

Summary Biography of Meagan Wolfe

Meagan Wolfe was appointed as Interim Administrator of the Wisconsin Elections Commission on March 2, 2018. In that position, she serves as Wisconsin's chief election official and manages a staff which administers and enforces Wisconsin laws related to elections and voting. Meagan served the agency as Assistant Administrator since April 2017, managing the WisVote staff and IT team, and supervising the implementation of initiatives related to WisVote and other IT applications of the Commission. She has also headed the Commission's efforts on elections security planning. In addition, Meagan assisted with the overall management and leadership of the WEC staff.

Meagan joined state service as Voter Services Election Specialist in 2011. Initially, she developed and implemented voter outreach communications and resources, both on a public information scale and in assisting individual voters. Meagan conducted countless presentations about the Photo ID law and other voting and registration rules and processes, and developed many resources used by local election officials and organizations to educate voters. Later, she led the multi-year effort to assess the usability and accessibility of the MyVote Wisconsin website and to relaunch the website so that it is easier for voters to use and easier for clerks to assist military and overseas voters.

Prior to joining state service, Meagan worked as a project coordinator and an intellectual property assistant at Madison area law and engineering firms. She has a bachelor's degree in English and Legal Studies from the University of Wisconsin – Whitewater.
