  - Signed into law on 11/22/2019
  - Creates exemption for voters who cannot meet this requirement due to disability
  - Poll workers or assistor should announce the name and address on behalf of the voter

About You, Box 3: Voters must provide their date of birth. Voters should be encouraged to provide all four digits of their birthday, but if a voter writes in the last two digits, the application should not be denied.

A phone number and email address can be helpful in case the clerk needs to contact the voter, but they are not required information on the application and are subject to open records requests.

### Official Use Only section of the voter registration application

The election inspector must review the voter's proof of residence. If the POR is valid, the inspector must list the POR type, POR issuing entity and POR # on application. For example, a utility bill would be the POR type, Madison Gas and Electric would be the POR issuing entity and the POR # would be the utility account number.

It's important to note that not all types of POR have a unique number, but if they do, it should be recorded in the appropriate field. For numbers with 7 or more digits, list the last four digits; numbers with six or fewer digits, list the last two digits of the number.
