

Would you please repeat about a winner who declines and the next highest number vote getter doesn't automatically in?	If a winner declines the office and it's a vote for one contest, it creates a vacancy for that office.
in that case, the vacancy is filled according to municipality ordinance?	Yes.
Do we need to notify anyone else (state, county) of a local municipal write-in other than providing a list to our election inspectors	If you are a relier on your county for WisVote services, let them know if you have a registered write-in so they can add it to your tally sheet.
Just to be sure - Example Voter 4. If you see this as overvoted when you run an absentee ballot through the machine, do you remake this ballot - or - do you correct the count after the close of the election?	Remake the ballot and feed it through voting equipment.
Should poll workers review the ballots before closing the polls?	Yes! Election inspectors must look for any write-ins that may have been counted incorrectly or missed by the voting equipment.
I meant in order to remake and scan the ballot - before closing polls on the optical scan machine.	Yes, we agree.
Why wasn't Ida Thotso the voter's choice? The voter did not fill in the oval for their write-in.	The oval does not have to be filled for a write-in to be counted if eligible to be counted.
If I understand this correctly, if no one runs for clerk in my township and someone writes in a person's name, they would be offered the job, if they want it.	If there are no ballot candidates, all write-ins may be counted.
Where do we get the materials you talk about in webinars?	Yes, they are with the webinar access information in Recent Clerk Communications.

How do they (write-ins) deserve a vote when the person didn't follow the instructions?	It's what the law dictates.
How about if none of the ballot candidates are voted for but someone writes-in Donald Duck?	If it's a name you should count it.
Can the voter just view the registered write-in list or should you have copies available if they ask to take one to the voting booth?	You can do either. If a voter takes a list into a voting booth, be sure to retrieve it.

Why can't the registered write-in list be posted?	It's considered electioneering. They have not gone through the process as had a ballot candidate.
On Voter 4...since the voter wrote someone in, even if non-registered, there are still three votes. how do we determine voter intent?	It's a vote for 2 office and there are 2 ballot candidates. Only registered write-ins may be considered. Martin Sheen is not registered, so his vote is not counted. There are not enough write-in votes to fill the seats, so ballot candidates may be considered. The votes for Wanda and Bill are counted.
