Statement on Use of MyVote Wisconsin Website

MADISON, WI – Meagan Wolfe, interim administrator of the Wisconsin Elections Commission, today released a statement regarding candidates and political parties using the MyVote website:

MyVote Wisconsin is voters' best source of information about when and where to vote, what's on the ballot, absentee voting and voter registration. Other websites or groups offering similar information may not be as accurate.

For that reason, any candidate, political party or group is free to use the Wisconsin Elections Commission's MyVote Wisconsin website, <https://MyVote.wi.gov>, in its communications with voters to help them find accurate voting information.

Any use of the MyVote Wisconsin website, or linking to it, does not imply any endorsement by the Wisconsin Elections Commission. The Commission is an independent state agency, which does not endorse any candidate or political party. The nonpartisan staff of the Commission is prohibited from participating in political campaigns. The Commission and its staff are dedicated to providing accurate information to all voters.

The Wisconsin Elections Commission is responsible for administration and enforcement of election laws in Wisconsin. The Commission is made up of six Commissioners – four appointed directly by the State Senate Majority Leader, Speaker of the Assembly and the Minority Leaders in the State Senate and Assembly. The remaining two Commissioners are by the Governor with confirmation by the State Senate from lists of former municipal and county clerks submitted by the legislative leadership in each party.
