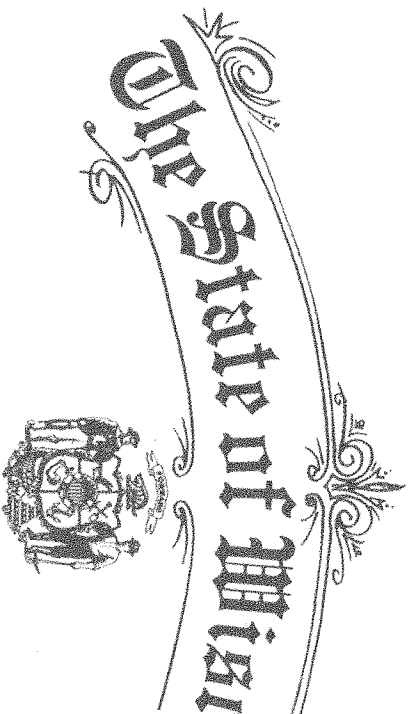

EXECUTIVE ORDER #90

Relating to a Special Election for the Ninety-Eighth Assembly District

WHEREAS, on November 6, 2012, the Honorable Paul Farrow was elected to the office of State Representative for the Ninety-Eighth Assembly District; and

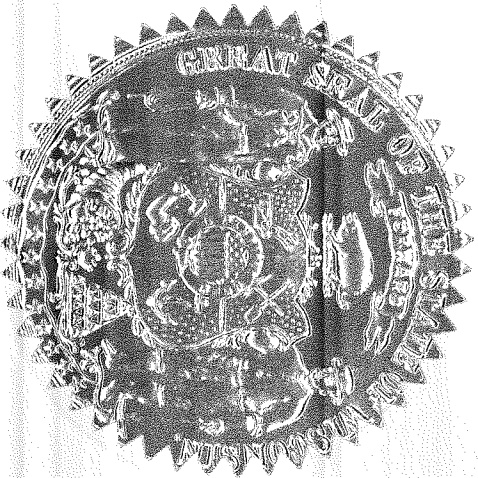
WHEREAS, on December 4, 2012, the Honorable Paul Farrow was elected to the office of State Senator for the Thirty-Third Senate District; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Paul Farrow submitted his declination of election to the office of State Representative for the Ninety-Eighth Assembly District, effective December 14, 2012.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Scott Walker, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to article IV, section 14 of the Wisconsin Constitution and section 8.50(4) of the Wisconsin Statutes, order that a special election be held on April 2, 2013, to fill the vacancy in the Ninety-Eighth Assembly District, as created in 2011 Act 43, and whose boundaries are set out in section 4.98 of the Wisconsin Statutes. A copy of the boundary descriptions may be obtained from the Government Accountability Board or the Legislative Reference Bureau. The term for the Ninety-Eighth Assembly District will expire on the first Monday in January, 2015. If a primary is necessary, it shall be held on February 19, 2013. Circulation of nomination papers for candidates may begin today, December 17, 2012, and nomination papers must be filed no later than 5:00 p.m., January 2, 2013, in the office of the Government Accountability Board, 212 East Washington Avenue, Third Floor, Madison, Wisconsin. This election shall be held, conducted, canvassed, and returned in accordance with law.
