**SUBJECT:** Ballot Access for the 2022 Spring Election

This memorandum presents a summary of important and noteworthy information about candidates requesting ballot access for the 2022 Spring Election.

#### Summary

The nomination paper filing deadline for the 2022 Spring Election for the offices of Court of Appeals Judge in Districts II, III, and IV and Circuit Court Judge in various counties was 5:00 p.m., Tuesday, January 4, 2022. The circulation period for nomination papers began on December 1, 2021.

A total of 62 candidates for state offices registered for the Spring Election, 60 of whom filed nomination papers with the Wisconsin Elections Commission. There are two candidates for Court of Appeals Judge District II, one candidate each for District III and District IV, and 56 candidates for 46 circuit court judge positions in 24 counties.

The first set of nomination papers was filed on December 13, 2021, and five sets of papers were filed on deadline day.

Based upon the review by Commission staff, 11 offices are contested. The office of Kewaunee County Circuit Court is the only state office that will require a primary on February 15, 2022. Local municipalities and school districts may have primaries for local office or have referend questions on the ballot as well.

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#### Notifications of Noncandidacy

The Notification of Noncandidacy may be filed by an incumbent who is not seeking re-election to the office he or she currently holds. If an incumbent fails to timely file the Notification of Noncandidacy by the second Friday before the filing deadline and does not file ballot access documents by the filing deadline, the filing deadline is extended 72 hours for any other candidate for that office. The extension does not apply to the incumbent. Wis. Stat. §8.10(2)(a).

The second Friday before the January 4, 2022 filing deadline fell on December 24, 2021. As the WEC offices are required by Wis. Stat. §230.(35)(4) to be closed on December 24, the deadline was moved to the next business day, Monday, December 27, 2021 at 5 p.m.

Staff reached out to incumbent officeholders to ensure that those who did not plan to stand for re-election filed a Notification of Noncandidacy by the deadline so that the ballot certification and preparation process was not delayed. Eleven incumbent Circuit Court Judges timely filed Notifications of Noncandidacy (see Attachment A). All other incumbents submitted nomination papers. Therefore, no extension of the filing deadline was required.

#### Nomination Paper Review Process

Staff continues to use internal nomination paper review standards based on the requirements set forth in Wis. Stat. §§ 8.10 and 8.30 and Wis. Admin. Code Ch. EL 2 to determine if a candidate has filed a sufficient number of signatures to qualify for ballot access. Attached to this memorandum are the internal nomination paper review standards (Attachment C) and the relevant statutory provisions (Attachment D) used by staff when reviewing papers. Staff also relies on past decisions of the Commission and predecessor agencies when making recommendations to the Commission as to whether an error on a nomination paper is grounds for striking a signature or page of signatures. This body of precedent comes from Findings of Fact and Orders issued as a result of a challenge to nomination papers, or a compliance review complaint filed under Wis. Stat. § 5.06.

#### Number of Nomination Paper Signatures Required

- Candidates for Court of Appeals Judge must file a minimum of **1,000** valid signatures of qualified electors from the district to qualify for ballot access. Wis. Stat. § 8.10 (3)(am).
- Candidates for Circuit Court Judge in counties over 500,000 in population (Milwaukee County) must file a minimum of 1,000 valid signatures of qualified electors from the district to qualify for ballot access. Wis. Stat. § 8.10 (3)(c).
- Candidates for circuit court in counties with a population of 500,000 or less must file a minimum of 200 valid signatures of qualified electors from the district to qualify for ballot access. Wis. Stat. § 8.10 (3)(b).

Every nomination paper was reviewed separately by two staff members, and a determination regarding sufficiency was made within two business days of submission. All nomination paper submissions were found to contain a sufficient number of valid signatures. By the deadline for filing nomination papers on Tuesday, January 4, 2022 at 5:00 p.m., 20 candidates had also filed additional nomination papers to supplement their original filings.

#### Irregularities on Nomination Papers and Ballot Access Documents Not Affecting Ballot Status

The following irregularities were detected by staff during the nomination paper and ballot access document review process. Consistent with prior practice and decisions, staff believes these irregularities do not affect ballot access and did not strike signatures or reject filed documents due to these issues. Samples of these are located in Attachments E and F.

1. Printed names of signers on nomination papers appear to be written by the circulator.

Staff continues to find printed names of signers and address information that appear to be in the same handwriting as the circulator. Wis. Stat. § 8.10 (4)(b), requires the printed name and address information to be made by the signer of the petition, unless the signer requests assistance in signing or printing their name and address. Although staff encounters sporadic examples of this practice on many sets of papers, the most consistent examples over time involve circulators for candidates for Milwaukee County Circuit Court Judge, some of whom are judges themselves. This has been an ongoing and growing trend since 2015. However, the number of incidents has dropped significantly in recent elections. As in past elections cycles, staff did not strike such signatures. Had staff struck the signatures for this reason, each candidate would still have sufficient signatures.

2. Everett Mitchell, a candidate for Dane County Circuit Court Judge Branch 4, filed the necessary Declaration of Candidacy and sufficient nomination petition with the WEC, as well as a Campaign Registration Statement and a Statement of Economic Interest with the Wisconsin Ethics Commission. Upon review of his nomination petition and the Declaration of Candidacy, WEC staff identified a discrepancy regarding the mailing municipality Mitchell listed on his Declaration of Candidacy and how that information is provided on portions of his nomination petition.

Mitchell correctly included his residential street address in the Village of Windsor on both his Declaration of Candidacy and on his nomination petition. After staff had started the review of the filed nomination petition, staff noticed that some pages of the petition had a mailing address with the same street name and number as his residential address but a City of Sun Prairie mailing municipality. All petition pages correctly listed the Village of Windsor as his municipality for voting purposes. All petition pages also correctly listed his zip code. The candidate's address clearly places him within Dane County, which is the jurisdiction where he is seeking office.

After discussing the situation with Mitchell and reviewing publicly available USPS address verification information, staff determined that mail which would have been sent to the candidate using the street address with the Village of Windsor listed as his mailing municipality would have reached the candidate, and therefore would not have prevented someone from contacting this candidate. While statute requires the mailing address be present on nomination papers, staff believe the candidate substantially complied with this requirement as only the USPS mailing municipality had a slight variation on a portion of his petition, but the mailing street number and mailing street name were present on all pages.

#### Statements of Economic Interests

All candidates timely filed the Statement of Economic Interests with the Wisconsin Ethics Commission.



Wisconsin Elections Commission: Nomination Paper Review Guidelines

### **Process Overview**

- Use a red pen to mark up the petition during the review process.
- Circle any piece of information on the petition page that is missing or problematic.
- Make a red check to the right of the row to indicate a signature should not be counted.
- Make a red question mark (?) to note questionable signatures that have been counted or to note omitted information on signature line where that signature is still able to be counted.
- Write the number of signatures counted on the upper, right-hand corner of each sheet.

## Step 1: Review the Header

**Overview:** The header of each petition page must contain all the required candidate information. If any of the required information is missing, or incorrect, no signatures on that page can be counted.

Required information:

- 1. Name of candidate
- 2. Residential address of candidate
  - a. Street number and street name (P.O. box addresses are not acceptable)
  - b. Municipality for voting purposes
  - c. State
- 3. Type of election
- 4. Election date
- 5. Title of office sought
- 6. Branch, district or seat number of office sought (if applicable)
- 7. Name of district in which candidate seeks office

Other information:

- 1. Mailing address (only required if different than residential address or voting municipality)
- 2. Zip code (may be present but not required)

## Step 2: Review the Certification of Circulator

**Overview:** The Certification of Circulator section is completed after the signatures on that page have been collected. Each petition page must contain all the required circulator information, the circulator's signature and a certification date that is on or

after the latest date of a signer. If any of the required information is missing or incorrect, no signatures on that page may be counted. If missing circulator information can be determined from another section of the petition page, the signatures on that page should be counted. Most often this occurs when a circulator is also the candidate or has signed that page as an eligible elector.

**Residency of Circulator:** The circulator does not need to reside in the district represented by the candidate, nor do they need to be a resident of Wisconsin. All circulators must be otherwise eligible to register to vote in Wisconsin (18 years of age, U.S. citizen, not serving any portion of a sentence for a felony offense). They do not need to be registered to vote in Wisconsin or any other state to circulate nomination papers.

Required information:

- 1. Name of circulator Signatures on the page should be counted if the circulator printed their name on the line meant for their signature.
- 2. Address of circulator
  - a. Street number, street name and municipality If missing circulator address, including municipality, can be determined from another section of the petition page, the signatures on that page should be counted.
  - b. State and zip code are not required.
- Date (month/day/year) All signatures must be dated within the circulation period. No signatures should be counted on a page where any portion of the date is missing.
- 4. Signature of circulator Signatures on the page should be counted if the circulator signed on the line that should have the printed name.

## Step 3: Review the Body of the Petition

Required information:

- 1. Signature of elector
  - a. Signature does not need be legible.
  - b. Electors may sign with an "X" or other mark if that is their usual signature.
  - c. Signature does not need to be cursive.
- 2. Printed name of elector
  - a. A printed name must be present in addition to the signature of the elector.
  - b. If a possible printed name can be determined, the signature should be counted.

- c. If a printed name cannot be determined, the signature should be struck from the petition.
- 3. Residential Address
  - a. Street name and street number or rural route are required.
  - b. Rural address must also include box or fire number.
  - c. P.O. boxes are only allowed if they are listed in addition to the residential address information. Signatures where only a P.O. box has been provided should be counted if the municipality of residence is entirely in the district. Mark with a question mark.
  - d. Ditto marks are allowed if they follow a valid address and the signer is using those marks to indicate they also reside at that address.
  - e. If all or part of the required address information of a signer is missing but residency can be determined by information found in another section of that specific petition page, that signature should be counted. This generally occurs when the signer is also the candidate and/or the circulator and the missing information is in the header or the certification section. Indicate on the petition page where that information is located.
- 4. Municipality of Residence
  - a. Municipality listed must be within the district represented by the candidate.
  - b. Abbreviations are allowed (e.g. "FDL" for Fond Du Lac or "Milw" for Milwaukee).
  - c. Ditto marks are allowed if they follow a valid municipality and the signer is using those marks to indicate they also reside in the municipality.
  - d. The Town/Village/City check box does not need to be checked.
  - e. If the municipality of residence was provided in the Residential Address field, the signature should be counted.
  - f. If the municipality information of a signer is missing but residency can be determined by information found in another section of that specific petition page (most likely in the header or the Certification of Circulator), that signature should be counted. Indicate on the petition page where that information is located.
- 5. Date of Signing
  - a. A complete date includes the month/date/year.
  - b. Date must be within the circulation period.
  - c. Date must be on or before the date the page was certified by the circulator.

- d. Ditto marks are allowed if they follow a valid date and the signer is using those marks to indicate they also signed on the same date. If ditto marks are used for the date of the last signer, the signature can be counted if it follows a valid date.
- e. A missing date can be bracketed ([]) if valid and complete dates appear on the line above and the line below the signature line with the missing date.
- f. If the date of the first or last signer is incomplete, it cannot be bracketed, and that signature should not be counted.

## Step 4: Count the Signatures

- 1. Sort the petition by the number of valid signatures on each page before determining the final number of valid signatures.
- 2. Place the pages with 10 counted signatures on top, followed by the pages with 9, etc.
- 3. Use a tally sheet or calculator to determine the number of valid signatures on the petition.
- 4. Determine if the number of valid signatures is sufficient for the office sought. Use the appropriate Ballot Access Checklist to determine the signature threshold for the office sought:

a.	County Non-partisan Candidates	ELIS-3
b.	School District Candidates	ELIS-5
c.	Municipal Candidates	ELIS-7
d.	County Partisan Candidates	ELIS-16
e.	Multi-jurisdictional Judge Candidates	ELIS-18

#### 8.10 Nominations for spring election.

- (1) Candidates for office to be filled at the spring election shall be nominated by nomination papers, or by nomination papers and selection at the primary if a primary is held, except as provided for towns and villages under s. <u>8.05</u>. Unless designated in this section or s. <u>8.05</u>, the general provisions pertaining to nomination at the partian primary apply.
- (2)
- (a) Nomination papers for offices to be filled at the spring election may be circulated no sooner than December 1 preceding the election and may be filed no later than 5 p.m. on the first Tuesday in January preceding the election, or the next day if Tuesday is a holiday, except as authorized in this paragraph. If an incumbent fails to file nomination papers and a declaration of candidacy by the time prescribed in this paragraph, all candidates for the office held by the incumbent, other than the incumbent, may file nomination papers no later than 72 hours after the latest time prescribed in this paragraph. No extension of the time for filing nomination papers applies if the incumbent files written notification with the filing officer or agency with whom nomination papers are filed for the office which the incumbent holds, no later than 5 p.m. on the 2nd Friday preceding the latest time prescribed in this paragraph for filing nomination papers for that office within the time prescribed in this paragraph.
- (am) If, under par. (a), an incumbent holding local office files written notification that the incumbent is not a candidate for reelection to his or her office or fails to file a declaration of candidacy within the time prescribed in par. (a), the officer or body with whom the declaration of candidacy is required to be filed shall promptly provide public notice of that fact on the officer's or body's Internet site or, if the officer or body does not maintain an Internet site, by posting notices in at least 3 different locations within the jurisdiction that the officer or body serves.
- (b) Each nomination paper shall have substantially the following words printed at the top:

I, the undersigned, request that the name of (insert candidate's last name plus first name, nickname or initial, and middle name, former legal surname, nickname or middle initial or initials if desired, but no other abbreviations or titles), residing at (insert candidate's street address) be placed on the ballot at the (spring or special) election to be held on (date of election) as a candidate so that voters will have the opportunity to vote for (him or her) for the office of (name of office). I am eligible to vote in the (name of jurisdiction or district in which candidate seeks office). I have not signed the nomination paper of any other candidate for the same office at this election.

- (c) Each candidate shall include his or her mailing address on the candidate's nomination papers.
- (3) The certification of a qualified circulator under s. <u>8.15 (4) (a)</u> shall be appended to each nomination paper. The number of required signatures on nomination papers filed under this section is as follows:
- (a) For statewide offices, not less than 2,000 nor more than 4,000 electors.
- (am) For court of appeals judges, not less than 1,000 nor more than 2,000 electors.
- (b) For judicial offices not specified in pars. (a), (am), and (c), not less than 200 nor more than 400 electors.
- (c) For judicial offices in counties over 750,000 population, not less than 1,000 nor more than 2,000 electors.
- (cm) For county executives in counties over 750,000 population, not less than 2,000 nor more than 4,000 electors.
- (cs) For comptrollers in counties with a population of at least 750,000, not less than 500 nor more than 1,000 electors.
- (d) For county executives in counties between 100,000 and 750,000 population, not less than 500 nor more than 1,000 electors.
- (e) For county executives in counties under 100,000 population, not less than 200 nor more than 400 electors.
- (f) For supervisors in counties over 750,000 population, not less than 200 nor more than 400 electors.
- (g) For supervisors in counties between 100,000 and 750,000 population, not less than 100 nor more than 200 electors, except as provided in sub. (3m).

- (h) For supervisors in counties under 100,000 population, not less than 20 nor more than 100 electors.
- (hm) For members of the metropolitan sewerage commission in districts over 1,000,000 population, not less than 1,000 nor more than 2,000 electors, in districts over 200,000 but not over 1,000,000 population, not less than 200 nor more than 400 electors, and in districts not over 200,000 population, not less than 100 nor more than 200 electors.
- (i) For city offices in 1st class cities, not less than 1,500 nor more than 3,000 electors for city-wide offices, not less than 200 nor more than 400 electors for alderpersons elected from aldermanic districts and not less than 400 nor more than 800 electors for members of the board of school directors elected from election districts.
- (j) Except as provided in par. (jm), for city offices in 2nd and 3rd class cities, not less than 200 nor more than 400 electors for city-wide offices and not less than 20 nor more than 40 electors for alderpersons elected from aldermanic districts.
- (jm) For city offices in 2nd and 3rd class cities, not less than 100 nor more than 200 electors for alderpersons who are not elected from aldermanic districts.
- (k) For city offices in 4th class cities, not less than 50 nor more than 100 for city-wide offices and not less than 20 nor more than 40 electors for alderpersons elected from aldermanic districts.

#### (km)

- 1. Except as provided in subd. 2. and subject to sub. (3s), for school district officer in any school district that contains territory lying within a 2nd class city, not less than 100 nor more than 200 electors.
- 2. For a school district officer in any school district described in subd. <u>1.</u>, not less than 20 and not more than 100 signatures if the annual meeting or the school board of the school district adopts a resolution to reduce the number of required signatures and if, on the date that the annual meeting or school board acts under this subdivision, the territory of the school district lying within one or more 2nd class cities is less than or equal to 10 percent of the territory of the school district.
- (ks) For school district officer in any school district which does not contain territory lying within a 1st or 2nd class city, if nomination papers are required under s. <u>120.06 (6) (a)</u>, not less than 20 nor more than 100 electors.
- (L) For other offices, not less than 20 nor more than 100 electors.
- (3m) The county board of any county having a population of at least 100,000 but not more than 750,000 may provide by ordinance that the number of required signatures on nomination papers for the office of county supervisor in the county is not less than 50 nor more than 200 electors. A county that enacts such an ordinance may repeal the ordinance at a later date. Any ordinance changing the number of signatures under this subsection takes effect on November 15 following enactment of the ordinance.

#### (3s)

- (a) For a school district that does not contain any territory lying within a 2nd class city on April 18, 2018, the signature requirement for school district officer under sub. (3) (km) 1. first applies to a candidate for the office of school district officer filled in the 2nd spring election that follows the effective date of the event that causes the school district to have territory that lies within a 2nd class city.
- (b) For a school district that has, by resolution, reduced the number of signatures required on nomination papers as permitted under sub. (3) (km) 2., the signature requirement for school district officer under sub. (3) (km) 1. first applies to a candidate for the office of school district officer filed in the 2nd spring election that follows the date of the event that causes the territory of the school district lying within one or more 2nd class cities to be greater than 10 percent of the territory of the school district.

#### (4)

- (a) All signers on each nomination paper shall reside in the jurisdiction or district which the candidate named on the paper will represent, if elected.
- (b) Only one signature per person for the same office is valid. In addition to his or her signature, in order for the signature to be valid, each signer of a nomination paper shall legibly print his or her name in a space

provided next to his or her signature and shall list his or her municipality of residence for voting purposes, the street and number, if any, on which the signer resides, and the date of signing.

- (5) Nomination papers shall be accompanied by a declaration of candidacy under s. <u>8.21</u>. If a candidate has not filed a registration statement under s. <u>11.0202 (1) (a)</u> at the time he or she files nomination papers, the candidate shall file the statement with the papers. A candidate for state office or municipal judge shall also file a statement of economic interests with the ethics commission under s. <u>19.43 (4)</u> no later than 4:30 p.m. on the 3rd day following the last day for filing nomination papers under sub. (<u>2) (a)</u>, or no later than 4:30 p.m. on the next business day after the last day whenever that candidate is granted an extension of time for filing nomination papers under sub. (<u>2) (a)</u>.
- (6) Nomination papers shall be filed:
- (a) For state offices or seats on a metropolitan sewerage commission, if the commissioners are elected under s. <u>200.09 (11) (am)</u>, in the office of the elections commission.
- (b) For county offices, in the office of the county clerk or board of election commissioners.
- (**bm**) For municipal judge, if the judge is elected under s. <u>755.01 (4)</u>, in the office of the county clerk or board of election commissioners of the county having the largest portion of the population in the jurisdiction served by the judge.
- (c) For city offices and other offices voted for exclusively within the municipality, except the office of county supervisor, in the office of the municipal clerk or board of election commissioners.
- (d) For school district offices to be voted for within more than one municipality, with the person designated by the school board as the filing official for their school district.

- (b) It conclusively appears, either on the face of the nomination papers offered for filing, or by admission of the candidate or otherwise, that the candidate is ineligible to be nominated or elected.
- (c) The candidate, if elected, could not qualify for the office sought within the time allowed by law for qualification because of age, residence, or other impediment.
- (2) If no registration statement has been filed by or on behalf of a candidate for state or local office in accordance with s. <u>11.0202 (1) (a)</u> by the applicable deadline for filing nomination papers by such candidate, or the deadline for filing a declaration of candidacy for an office for which nomination papers are not filed, the name of the candidate may not appear on the ballot. This subsection may not be construed to exempt a candidate from applicable penalties if he or she files a registration statement later than the time prescribed in s. <u>11.0202 (1) (a)</u>.
- (2m) The official or agency with whom nomination papers and declarations of candidacy are required to be filed shall not place a candidate's name on the ballot if the candidate's name is ineligible for ballot placement under s. 5.05 (2m) (d) 2., 15.61 (3), or 19.49 (2) (c) 2.

- (3) The official or agency with whom declarations of candidacy are required to be filed may not place a candidate's name on the ballot if the official or agency is prohibited from doing so under s. <u>19.43 (4)</u> or an ordinance adopted under s. <u>19.59 (3) (b)</u>.
- (4) The official or agency with whom a declaration of candidacy is required to be filed may not place a candidate's name on the ballot if the candidate fails to file a declaration of candidacy within the time prescribed under s. <u>8.21</u>.

SUBJECT:	Updating the Fee Notice for Public Records

#### **Introduction**

As required by Wis. Stat. § 19.34(1), the Wisconsin Elections Commission displays and makes available a public records notice that includes a section on costs. This memo proposes an update to the costs section in order to allow the agency to charge a fee for the full actual, necessary, and direct costs that are permitted under Wis. Stat. § 19.35(3). The costs section as it is currently written limits certain fees to less than what is permitted by statute. This issue will likely become more pronounced each year due to inflation. This memo proposes an update that will allow for the recovery of all permissible costs under the public records statutes that will not require future updates due to inflation. This change would not, and cannot, affect the ability of the agency to waive some or all fees, as it frequently does.

#### **Discussion**

The costs section currently says:

The law permits WEC to impose fees for certain "actual, necessary and direct" costs associated with responding to public records requests. If no other copy fee is set by law, WEC may bill requestors \$0.15 for each photocopied page provided and \$0.07/page for content scanned and converted into electronic format. Reproduction costs will not be charged on a per-page basis if the WEC provides electronic copies of records that already existed in electronic format. WEC may charge for staff time and other actual costs to copy records from one electronic format to another electronic format and/or physical media. WEC may charge the actual cost for the physical media such as CD, DVD or thumb drive used to provide electronic records to requesters. The actual cost of postage, courier, or delivery services may be charged. The cost of locating responsive records may be charged if it is \$50.00 or more and will be calculated as hourly pay rate (including fringe benefits) of the lowest-paid employee capable of performing the task multiplied by actual time expended to locate records. The lowest hourly rate is \$21.11, and will not exceed \$30.00 per hour. Requests which exceed a total cost of \$5.00 may

require prepayment. Requesters appearing in person may be asked to make their own copies, or WEC may make copies for requesters at its discretion. The WEC will not charge for the cost of reviewing records for possible redaction or removal of confidential information. All requests will be processed as soon as practicable and without delay.

The sentence stating, "[t]he cost of locating responsive records may be charged if it is \$50.00 or more and will be calculated as hourly pay rate (including fringe benefits) of the lowest-paid employee capable of performing the task multiplied by actual time expended to locate records," could lead to confusion. The commitment to calculate charges using the full hourly rate of the lowest paid employee capable of performing the task is not based on Wis. Stat. § 19.35(3) but on the Wisconsin Department of Justice's Wisconsin Public Records Law Compliance Guide. The current 2019 Compliance Guide, on page 70, states: "Generally, the rate for an actual, necessary, and direct charge for staff time should be based on the pay rate of the lowest paid employee capable of performing the task." This is a reasonable and common-sense idea, and this memo does not propose to change it. However, as written in the WEC's current cost section, it is not clear if this commitment applies only to locating records, or to all circumstances in which an agency can charge for staff time. This memo proposes to clarify this paragraph to show that any WEC fee for the costs of the actual, necessary, and direct staff time required to complete any task for which a fee is allowed under Wis. Stat. § 19.35(3) would be calculated using the hourly pay rate (including fringe benefits) of the lowest paid employee capable of performing the task.

The main issue arises in the next sentence, which states that "[t]he lowest hourly rate is \$21.11, and will not exceed \$30.00 per hour." The presence of these static numbers within this notice could cause two issues. First, inflation will likely cause the hourly rate of the lowest paid WEC employee to rise and, given enough time, it is likely that the lowest paid employee would cost the WEC more than \$30.00 per hour to employ. Second, for some public records requests, the lowest paid employee capable of performing the task costs the agency more to employ than \$30.00 per hour. An example would be a request for technical documents that only certain employees would be able to locate for release. Due to these two issues, the WEC's current commitment to charge only between \$21.11 and \$30.00 per hour could prevent the agency from recovering the costs that it is permitted to recover under the public records law. These are costs that are ultimately born by taxpayers as they pay agency staff to search for records which may or may not be of interest to the general public. Given this fact, this memo proposes to remove this sentence from the costs section. Without this sentence, the agency would still be committing to only charging fees for the actual, necessary, and direct staff time costs at the rate of the lowest paid employee capable of performing the task, but it would no longer be committing to charging fees below the rate of the lowest paid employee capable of performing the task.

#### **Recommended Motion**

The Commission directs staff to update the public records notice to clarify that all staff time costs permitted to be recovered by the agency through fees under the public records law will be charged at the hourly rate, including fringe benefits, of the lowest paid employee capable of performing the task, to remove language stating that the cost charged will always be between \$21.11 and \$30.00 per hour of staff time, and to make other non-substantive changes as needed to produce a readable and informative paragraph on costs.

Dear Representative Brandtjen and members of the Assembly Committee on Campaigns and Elections,

Thank you for your recent inquiry regarding the origin, structure, and security of WisVote, the state's voter registration system and voter database. Wisconsin Elections Commission staff have provided answers, explanations and background for each of your questions submitted on December 22, 2021. Below, please find a specific response to each question. The text of your questions is also included with each response for easy reference. Your original request, along with this reply, has also been provided to the six-member Wisconsin Elections Commission.

While we are always happy to provide requested information to the Committee on a timely basis, some of the requests you make will need to be considered by the full Commission. The Chair of the Commission has added this discussion to the January 11, 2021, meeting. Further, in that some of your requests involve statutory issues regarding release of confidential voter information under Wis. Stat. §§ 6.36(1)(b)1.a., 6.47, and Wis. Admin. Code EL § 3.50(8), the Commission will need to consider the options available to fulfil your request. We explain in detail below the quandaries in those cases where they occur and what the options for further follow-up include.

We look forward to working with the Committee on these and any other questions about elections administration in Wisconsin.

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**Question 1: State Control of Data.** Please confirm that all of the voter identification data (Voter Identification Database) contained within, used or accessed by the Wisconsin statewide voter roll system administered by your agency (Statewide System) is hosted, stored or otherwise resides on a server or servers owned and operated by the Wisconsin Department of Administration (DOA). If the Voter Identification Database is hosted elsewhere, please provide the identity of the host and any and all written or oral agreements between WEC and such host.

**Answer 1:** All voter data is hosted, stored, or otherwise resides on servers and systems owned by the State of Wisconsin. The Wisconsin Elections Commission uses the same state-owned data center and services as other state agencies through the Department of Administration's Division of Enterprise Technology. There are no other entities to identify or with whom the WEC holds agreements for data or server hosting.

**Question 2: Database Specifications.** Please provide the type, specifications and version of the database software used to contain and manage the data in the Voter Identification Database (such as MySQL, Oracle, etc.) on said servers. Upon receipt of your response, we will expect the ability to: identify the software used to create the Voter Identification Database program, identify who wrote the database program, determine whether the database program was actually built by WEC staff as you declared publicly in the September 8, 2021 Senate hearing ("we actually built it ourselves here in the State of Wisconsin") or whether the database software containing over 7 million records of Wisconsin voter data is hosted or otherwise resides securely on DOA servers.

**Answer 2:** The State of Wisconsin voter registration program and database, containing all voter registration records and voter history, resides at the state data centers and is securely hosted on DOA servers. The current state-wide voter registration system, known as WisVote, is a system designed, developed, maintained, and secured by the State of Wisconsin. All program development, testing, and security is done by State of Wisconsin employees and employees hired through the state's required IT development services contract, currently with Knowledge Services. It is our understanding that the Committee Chair has made a separate public records request to the Department of Administration for WEC employee and service contract information which will verify this fact. State of Wisconsin agencies use the state IT services contract to hire and maintain IT developers to accomplish their IT needs. The WEC built the WisVote system, and DET hosts the system using the following specifications:

As it relates to the history of the "Database," development history is a matter of public record and is extensively detailed in public meeting minutes of the SEB, GAB, and WEC. Over the past 20 years Wisconsin's registration system evolved from nothing to the AESM, then to SVRS, and most recently WisVote. The current system, used by the WEC since the creation of the agency, was built by the State of Wisconsin and is not a vendor-based system. The WisVote system is maintained, tested, built, repaired, and secured using state employees and employees hired through the state's Knowledge Services mandatory contract.

#### Voter Database Timeline

#### Before the state-wide system

- 2002 The Federal Help America Vote Act mandates creation of state-wide voter registration systems and allocates funding for states to create them.
- 2003 The State Elections Board (SEB) begins planning for a state-wide voter registration system.
  - At the time, 13 of 72 counties had legacy voter registration databases most using Access, Excel, and Word. Some were DOS based and one (Fond du Lac) was Cobalt based.
  - 235 municipalities maintained local databases using 61 different types of software ranging from Microsoft Word to off-the-shelf products.
- **2004** SEB contracts with Accenture to create a state-wide voter registration system. Development starts.
- 2005 SEB hires Project and Limited-Term staff to support development of the state-wide voter registration system. SEB contracts with National Business Systems for data entry to import voter data.
  - State law did not require voter registration in municipalities with a population under 5,000 until 2005. Thus, many smaller jurisdictions did not maintain a database until state law changed and until some statewide functions were mandated under HAVA. Therefore, many voter registration records converted from county and municipal legacy systems into the state-wide system did not have a "registration date" associated with them. See our FAQ on this topic (https://elections.wi.gov/node/7516) for more details.

#### **AESM Pilot System**

• 2006 – SEB launches AESM (Accenture Election System Manager). This system was version 1.0 of the State-wide Voter Registration System (SVRS). System performance is evaluated as poor by the SEB and Wisconsin clerks.

• 2007 – SEB and Accenture terminate their contract. Accenture repays the State of Wisconsin \$4.0 million and releases all data to the State.

### <u>SVRS</u>

- 2008 GAB hires transitional IS professionals to redevelop and manage the state-wide system, SVRS. It consists of 59 servers in 3 environments.
- 2009 GAB hires LTE contract software developers to continue development of SVRS and transition SVRS to .NET Framework 3.5.
- 2010 GAB launches SVRS 7.0. It consists of 55 servers in 4 environments.
- 2011 GAB hires IS contractors to support SVRS under the direction of the DOA Bureau of Application Support Director and the GAB Elections Division Governance Team.
- 2012 GAB IT development team updates SVRS to comply with the Photo ID law and incorporate elements using Dynamics CRM platform elements.
- 2012-2013 GAB upgrades SQL server, Windows Server, and .NET framework versions.
- 2014 GAB begins developing an all-new state-wide system after positive feedback on the usability and stability of Dynamics CRM elements of SVRS. Dynamics CRM is a development platform which we used to create a custom, proprietary, user interface that interacts with the other components of WisVote. This is not a vendor-based system and no vendor has access to the system or the code base. If a change is made, a feature added, or a fix implemented to the system it is done by state employees or employees hired through Knowledge Services.
- 2015 GAB approves the purchase of Dynamics CRM platform licenses to complete development and fielding of the new system, called WisVote.

#### **WisVote**

- 2016 GAB launches WisVote. WisVote adds absentee ballot request and tracking tools, election worker training and tracking tools, and support for the MyVote Wisconsin and Badger Voters portals.
- 2017 WEC upgrades WisVote to support Online Voter Registration after state law is passed allowing voters that option and to also support the statutorily authorized Badger Book electronic poll book system.
- 2018 WEC upgrades WisVote with Election Day Registration postcard reporting and election reconciliation functions. SQL server and Windows Server versions are also updated. Multifactor authentication is added for all users – this is in addition to regular username and password credentialling. Mandatory device endpoint testing software and cyber security training is also required before clerks receive access.
- 2019 WEC upgrades the WisVote user interface to the Dynamics CRM 365 On Premise operating platform, which provides security updates and adds endpoint monitoring for all devices accessing WisVote using a separate software application.
- 2020 WEC upgrades WisVote with absentee ballot mail tracking for outgoing ballots.
- Development background:
  - the Wisconsin Elections Commission built WisVote, and it is a custom, in-house developed application that is not used by any other entity and is not available for use or sale by any other entity. It was built utilizing secure platforms and customized in-house to comply with Wisconsin election laws and meet the needs of system users.
  - All WisVote development was performed by:
    - full-time state employees
    - federally funded-project state employees
    - or individuals hired through the State of Wisconsin's IT services contract and supervised by state employees
  - No vendors were involved in the development or maintenance of WisVote.

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**Question 3: WisVote Structure.** Please identify the name and all technical specifications (including coding language, version and platform) of the application software used to code and run the Statewide System and whether any contractors were used to design, build or operate any portion or component of the software. It is our understanding that the Statewide System consists of a main application or platform, and coordinates WisVote, Badger Voters, and possibly other applications, which may not be public. Please identify ALL applications that have any connectivity to the Statewide System through any application programming interface (API) or other path of connectivity giving any and all parties real time access to any function of the Statewide System or the Voter Identification Database, including contractors, vendors, non-profit or political entities and any other parties.

**Answer 3:** The current state-wide voter registration database, WisVote, was built using the following specification:

- Platforms
  - o Dynamics CRM 365 On Premise (User Interface)
  - SQL Server 2019 Enterprise (Database)
  - o Windows Server
  - o Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7
  - ASP.NET (Badger Voters)
- Language
  - o C#
- WEC and DOA/DET employ individuals for software development under the mandatory state Knowledge Services contract, and previously under the Tapfin contract, who are under the direct supervision of state employees.
- Other State of Wisconsin systems with connectivity to WisVote (direct or indirect).
  - MyVote.wi.gov (Public access website, built and maintained by WEC, hosted by DOA)
  - Badger Voters (Data request system, built and maintained by WEC, hosted by DOA)
  - Badger Book (indirect, no live connection. System built and maintained by WEC, hosted by DOA)
  - Canvass Reporting System (indirect connection. Official election results collection from counties and unofficial report generation for counties).
  - o Access Elections (WEC database for ADA-compliance site review data)
  - Campaign Finance Information System (CFIS) (limited access to Ethics Commission for required statutory functions)
- External Services accessed by WisVote (one-way queries only)
  - WisDOT DMV Service
  - o ArcGIS
  - o Smarty Streets addressing service
  - o Google Maps
- Internal Only APIs
  - o Wisconsin DOT, statutorily required to support Online Voter Registration
  - o Above mentioned statutorily required indirect access to Ethics CFIS
  - o Elections Data Management
  - o Department of Corrections, statutorily required felon notices
  - o Address verification/validation USPS Service and ZP4 Service
- There are no APIs offering external contractors, vendors, non-profits, political entities, or other parties access to the system. Local election authorities do not have system development access and are therefore unable to offer APIs to any entity.

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**Question 4: Physical Location of Data.** Please reveal where the Statewide System is hosted. Is the Statewide System hosted at DOA with or separate from the Voter Identification Database or is it hosted elsewhere on another server system such as Amazon<sup>©</sup> Web Services (AWS) or hosted physically at WEC itself? If the Statewide System is hosted at any place or vendor other than DOA, please provide all written and oral agreements between WEC and said host. If the Statewide System is physically hosted at WEC, please disclose which room or office number it is located in and provide security logs of who has authorized physical access to that room or rooms.

**Answer 4:** All voter data is hosted, stored, or otherwise resides on servers and systems owned by the State of Wisconsin under the supervision and management of the Department of Administration's Division of Enterprise Technology. DOA/DET primarily uses two major data centers: Femrite Data Center (Madison, WI) and Milwaukee Data Center (Milwaukee, WI).

**Question 5: Procurements & Contracts.** Please provide a copy of any and all procurement agreements, requests for proposals, bid requests, bid invitations and all technology agreements, technology employment agreements and other agreements related to coding, designing, structuring, envisioning, updating, editing, writing or otherwise manipulating in any way, the Voter Identification Database or the Statewide System that WEC, or any of its predecessors, is or has been a party to over the past 20 years. This request requires you to produce copies of all procurement or other agreements entered into by WEC, or its predecessors, with any other parties under Wisconsin procurement procedures relying upon the technique known as "piggybacking" on other existing state procurement contracts.

**Answer 5:** Regarding current personnel records, all information related to the WEC's employment of IT development staff is now being processed as part of a public records request through the Department of Administration. It is our understanding that the Committee has also asked for and received documents regarding any IT procurements related to the current state-wide system. Those requests are currently being processed in coordination between the WEC, DOA, and DET.

Regarding historical records of previous systems under predecessor agencies, WEC is not in physical possession of these records, but if requested can work to analyze and process this request as a public records request including working with the state archives and DOA to locate responsive historical records. This request asks for records that span 20 years, three separate state agencies, and involve technical applications no longer in use by the State of Wisconsin. Commission approval is needed before expending the vast volume of hours and resources required to comply with a request of this nature. If the Committee is not seeking records related to systems that no longer exist and are no longer in use, it is our belief that the current public records request filed with the Department of Administration will yield all responsive records related to the current WisVote system and related applications.

**Question 6: All Logs & Registries.** Please provide all logs and registries (as commonly understood in database and application and internet usage), of ALL types, whether defined herein or not, including, but not limited to, registry logs, access logs, data change logs, login logs and all other logs recording all digital activities occurring within the Statewide System and the Voter Identification Database.

**Answer 6:** The state-wide system is housed through the Department of Administration's Division of Enterprise Technology, all related technical logging information must also be requested through DOA, who would determine if there are responsive records. WEC would cooperate with DOA regarding any such request.

**Question 7. All Audit History.** Please provide all logs, registries or records of any kind recording all changes to the status of every voter, active and inactive, contained in the 7 million record Voter Identification Database or the Statewide System. Such logs, registries and other records must specifically

show the time and date a voter is registered in the Voter Identification Database and Statewide System, who registered the person to vote and each and every status change of every voter when turned inactive, reactivated and or turned back inactive.

**Answer 7:** This request also needs to be elevated to the full Commission for review and consideration. Our reading of this request is that the Legislature seeks data to understand the status of every voter record in the statewide system (both active and inactive) and to understand how/who established or changed voter records and statuses throughout history. This kind of data can be accessed and is provided routinely to parties who request it through Badger Voters. State law and the Commission's administrative code requires the agency to charge for such custom data (Wis. Stat. § 6.36(6), Wis. Admin. Code EL § 3.50). There are no exceptions to this requirement for legislative committees under state law or administrative code.

The request as described would include hundreds of millions of data points and would require coordination and congruent technical applications between the state and the Legislature to facilitate a meaningful and secure transfer. Also, the Wisconsin State Statutes and Administrative Code provisions, including but not limited to Wis. Stat. §§ 6.36(1)(b)1.a., 6.47, Wis. Admin. Code EL § 3.50(8), prohibit the release of personally identifiable information. Both state and federal law protect information such as dates of birth, social security numbers, and driver license and ID card numbers contained in voter records. There are no exceptions to this requirement for legislative committees under state law or administrative code.

Upon approval from the Commission, WEC staff would work with the Committee to provide data that is useful, timely, and compliant under state statutes.

**Question 8: External APIs.** Please provide an exact copy of the API code or software that allowed any and all private, forprofit, non-governmental, non-profit, political party or any type of lobbying or advocacy group to directly access WisVote, MyVote or any other part of the Statewide System or the Voter Identification Database at any time during the years of 2020 and 2021. Please also provide logs, registries and any other records of the times and dates any or all of these parties accessed the Statewide System or the Voter Identification Database, or any other data system operated or controlled by the State of Wisconsin in 2020 and 2021.

**Answer 8:** There are no private, for-profit, non-governmental, non-profit, political party, or any type of lobbying of advocacy group with direct access to WisVote, MyVote or any database or application related to the statewide database. Only the official government entities and systems described in our answer to question 3 above have any sort of direct or indirect access to the statewide voter registration system or related applications.

**Question 9. ERIC Data.** Please provide a list of all voters referred by the Electronic Registration Information Center to WEC or to Wisconsin clerks in 2020 and 2021, including the specific communication, the name of each voter and their address, driver's license number, date of birth and the date referred to WEC or any Wisconsin Clerk.

**Answer 9:** ERIC does not make "referrals" to the WEC or clerks. ERIC provides data in various categories as outlined in the ERIC membership agreement. Production of ERIC data reports about voters is expressly prohibited by the ERIC Membership Agreement, paragraph 4. Wisconsin law requires the chief election official to enter into a membership agreement with ERIC. Wis. Stat. §6.36(1)(ae). To maintain its membership with ERIC, the WEC may not violate the terms of the agreement. Additionally, as described above, state law and administrative code provisions do not allow the release of a voter's personally identifiable information, with limited exceptions.

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There is some data that WEC can provide in compliance with the ERIC agreement and state statute. At this link (<u>https://elections.wi.gov/node/7461</u>) you can find the mailer design that was sent to voters who were flagged as having a different address in their voter record than DMV/USPS in 2021. In 2020 the Commission sent a mailer to voters who are not registered to vote but are eligible according to DMV records, which is also required by the ERIC membership agreement. The Commission will review and approve any changes to the mailers for 2022 at an upcoming meeting.
