhibit B**. At this visit, Complainant witnessed that the "Signature of circulator" field on every Nomination Paper was now filled in with signatures. Complainant inquired the Clerk if she had Respondent come back and fill in this field of the filed Nomination Papers and she responded affirmatively.
- 13. Based on the information above, Complainant believes that Respondent incorrectly filed his Nomination Papers without a circulator signature, and further erred by making changes to the filed Nomination Papers rather than providing a correcting affidavit as required by statute, making the Nomination Papers not valid in accordance with statute.
- 14. Regardless of whether or not Clerk directed Respondent to modify his original filed Nomination Papers rather than file an affidavit, Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(1) states that it is the responsibility of the candidate to "assure that his or her nomination papers are prepared, circulated, signed, and filed in compliance with statutory and other legal requirements."

WHEREFORE the Complainant requests:

- (1) that all Nomination Papers filed by Respondent referred to above be declared not filed in conformance with statute;
- (2) that all Nomination Papers filed by Respondent referred to above be stricken; and
- (3) any other relief this Clerk deems warranted.

Count II - Nomination Papers Invalidated By Respondent's Modification After Filing

- 15. The preceding paragraphs are restated as though fully set forth herein.
- 16. As stated in Count I, Wis. Admin. Code § EL 2.05(16) provides that "[a]fter a nomination paper has been filed, no signature may be added or removed."

18. In the email thread, Complainant inquired "once the forms have already been filed

with the clerk, can they be changed afterward in this way to fix these errors?" to which WEC

Specialist replied that "[Complainant is] correct that these forms cannot be touched or changed

once they have been handed in to the clerk."

19. Complainant further inquired "[i]f the clerk already called in the circulator and had

them modify the forms that were already filed, are those forms still valid for amendment with the

affidavit or have they now been made invalid / challengeable?" and WEC Specialist responded

with "yes, this is challengeable."

20. Based on the information above, Complainant believes that Respondent's

Nomination Papers have been invalidated by adding signatures after having already been filed

with Clerk, in violation of statute.

WHEREFORE the Complainant requests:

(1) that all Nomination Papers filed by Respondent referred to above be declared not

filed in conformance with statute;

(2) that all Nomination Papers filed by Respondent referred to above be stricken;

and

(3) any other relief this Clerk deems warranted.



DECISION OF LOCAL FILING OFFICER REGARDING THE COMPLAINT OF ABRAHAM A. VOELKER AGAINST JERRY McROBERTS

DECISION:

After review of the Complaint filed by Abraham A. Voelker against Jerry McRoberts and after considering the facts and Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter EL 2 entitled Election Related Petitions, it is the decision of this Local Filing Officer, for the reasons set forth below, that the challenge asserted by Abraham A. Voelker is invalid and that Jerry McRoberts has satisfactorily filed his nomination papers to have his name on the ballot for the April election.

Factual Background:

On or about December 2, 2021, Jerry McRoberts filed Nomination Papers for Nonpartisan Office with the Barron County Clerk DeeAnn Cook to have his name placed on the ballot for the April 5, 2022 election for the District 19 seat for the Barron County Board of Supervisors.

On or about December 15, 2021, the Complainant, Abraham A. Voelker, came to the Barron County Clerk's Office and made a public inspection of the documents that Jerry McRoberts filed which consisted of three pages. They were titled "Nomination Paper for Nonpartisan Office". The Complainant took a picture of each of the pages that day and they are attached to his Complaint as Exhibit A. As noted in the Complaint, the "Signature of circulator" line under the "Certification of Circulator" portion of the document was left blank on each of the three pages filed. The address portion was filled out and it was dated 12-2-21. Under the "Name of circulator" line Jerry McRoberts had signed his name on each of the three pages.

On January 4, 2022, the Complainant came to the Barron County Clerk's Office and made a public inspection of the same three pages of the Nomination Paper for Nonpartisan Office. The Complainant took pictures of each of the pages on January 4, 2022 and they are attached to his Complaint as Exhibit B. On each of the three pages under the "Signature of circulator" line Jerry

McRoberts had signed his name. As stated in the Complaint, the Complainant inquired with the Clerk if she had contacted Jerry McRoberts to let him know that he had not signed the documents and if he then came in to sign them, and as noted in the Complaint the answer was in the affirmative.

The Complainant filed the Complaint with the Barron County Clerk on January 7, 2022 at approximately 4:30 pm alleging two counts as follows: Count I – Respondent Failed to Provide Circulator Signature on Nomination Papers; and Count II – Nomination Papers Invalidated By Respondent's Modification After Filing. Pursuant to Wisconsin Administrative Code EL 2.07 (2) (b) the elections commission or the local filing officer shall decide the challenge with or without a hearing after the deadline for filing a response to the challenge, but not later than the date for certifying candidates to the ballot.

Analysis:

Wisconsin Statute Section 8.10 sets forth the requirements for nominations for spring election. It provides that candidates for office to be filled at the spring election shall be nominated by nomination papers which may be circulated no sooner than December 1 preceding the election and may be filed no later than 5 p.m. on the first Tuesday in January preceding the election. In this instance the deadline was January 4, 2022. Section 8.10 (3) provides that "The certification of a qualified circulator under s. 8.15 (4) (a) shall be appended to each nomination paper."

Wisconsin Statute Section 8.15 (4) provides in part that "[t]he certification of a qualified circulator stating his or her residence with street and number, if any, shall appear at the bottom of each nomination paper, stating he or she personally circulated the nomination paper and personally obtained each of the signatures. . . . "

Wisconsin Administrative Code Section EL 2.07 Challenges to nomination papers provides that the local filing officer shall review any verified complaint concerning the sufficiency of nomination papers of a candidate for local office that is filed with the local filing officer under s. 8.07, Stats. The filing officer shall apply the standards in s. EL 2.05 to determine the sufficiency of nomination papers.

Section EL 207 (2) provides in part that "[a]ny challenge to the sufficiency of a nomination paper shall be made by verified complaint" and that "[t]he filing officer shall make arrangements to have a copy of the challenge delivered to the challenged candidate within 24 hours of the filing of the challenge complaint". Additionally, s. EL 207 (2) provides that "[a]ny challenge to the sufficiency of a nomination paper shall be filed within 3 calendar days after the filing deadline for the challenged nomination papers."

In this case, a verified complaint was filed at approximately 4:30 pm on January 7, 2022, which is within 3 days of the filing deadline of January 4, 2022. The challenge complaint was personally delivered to Jerry McRoberts on the evening of January 7, 2022 within the 24 hour required time period.

The Complainant request under Count I that all Nomination Papers filed by the Respondent be declared not filed in conformance with the statute and be stricken based upon the fact that the

signature of the circulator was not on the certification section of the documents when they were filed with the local filing officer. The Complaint cites Wis. Admin. Code Sec. EL 2.05 (14) which provides that "[n]o signature on a nomination paper shall be counted unless the elector who circulated the nomination paper completes and signs the certificate of circulator..."

The Complaint further argues that after a nomination paper has been filed that no signature may be added or removed and that errors contained in nomination papers may be corrected by an affidavit; however, a signature was added but no affidavit of correction was filed. In support the Complaint cites Wis. Admin. Code Sec. EL 2.05 (16) that "[a]fter a nomination paper has been filed, no signature may be added or removed." Additionally, Wis. Admin. Code Sec. EL 2.05 (4) provides that "errors in information contained in a nomination paper, committed by either a signer or a circulator, may be corrected by an affidavit of the circulator, an affidavit of the candidate, or an affidavit of a person who signed the nomination paper".

The Complaint alleges under Count II that the Nomination Papers were invalidated by the Respondent's modification after the filing of the papers. The Complaint again cites Wis. Admin. Code Sec. EL 2.05 (16) that "[a]fter a nomination paper has been filed, no signature may be added or removed." The Complainant believes that Respondent's Nomination Papers had been invalidated by his adding his signature after having filed the papers with the Clerk, and requests under Count II that all Nomination Papers filed by the Respondent be declared not filed in conformance with the statute and be stricken based upon the fact that the signature of the circulator was not on the certification section of the documents when they were filed with the local filing officer.

Count I:

As to the allegations raised in Count I the Complaint relies upon Wisconsin Administrative Code Sections 2.05 (14); 2.05 (16) and 2.05 (4).

Section 2.05 (14) provides that "[n]o signature on a nomination paper shall be counted unless the elector who circulated the nomination paper completes and signs the certificate of circulator and does so after, not before the paper is circulated." There is no doubt that the signature was not signed before it was circulated. In fact, that is the issue in that it was signed after it had been filed. Subdivision (14) requires the circulator to complete and sign the nomination paper after it had be circulated; however, nothing in sub. (14) addresses the issue of whether it is permissible for the circulator to sign the document after it has been filed but before the filing deadline. Therefore, it must be read in conjunction with Section 2.05 (16).

Section 2.05 (16) provides that "[a]fter a nomination paper has been filed, no signature may be added or removed. After a nomination paper has been signed, but before it has been filed, a signature may be removed by the circulator." The Complainant interprets this to apply to both to signers and to the circulator; however, this is not so clear. A reading of the entire paragraph leads to a different conclusion. The language is directed to signers, not the circulator. The last sentence speaks to the death of a signer after the nomination paper has been signed and does not have the effect of invalidating the signature. The second sentence speaks to the ability of the circulator to remove a signature of a signer before it is filed. Therefore, the language in the

first sentence that after the nomination paper has been filed that no signature may be added or removed logically means the signature of signers and not the circulator.

Section 2.05 (4) provides as follows:

"Any information which appears on a nomination paper is entitled to a presumption of validity. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, errors in information contained in a nomination paper, committed by either a signer, or a circulator, may be corrected by an affidavit of the circulator, an affidavit of the candidate, or an affidavit of a person who signed the nomination paper. The person giving the correcting affidavit shall have personal knowledge of the correct information and the correcting affidavit shall be file with the filing officer not later than three calendar days after the applicable statutory due date for the nomination papers."

First, this paragraph provides that there is a presumption of validity regarding the information that appears on the nomination papers. Secondly, it provides that an affidavit correcting an error "may" be filed, but does not mandate that is shall be file.

In this situation, there was not so much an error in information, but rather the failure of the circulator to sign the under the certification section. This deficiency was corrected by the addition of the signature prior to the deadline for filing the papers despite the fact that they had already been filed. Nothing in Section EL 2.05 prevents the circulator from signing the certification after filing but prior to the deadline. Based upon this interpretation an affidavit of correction is not necessary.

Count II:

Count II relies again on the interpretation of Section 2.05 (16) that "[a]fter a nomination paper has been filed, no signature may be added or removed" to the proposition that the Nomination Papers were invalidated by the Respondent's modification after the filing. In short, by adding his signature under the certification section as circulator. As addressed above under the analysis of Count I, I do not find this interpretation of the Administrative Code to be correct. This section speaks to the signatures of the signers and not the circulator.

Conclusion:

Wisconsin Administrative Code Section EL 2.05 (5) provides, that "[w]here any required item of information on a nomination paper is incomplete, the filing officer shall accept the information as complete if there has been substantial compliance with the law."

Based upon the facts and circumstances involved, I find that there has been substantial compliance. Jerry McRoberts did sign the nomination paper, but signed it where it states "Name of Circulator". Additionally, he did come personally before me and sign each of the pages of the Nomination Papers in the correct location prior to the deadline for filing the papers. There was no question that he circulated the papers himself and he is not a person unknown to me. There was a good faith attempt to correct what was lacking and I find that

there was substantial compliance with the requirements under the law. Therefore, I find that the challenge is invalid and that Jerry McRoberts has satisfactorily filed his nomination papers to have his name on the ballot for the April election.

Appeal Rights:

Wisconsin Administrative Code Section EL 2.07 - Challenges to nomination papers provides that the local filing officer shall review any verified complaint concerning the sufficiency of nomination papers of a candidate for local office that is filed with the local filing officer under s. 8.07, Stats. The filing officer shall apply the standards in s. EL 2.05 to determine the sufficiency of nomination papers.

Wisconsin Administrative Code Section EL 2.07 (2) (b) provides that after the deadline for filing a response to a challenge, but not later than the date for certifying candidates to the ballot, the local filing officer shall decide the challenge with or without a hearing.

Wisconsin Statute Section 5.06 (3) provides: "[a] complaint under this section shall be filed promptly so as not to prejudice the rights of any other party. In no case may a complaint relating to nominations, qualifications of candidates or ballot preparation be filed later than 10 days after the complainant knew or should have known that a violation of law or abuse of discretion occurred or was proposed to occur.
